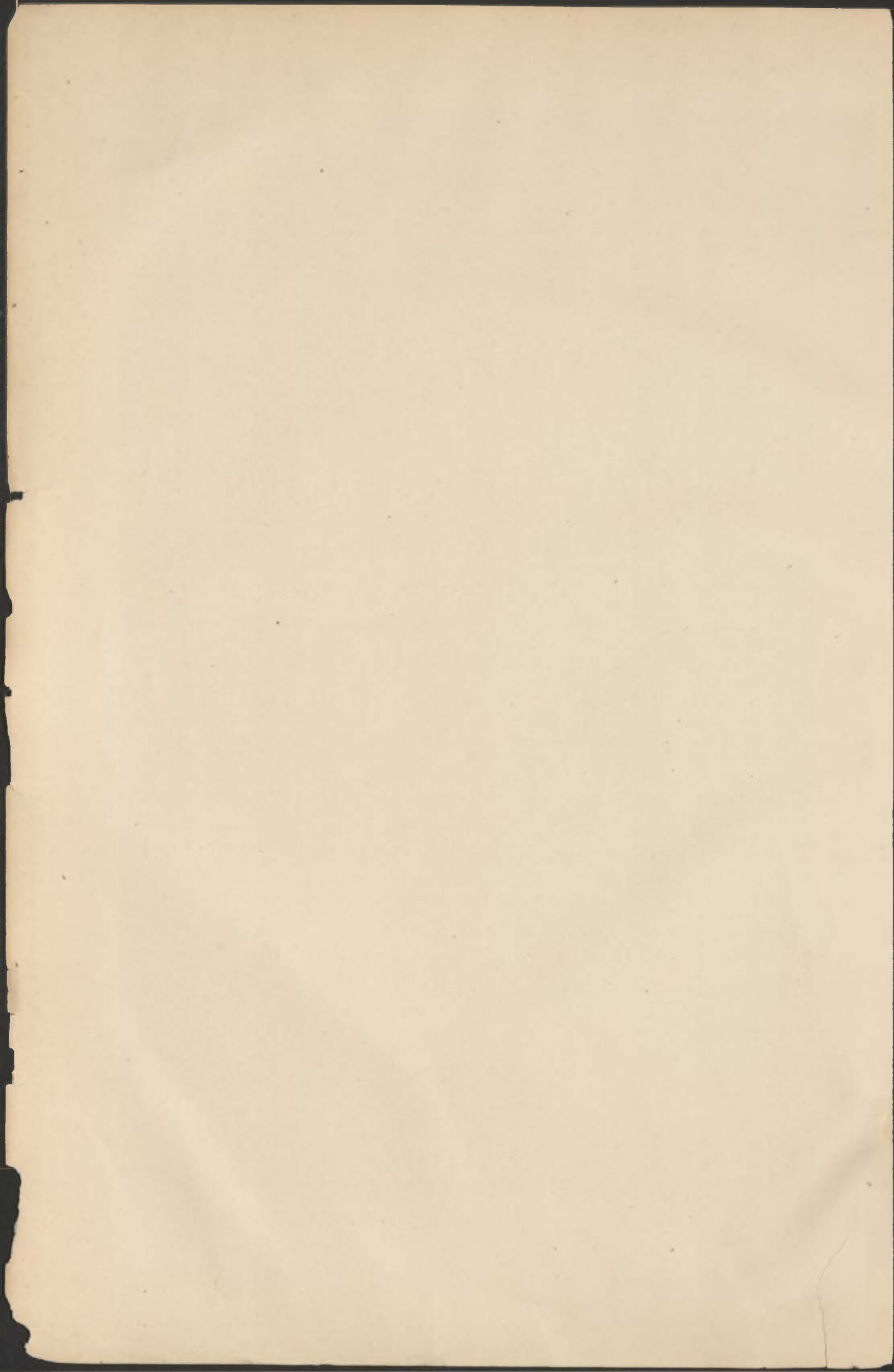

PREFACE

This, the third volume of the Document Catalogue, includes all documents and reports submitted to Congress during the second session of the Fifty-fourth Congress (December 7, 1896, to March 4, 1897), without regard to the time when they were printed; and in addition thereto, all publications of the Executive Departments, bureaus, and offices of the Government, issued during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1897.

A few entries of documents herein properly belong to preceding numbers of the Catalogue, but were omitted therefrom because of failure on the part of offices publishing the same to forward copies as required by section 62 of the printing act approved January 12, 1895, which reads as follows: "and the head of each of the Executive Departments, bureaus, and offices of the Government shall deliver to him (the Superintendent of Documents) a copy of each and every document issued or published by such Department, bureau, or office not confidential in its character." Such failures, however, are not numerous and, it is believed, have mostly resulted from lack of knowledge of the law, or losses in transmission of documents through the mail.

Under the heading "Congressional documents list" will be found statements relative to the Congressional reserve. In this list the number in brackets appended to each volume is its serial number, continuous with those given in the Public Documents Checklist. No serial numbers were assigned to the Senate and House Journals of the first and second sessions of the Fifty-fourth Congress and the first session of the Fifty-fifth Congress. These six journals may be designated as follows: Senate Journal, first session, Fifty-fourth Congress, 3346a; House Journal, first session, Fifty-fourth Congress, 3367a; Senate Journal, second session, Fifty-fourth Congress, 3466a; House Journal, second session, Fifty-fourth Congress, 3476a; Senate Journal, first session, Fifty-fifth Congress, 3557a; House Journal, first session, Fifty-fifth Congress, 3570a. Beginning with the second session of the Fifty-fifth Congress, serial numbers will be assigned to Senate and House Journals.

A brief and simple system of abbreviations for the several numbered series of bills and resolutions has been incorporated in entries for committee reports to accompany such bills and resolutions. These abbreviations are as follows: S. and H. for Senate and House bills; S. R. and H. R. for Senate and House simple resolutions; S. J. R. and H. J. R. for Senate and House joint resolutions; and S. C. R. and H. C. R. for Senate and House concurrent resolutions. It will be observed that the abbreviations in titles do not correspond exactly with those in the Document Catalogue of the Fifty-third Congress, in which H. R. (not H.) stood for House bill; H. Res. (not H. J. R.) for House joint resolution; and S. R. (not S. J. R.) for Senate joint resolution. The change was made for two reasons, viz: that the abbreviations might be more easily understood, and that uniformity might be established in their use in the Document Indexes and the Document Catalogues.

In the Document Catalogue of the first session of the Fifty-fourth Congress, entries for committee reports were made under the name of the committee and the subject or subjects of the report, with a cross reference to a subject from the Member submitting the report. This treatment has proved to be a great improvement over

that adopted for the first number of the Document Catalogue, and since it has been so satisfactory it has been continued in this volume, except in the case of reports on private bills. It has been found absolutely necessary to make this exception because reports on private bills constitute a large proportion of all committee reports, and to follow the rule consistently would very materially increase the size of the volume without adding to its value in any respect. Not less than thirty pages were added to the Document Catalogue for the first session of the Fifty-fourth Congress by giving in full entries for reports on private bills under both the name of the claimant and under the name of the committee from which the report emanated. In this volume, and hereafter, entries for reports on private bills will be found in full only under the names of the individual claimants, and to these names will be found cross-references from the Members making the report, and also from the committees from which the reports emanate. Private bills are construed by law to mean all bills for the relief of private parties, bills granting pensions, and bills removing political disabilities. (Act approved Jan. 12, 1895, Stat. L., v. 28, p. 609.)

Section 62 of the printing act approved January 12, 1895, provides that "The Superintendent of Documents shall, at the close of each regular session of Congress, prepare and publish a comprehensive index of public documents, beginning with the Fifty-third Congress, upon such plan as shall be approved by the Joint Committee on Printing." The first and second numbers of the Catalogue therein provided for were published without the approval of the Joint Committee on Printing as required. While the arrangement of the same was satisfactory to me, and had met the approval of expert cataloguers throughout the country, it seemed to me proper, before publishing the third number, to submit the matter to the Committee. This was done, and I am pleased to say that the style and arrangement adopted by my predecessor, Mr. Crandall, were formally approved. The third number, as well as those to follow, will therefore be uniform with numbers one and two, with such minor changes from time to time as may be deemed necessary.

Experience has demonstrated the disadvantage of publishing this Catalogue annually, or at the close of each regular session of Congress, as required by law, and it is hoped that the law will be amended in time to include in the fourth volume all the documents of the Fifty-fifth Congress and the Departmental publications not bearing a Congressional number for the two fiscal years ended June 30, 1899.

At the end of this volume, as in previous numbers, will be found, arranged in a single alphabet, a list of Government authors consisting of those Departments, bureaus, and offices of the United States Government which are represented by entries in this number of the Document Catalogue. In addition to this, the same material is arranged in another list by Executive Departments, independent offices, etc., with alphabetical lists of subordinate bureaus and offices under each. In this new arrangement will be found also alphabetical lists of the Senate and House committees that submitted reports during this session.

It has been customary in the Document Catalogues to include in the same catalogue entries for a certain volume and for all "separates" therefrom, no matter if the "separates" and the volume of which they form parts were published in periods that are covered by different catalogues. This treatment is adopted in order to avoid, when possible, entering the same matter in two catalogues.

For the benefit of readers who may not have at hand the Document Catalogue of the Fifty-fourth Congress, first session, the following statements are made relative to the style of expressing titles of documents or reports. When a document has a title-page or a distinctive heading, the wording of the catalogue entry follows exactly the order of words contained therein. Words are omitted without indicating the omission in any way; but if insertions are made or the order of words altered, such changes

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are indicated by brackets. Committee reports have no titles, and for these reports the catalogue entry follows a conventional wording incorporating the distinctive title of the bill or joint resolution on which the report is made. Simple and concurrent resolutions have no titles, therefore catalogue entries for reports on them are made up so as to give the subject-matter of the report. When a title is amended in committee, the amended title is chosen. A conventional wording is used for titles of pension reports and a few others.

The date used in entries for Congressional documents, if year, month, and day are specified, refers to the date when the document was ordered printed; but if the year only is specified, it refers to the time of publication. Unless otherwise indicated, annual reports are designated by fiscal years, which always end with June 30 of each calendar year. The date of the fiscal year covered by an annual report is followed by the date of publication, when the two dates are not the same; if they are the same, the date of publication is omitted. In citing an annual report the fiscal year covered by the report is used, and not the year of publication.

It is a pleasure, as well as my duty, to acknowledge the intelligent, faithful, and conscientious manner in which the work of compiling this volume of the Document Catalogue has been performed by the efficient corps of cataloguers under the direct supervision of Miss Mary A. Hartwell.

NOTE.—Bills and resolutions are not catalogued directly, except in the rare cases where a special edition is printed for general distribution. The committee reports on them embody in the catalogue entry the exact title of the bill, and serve as complete substitutes for cataloguing the bills themselves. The following directions refer to these report entries as equivalent to bill entries. Considering bills and resolutions in 4 classes, class 1 are the large number which are presented to Congress, but on which no committee report is made, and which do not become law. Class 2 are the very few on which no committee reports but which become law notwithstanding. Class 3 are those on which a committee reports but which fail to pass. Class 4 are those on which a committee reports and which become law thereafter. For class 1 consult the index of the Congressional Record. Classes 2, 3, and 4 can be found under the subject of the bill, classes 3 and 4 also under the committee making the report except in reports on private bills, and by reference under the Senator or Representative making the report. The catalogue entries for the committee reports on them embody the exact title of the bill, and serve as complete substitutes for cataloguing the bills themselves. The following directions refer to these report entries as equivalent to bill entries. Considering bills and resolutions in 4 classes, class 1 are the large number which are presented to Congress, but on which no committee report is made, and which do not become law. Class 2 are the very few on which no committee reports, but which become law notwithstanding. Class 3 are those on which a committee reports, but which fail to pass.
