Topographic maps

NOTE.—The Geological Survey is making a series of topographic maps that will eventually cover the whole United States, also Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico. The individual maps are projected to represent quadrangle areas rather than political divisions, and each map is designated by the name of some prominent town or natural feature in the area mapped. The scales most commonly used are 1:31,680, 1:62,500, and 1:125,000, corresponding approximately to $\frac{1}{2}$ mile, 1 mile, and 2 miles to 1 inch. The area covered differs with the latitude, but the average area of a quadrangle is 58 and 230 and 920 square miles, respectively, for these three scales. Topographic maps are printed on uniform-sized paper, about 20 by 16½ inches, and the maps of the quadrangle areas represented thereon are about 17½ inches long and 12 to 15 inches wide, according to latitude. For some areas of particular importance special large-scale maps are published. A general description of topographic maps and a list of the symbols used are printed on the reverse of each sheet.

About 47 percent of the continental area of the country, excluding Alaska, has been mapped, every State being represented. Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Hawaii, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, and West Virginia are completely mapped. A number of the topographic maps covering 15' quadrangle areas in New Jersey are out of print, the Survey not reprinting these as the stocks become exhausted but referring applicants to the Department of Conservation and Development, at Trenton, which publishes maps on a slightly different scale (1:63,360) representing approximately two and a half times the area of the Federal quadrangles. MARITIME COMMISSION

NOTE.—An agency to be known as the United States Maritime Commission was established under the provisions of H. R. 8555, 74th Congress (Public 835, approved June 29, 1936), to further the development and maintenance of an adequate and well-balanced American merchant marine, to promote the commerce of the United States, and to aid in the national defense. The same act dissolved the United States Shipping Board Merchant Fleet Corporation, directing that all records, etc., be taken over by the commission, and transferred all the functions, powers, and duties vested in the former United States Shipping Board (later the Shipping Board Bureau under the Commerce Department) to the United States Maritime Commission. It also transferred to and vested in the commission all the powers and duties now vested by law in the Postmaster General with respect to existing ocean-mail contracts.

TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

NOTE.—A list of post route maps, prepared primarily for the postal service but available to the public, is given below. New editions are published about once a year. Each of these maps shows all post offices within the State and indicates how each is supplied with mail. County boundaries are shown and each county is named, but only the principal drainage features are delineated. These maps show no highways and only such railroads as carry mail. The maps listed at 60 cents each are single-sheet maps; those priced at \$1.20 are 2-sheet maps.

Rural delivery routes are not indicated on the post route maps, but are shown in detail on county or local maps which, with a few exceptions, are drawn to the scale of 1:62,500 or 1:63,360 (1 mile to the inch). Maps of more than 1,530 counties in the United States have been prepared by the Post Office Department and blue-line prints, made from the latest available negatives, are sold for 50 cents per copy. Each county map shows, in addition to the roads traveled by rural carriers, all post offices within the county at the time the negative was made and all other roads, houses, schools, and churches known at the time the map was originally drawn, together with an outline of the drainage. A list of the county maps on file will be furnished upon application to the Disbursing Clerk, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. Rural delivery routes emanating from post offices in counties for which county maps have not been drawn are shown on local maps. Blueprint copies of such maps are sold at 25 cents each. The names of such of the more important administrative subjects as may seem appropriate, arranged in proper sequence, are numbered in a single series, and each name so numbered constitutes the title and number of a pamphlet containing certain administrative regulations pertaining thereto.
