Explanation

Words and figures enclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title pages of the publications cataloged. When place and printer are not given, it is to be understood that the publication is printed at the United States Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C.; if processed, publisher is issuing office. When size is not given octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is approximate, measurement being made from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays.

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Under provisions of the Printing Act of January 12, 1895, all Government publications are entered in the Monthly Catalog. However, press releases and administrative, regional, and confidential publications are omitted.

The L. C. card number appended to some of the entries is for those libraries ordering printed cards from the Library of Congress. The number at the extreme right of an entry indicates the classification of the publication in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents.

The Monthly catalog is sent to public libraries free on application. Subscription price to individuals, \$1.50 a year, including index; foreign subscription \$2.10 a year. Back numbers cannot be supplied. Notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change of address.

INDEX

An Index to the Monthly catalog will be issued at the end of the calendar year. This will contain index entries for all the numbers issued from January to December, and can be bound with the numbers as an index to the volume. Persons desiring to bind the catalog at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate copies cannot be supplied.

Bituminous Coal Consumers' Counsel

Under the provisions of Public law 34, 77th Congress, 1st session, approved April 11, 1941, there is established in the Executive branch of the Government, an office to be known as the Office of the Bituminous Coal Consumers' Counsel. The Counsel performs the functions formerly conferred and imposed upon the Consumers' Counsel of the National Bituminous Coal Commission.

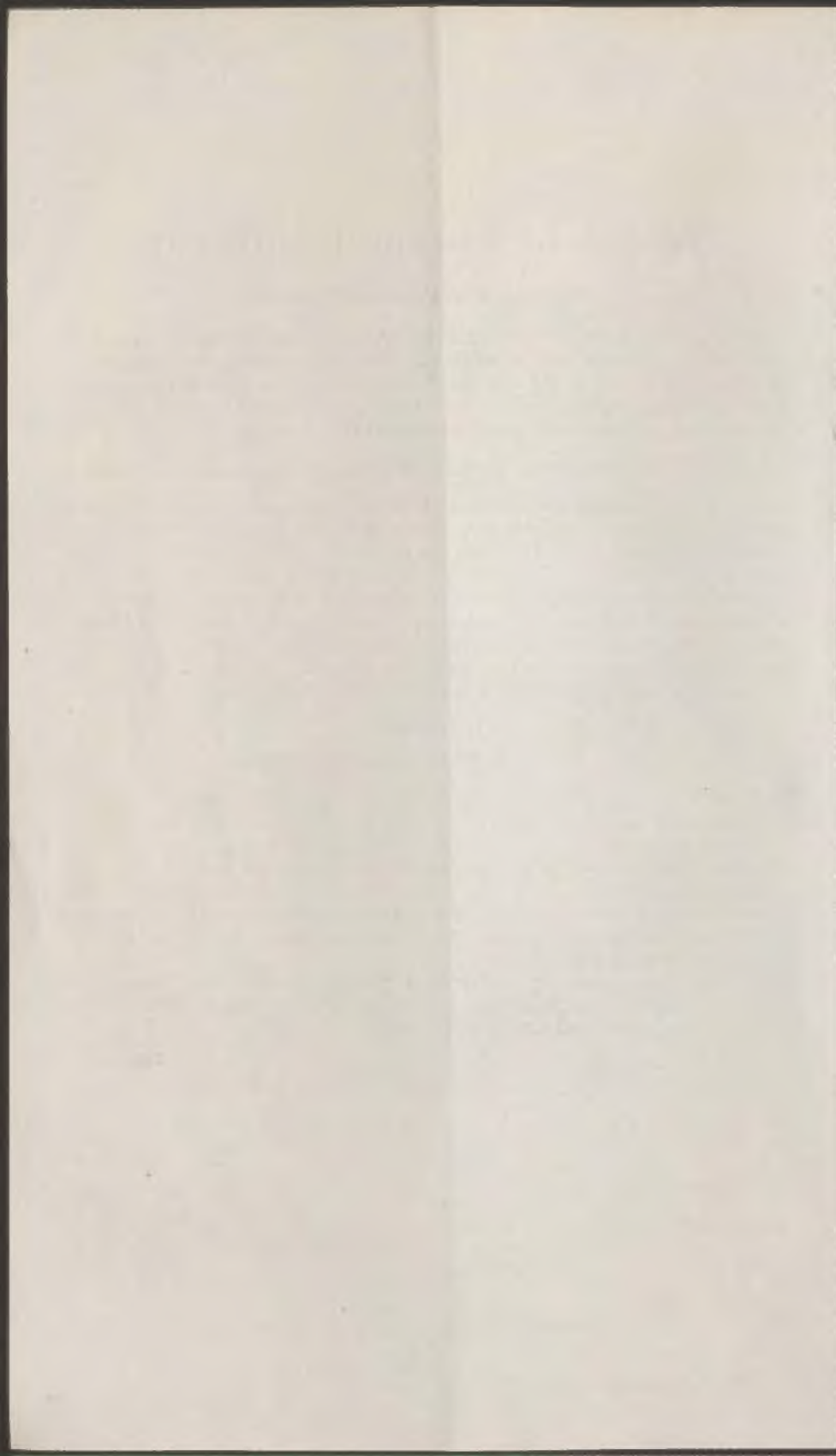
Interdepartmental Committee to Study Workmen's Compensation for Seamen

The Interdepartmental Committee to Study Workmen's Compensation for Seamen was formed in Sept. 1940, pursuant to Senate resolution 299, 76th Congress. This resolution provided that the Department of Commerce, the Department of Labor, the Maritime Commission, the Employees' Compensation Commission, and the Maritime Labor Board make a thorough study of workmen's compensation with a view to determining whether the same, by act of Congress should be made applicable to seamen, and make a report to Congress of their findings and recommendations, on or before Feb. 15, 1941. However the time was extended to July 1, 1941, by Senate resolution 72, 77th Congress.

Topographic quadrangle maps

NOTE.—The Geological Survey makes the contoured—i. e., the three-dimensional topographic maps of the country that are designed eventually to cover the whole United States, also Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico. The individual maps are projected to represent quadrangle areas rather than political divisions, and each map is designated by the name of some prominent town or natural feature in the area mapped. The scales most commonly used are 1:31,680, 1:62,500, and 1:125,000, corresponding approximately to ½ mile, 1 mile, and 2 miles to 1 inch. The area covered varies with the latitude, but the average area of a quadrangle is 58, 230, or 920 square miles, respectively, for these three scales. Topographic maps are printed on uniform-sized paper, about 20 by 16½ inches and the maps of the quadrangle areas represented thereon are about 17½ inches long and 12 to 15 inches wide, according to latitude. For some areas of particular importance special large-scale maps are published. A general description of topographic maps and a list of the symbols used are printed on the reverse of each sheet.

About half of the continental area of the country, excluding Alaska, has been mapped, every State being represented. Connecticut, Delaware, the District of Columbia, Hawaii, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, and West Virginia are completely mapped. TOPOGRAPHY DIVISION

NOTE.—The Division of Topography has on file maps showing all roads used by the rural free delivery mail service. Rural delivery routes are shown in detail on county or local maps which, with a few exceptions, are drawn to the scale of 1:62,500 or 1:63,360 (1 mile to the inch). Maps of more than 1,575 counties in the United States have been prepared by the Post Office Department and blue-line prints, made from negatives on file, are sold for 50 cents per copy. Each county map shows in addition to the roads traveled by rural carriers, all post offices within the county at the time the negative was made and all other roads, houses, schools, and churches known at the time the map was originally drawn, together with an outline of the drainage. A list of the county maps on file will be furnished upon application to the Disbursing Clerk, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. Rural delivery routes emanating from post offices in counties for which county maps have not been drawn are shown on local maps. Blueprint copies of such maps are sold at 25 cents each. Orders for all postal maps should be accompanied by money order and addressed to the Disbursing Clerk, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C. Rural delivery maps should not be confused with the State post route maps which are listed in the Monthly catalog for January 1941, page 85.

STATE DEPARTMENT
