Explanation

Words and figures inclosed in brackets [] are given for information, but do not appear on the title-pages of the publications catalogued. When size is not given, octavo is to be understood. Size of maps is measured from outer edge of border, excluding margin. The dates, including day, month, and year, given with Senate and House documents and reports, are the dates on which they were ordered to be printed. Usually the printing promptly follows the ordering, but various causes sometimes make delays. When Congress and session are not given with the numbers of Senate and House documents and reports, 61st Congress, 1st session, is to be understood.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Superintendent of Documents is authorized to **sell at cost** any public document in his charge, the distribution of which is not otherwise provided for. Only one copy can be sold to the same person, excepting Members of Congress, or to libraries or schools.

Documents can not be supplied by this Office free to individuals, **nor can they be forwarded in advance of payment.**

Documents entered in this catalogue that are for sale by the **Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.**, are indicated by a star (*) preceding the price named. A dagger (†) indicates that application should be made to the Department, Bureau, or Division issuing the document, a double dagger (§) indicates that the document is not obtainable, and whenever additional information concerning the method of procuring a document seems necessary it will be found under the name of the Bureau. The Senate and House documents and reports are issued in limited editions and, unless otherwise indicated, may be obtained only through Members of Congress.

Read carefully the instructions "How to remit," found at the bottom of the next page.

The accumulation of publications in this Office amounts to several millions, of which about 700,000 are assorted, forming the sales stock, and covering nearly every important Department, Bureau, and series. Many rare books are included, but under the law all must be sold "at cost," regardless of their age or scarcity. Of many of the most valuable works only one or two copies remain.

In ordering, it should be borne in mind that most of the books have been in stock some time and are apt to be shop-worn. In filling orders, however, the best copy available is sent.

Lists on various subjects will be issued from time to time for free distribution. No general price-list of public documents is at present available, but lists on special subjects will be furnished on application.

MONTHLY CATALOGUE DISTRIBUTION

The Monthly catalogue is sent to each Senator, Representative, Delegate, and officer in Congress, to designated depositories and State and Territorial libraries, to substantially all Government authors, and to as many school, college, and public libraries as the limited edition will supply.

Subscription price to individuals, \$1.10 a year, including indexes. Back numbers can not be supplied. Please notify the Superintendent of Documents of any change in address.

LIBRARY OF CONGRESS CARDS

Numbers to be used in ordering the L. C. catalogue cards will be found at the end of the titles of the more important monographic documents. The figure following the card number (separated from it by a slanting line) indicates the number of cards required for entries suggested (title entry not included) on the cards. The price of the cards is 2c. for the first card and $\frac{1}{2}$ c. for each additional card for the same title ordered at the same time. Remittances should be made to the Librarian of Congress. Cards can not be furnished by the Superintendent of Documents.

CUMULATIVE INDEX

Beginning with July, 1909, the Index to the Monthly catalogue is issued separately each quarter and cumulates for half-yearly periods. That is, the September number of the Index indexes the Monthly catalogue for July, August, and September, the December number will be an index to the Monthly catalogue for July to December, the March number will be an index to the Monthly catalogue for January to March, and the June number will be the Index for the fiscal year 1910. Persons desiring to bind the catalogue at the end of the year should be careful to retain the numbers received monthly, as duplicate numbers can not be supplied.

HOW TO REMIT

Remittances for the documents marked with a star (*) should be made to the **Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C.**, by postal money order, express order, or New York draft. Currency may be sent at owner's risk. Canadian postal notes will be accepted only when the name of the issuing office is plainly stamped on the face of the note. If postage stamps are pasted on, the note will be returned.

Postage stamps, foreign money, uncertified checks, defaced or slick coins will positively not be accepted.

No charge is made for postage on documents forwarded to points in the United States, Guam, Hawaii, Philippine Islands, Porto Rico, or to Canada, Cuba, or Mexico. To other countries the regular rate of postage is charged, and remittances must cover such postage.

NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

Circular 85 of the Experiment Stations Office, Agriculture Dept., takes up a most interesting subject, namely, Farmers' institutes for women. Farmers' institutes for men have been carried on for years by both Federal and State departments of agriculture, but it took a good while for the authorities to see the propriety of trying to do for women in the home what so long had been done for men in the field. Now, however, the work has been taken up earnestly and actively. Twenty-one States carried on such institutes during 1908 under State authority. As it is estimated that there are 13,000,000 women in the farming districts, the field for institute work in domestic science and household art is wide. Perhaps some reader may not know just what a farmers' institute is. It is simply another name for a free school. The expert teachers, employed usually by the State departments of agriculture, go about from one community to another, holding short terms of school, one, two, or three days and sometimes longer, delivering lectures, giving demonstrations of the latest improvements in farming methods, and answering all answerable questions that the assembled farmers may propound. They get around again to the same communities at least once every year, and sometimes twice or even oftener. Farmers' institutes are now organized in every State and nearly every Territory. Though their great value is recognized, expert writers on the subject hold that they are capable of much greater development and wider influence. The establishment of institutes for women seems to be a long step toward the complete development of the institute system.

Bulletin 60, Soils Bureau, Agriculture Dept., is entitled Preliminary report on the Volusia soils, their problems and management, and is a most important and interesting inquiry. The word Volusia is not a technical term for a variety of soil, but is the name of a small village in Chautauqua County, western New York, where the inquiry into the character and condition of the hill soils of deteriorated or abandoned farms began. Of these lands, once fertile but now almost nonproductive, the author of Bulletin 60, Mr. M. Earl Carr, estimates that there are more than 10,000,000 acres in New York, Pennsylvania, and Ohio, and he finds that the fault lies with the farmer rather than with the farms. Their redemption is considered feasible.

Among the publications of the month are several uncovered pamphlets, each containing a report or special article reprinted from the Annual report of the Office of Experiment Stations for

1908. Some of the titles are (abbreviated): Animal nutrition problems; Farmers' institutes, 1908; Alluvial lands of lower Mississippi Valley and their drainage. Many papers of similar interest are published in each issue of this valuable annual report.

Bulletin 84, Entomology Bureau, has a title which may have a taking sound for both apple-growers and apple-eaters, namely, Fumigation of apples for San Jose scale.

Circular 6, Publications Division, describes the publications of the Agriculture Department and tells how they are distributed.

From the United States Geological Survey comes a new price list of the topographic maps and folios and the geologic folios. The topographic sheets now number 1848.

The Naval medical bulletin, a quarterly magazine issued from the Medicine and Surgery Bureau, Navy Dept., of which the Surgeon-General, U. S. N., is chief, is growing in size as well as in interest. No. 4 of vol. 3 is the current number.

Two new editions of General Land Office circulars are entitled Unappropriated public lands of the United States and Desert land laws.

Index-catalogue of the library of the Surgeon-General's Office, 2d series, vol. 14, Prussian-Rzehak, is entered in this Catalogue, and copies are also on sale by the Superintendent of Documents at \$2.00 each.

Various reports by special agents and consular officers have been collected and printed in one pamphlet under the title The jute industry. The Manufactures Bureau, by which this compilation is published, is especially interested in giving it a wide circulation because of the fact that this country imports jute products from Scotland and other countries to three times the value of our own manufactures of this fiber.

Opinions of the assistant Attorneys-General for the Post-Office Department, volumes 3 and 4, covering the periods Mar. 18, 1892-Oct. 24, 1905, and Oct. 25, 1905-June 26, 1908, are now issued.

The new List of wireless telegraph stations of the world, corrected to Sept. 1, 1909, including shore stations, merchant vessels, revenue cutters, and vessels of the United States Navy, can be had only from the Superintendent of Documents, price 15c.

American nautical almanac, 1910, has been issued in a 2d edition and is now in plentiful supply in the stock of the Superintendent of Documents. Paper covers, price 30 cents.

Session laws, 61st Congress, 1st session (Statutes passed at 1st session of 61st Congress), is now issued in paper covers, and sold by the Superintendent of Documents at 50 cents a copy. It contains the new United States tariff, the Philippine tariff, the Census law, and so forth.

Tests of metals, 1908, is just issued and offered for sale by the Superintendent of Documents. Paper, \$1.00; cloth, \$1.25.

The New York Sun has this to say of a new public document: "Rich spoils of folklore have been gathered by Mr. John R. Swanton

from the Indians at Sitka and Wrangel. They are gathered in 'Tlingit Myths and Texts,' forming Bulletin 39 of the Bureau of American Ethnology (Government Printing Office, Washington). No less than 106 stories were taken down in English, many quite long, and of eighteen of these the Tlingit text is printed with a word for word translation. Besides these legends Mr. Swanton secured speeches at a tobacco feast, speeches at the erection of a pole for the dead, and graphophone records of 103 songs, the words of which are here printed. It is a book that all interested in Indian folklore will want."

EXPERIMENT STATION RECORD

The new plan of publishing the Record in semi-annual volumes, each volume containing two special or abstract numbers in addition to the regular monthly numbers, has resulted in a notation that may confuse subscribers and librarians if not explained. Two numbers dated September, 1909, have been issued, one numbered vol. 21, no. 3, the other vol. 21, no. 4. The latter has on its cover in brackets the words [Abstract number] and is entirely filled with abstracts of recent publications, American and foreign, relating to one or more agricultural and economic subjects, of which such a wide range is treated by the Record. No. 3 is the regular monthly number, and carries the editorial matter of the month, which for this number is limited to a single article. Frequently the editorials are more numerous and on occasion are supplemented by special articles by expert authorities. A similar abstract number may be expected in December, which presumably will be numbered 8. The abstract numbers are paged continuously with the regular numbers, so that when the covers are taken off and the volume bound no line of distinction between the numbers will be visible.

It has been decided to publish for each semi-annual volume a subject index and a name index, in one pamphlet. There will consequently be 9 pamphlet numbers in each volume, or 18 numbers in the year.

INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION REPORTS

Vol. 16 is now current and is being supplied by the Superintendent of Documents at \$1.50 in buckram and \$2.00 in full law sheep. It includes the decisions of April, May, and June, 1909, with index. The index is also issued separately in a pamphlet.

LAND OFFICE CIRCULARS

Some of the smaller publications of the General Land Office, known in that office as circulars, which are supplied free by the Land Office and its branches, are also supplied to the Superintendent of Documents for sale at the cost of printing to those who may find it more convenient and satisfactory to get these documents, as they do others, through this office. These small documents are usually sold at 5c. a copy.

MISSISSIPPI WATERWAY REPORT

H. doc. 50, 61st Congress, 1st session, is a Report by a special board of engineers on a survey of the Mississippi River from St. Louis, Mo., to its mouth with a view to obtaining a channel 14 feet deep. When finally published, the document, which has 532 pages of text, will also have a number of illustrations. These have not yet been received, and publication is delayed while awaiting them. In the meantime, however, to meet urgent demands for the report, the 600 copies composing the "up number" have been released and sent to the Capitol for distribution on the order of Senators and Representatives. These 600 copies are not intended as a distinct edition, but libraries into which they may come will necessarily so class them, as a book with illustrations and a book without them cannot be considered identical copies.

CONGRESSIONAL RECORD

Vol. 44 of the Record, containing verbatim reports of the tariff debates which made the 1st session of the 61st Congress so absorbingly interesting to the country, has now been issued in its permanent form. It fills six great quarto books, five of which are known as "parts," parts 1-5 containing the proceedings, the 6th book being an index volume. The several parts making up vol. 44 are for sale by the Superintendent of Documents at the following prices: Pt. 1, \$1.75; pt. 2, \$2.00; pt. 3, \$1.75; pt. 4, \$1.75; pt. 5, \$1.65; index, \$1.65.

JOURNAL OF THE UNITED STATES ARTILLERY

This bi-monthly magazine, issued for nearly 17 years past from the Artillery School Press (now the Coast Artillery School Press) at Fort Monroe, Va., has puzzled the Documents Office to establish its status as either a public document or a private publication. The Superintendent of Documents is required to enter in the official catalogues all public documents of the United States, and is not authorized to catalogue any others. Usually status as a document is determined by the answer to the question whether or not it is printed at Government cost and by authority of a qualified Government official. This magazine is printed at a Government press and published under the supervision of a Government board, these facts appearing in plain print on its title page, and this supervision having been directed by the War Department in General order 181, issued Oct. 20, 1906. These are characteristics of a public document. On the other hand, the acting editor gives assurance that "the Journal has always been considered a private publication," and each number has been copyrighted. The Act of Jan. 12, 1895, provides that public documents shall not be copyrighted. The Copyright Office has declined to pass an opinion upon the status of the Journal, saying that its function is merely to record claims to copyright, not to guarantee such claims or decide knotty points. All of this information still leaves it somewhat in doubt as to who is

to enforce the law which declares that public documents shall not be copyrighted, and also leaves the Superintendent of Documents in as much doubt as ever concerning the document status of the *Journal of the United States Artillery*. The entry for the *Journal* will however be omitted from the catalogues published by the Documents Office.

MONTHLY CATALOGUE INDEX

The first number of the separately printed, quarterly, cumulative index to the Monthly catalogue of United States public documents, bearing date September, 1909, was issued in October. This is the form of index unanimously approved and desired by the American Library Association, as determined at its meeting held in June, 1909. The chief merit of this form over the monthly form printed with the catalogues is that it permits of an earlier issue of the Monthly catalogues, and is also more economical, because requiring a smaller number of cumulations. That the Monthly catalogue is hardly usable without some kind of a cumulative index has been pretty positively determined by the experiments that have been tried in its various forms of publication.

CONSULAR REPORTS, ANNUAL SERIES

This series of pamphlets has been discontinued. It was not made up of independent publications, but of reports written for the annual volume of *Commercial relations*, 1907, and printed in advance to make the information earlier available. *Commercial relations*, 1907, being now complete (though not yet issued), no occasion exists for further issues of the *Consular reports, annual series*.

The Manufactures Bureau has planned to increase the value of the annual volume of *Commercial relations* by making its issue much earlier than hitherto. This plan has been carried out so successfully with the volume for 1908 that it is about ready to go to the printer, and will follow up the 1907 edition much more closely than these annual issues usually follow each other. Both 1907 and 1908 will be in two volumes.

SENATE PRECEDENTS

This important work, compiled by Henry H. Gilfry, chief clerk of the Senate, and issued under the title *Precedents, decisions on points of order, with phraseology, in the United States Senate from the First Congress to end of the Sixtieth Congress—1789-1909*, has had some vicissitudes in its document edition. It was first listed as S. doc. 537, 60th Congress, 1st session, being the last Senate document listed for that session, and estimated to make 50 pages. On that estimate it was scheduled to be bound in vol. 33, *Senate documents*, with 19 other small documents. The 19 were printed and received months ago, but 537 never came, and vol. 33 was withheld from the binders to await its coming. Finally, and very recently,

came along a substantial volume of 581 pages, bearing the title previously assigned to S. doc. 537. This started the Documents Office upon a more active inquiry for the missing no. 537, resulting in the information that there is no S. doc. 537, the compilation concerning the Senate precedents which was at first listed for publication under that number having been switched over to the 61st Congress, 1st session, and printed as S. doc. 129 of that session. The entry for this publication appears in the Monthly catalogue for August, 1909, page 78.

It appears that when, after unexpected delays, this large volume came to the proper place for listing as a Senate document, it was not remembered that it had already been assigned a number as a small pamphlet, and another number was given it.

As 537 would have been the last numbered Senate document for the 60th Congress, 1st session, and as under recent legislation the documents are numbered consecutively through a whole Congress instead of through each session, the first Senate document for the 60th Congress, 2d session, was numbered 538, and that and all the other documents of that session have been printed under a consecutive numbering beginning at that point. There is therefore a hiatus between the two sessions which it is not now possible to bridge. Librarians and others interested will therefore take notice that the series of Senate documents of the 60th Congress, 1st session, ends with no. 536, and that the series for the 2d session of the same Congress begins with no. 538, and that the 537 which should come between them does not exist.

COLONEL DODGE'S JOURNAL

In the 24th Congress, 1st session, Feb. 29, 1836, the Senate ordered the printing as a document, and also 500 additional copies, of Col. Henry Dodge's report of an expedition into the Indian country in 1835, in command of a squadron of dragoons about 120 in number, marching from Fort Leavenworth to the Rocky Mountains. The journal was printed as S. doc. 209, and is listed as bound in vol. 3, S. docs., 24th Cong., 1st sess., serial no. 281.

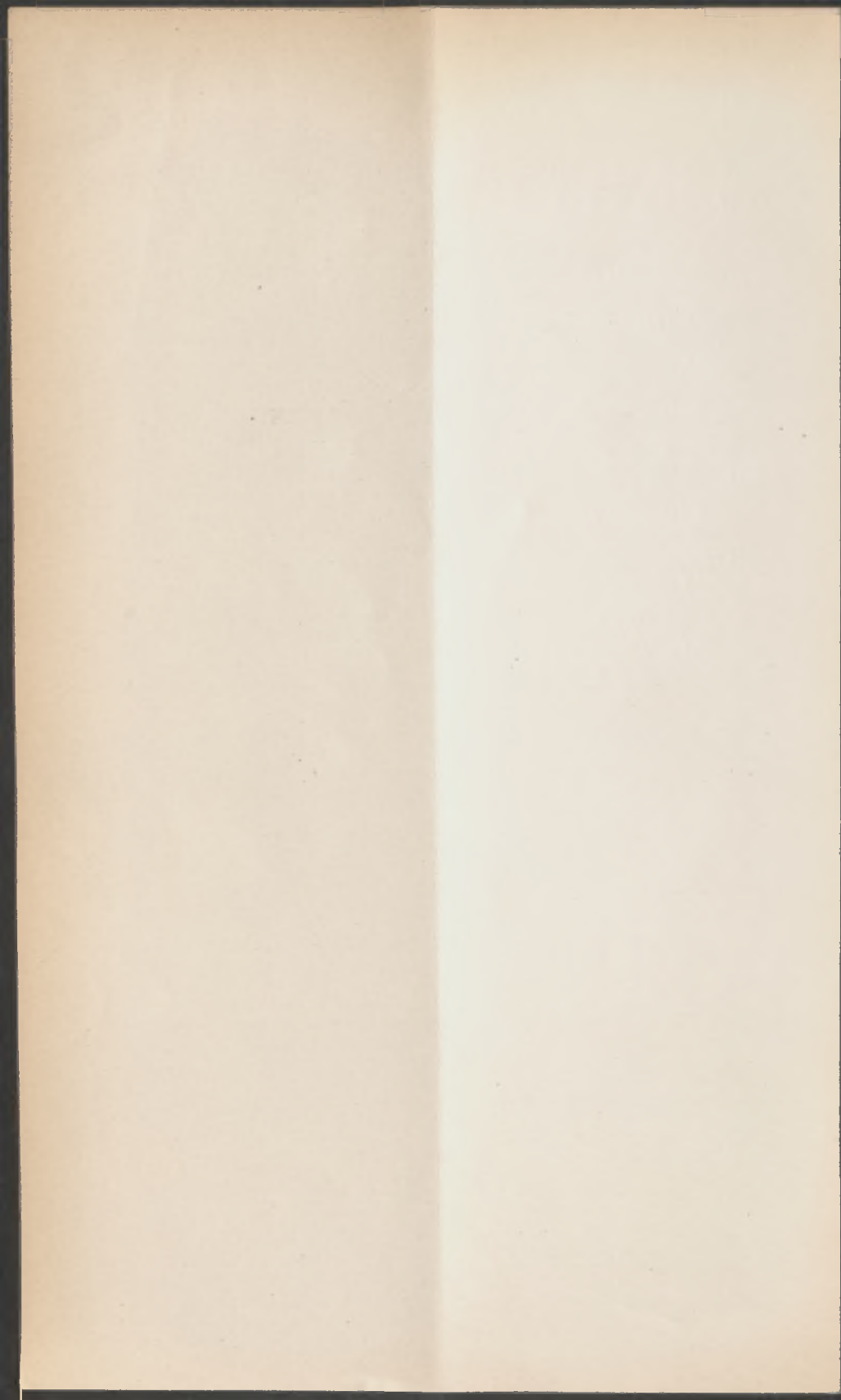
By some fatality doc. 209 has been omitted from several copies of vol. 3, and probably from most of them. It is not in the copy in the Public Documents Library in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents, nor in a duplicate copy in the same office. Two copies in the Library of Congress, two copies in the State Department Library, and one copy in the Justice Department Library are also without doc. 209. The only copy of vol. 3, S. docs., 24-1, containing this doc. that this office has certain information of is the one in the Boston Public Library. This copy of doc. 209 has 38 pages, the imprint of Gales & Seaton, and the following title: "Report of the Secretary of War, in compliance with a resolution of the Senate, transmitting a report of the expedition of the dragoons, under the command of Colonel Henry Dodge, to the Rocky Mountains, during the summer of 1835," etc.

The same report was printed in the same Congress as a House document (24-1, Ex. doc. 181, in vol. 4, serial 289), under the title Colonel Dodge's journal, 5000 additional copies having been ordered. It was printed by Blair & Rives, has one page less than S. doc. 209, and one map more, the map marked "B" being missing from the Boston Public Library's copy of S. doc. 209. The two reports are, however, essentially the same. Owing perhaps to the fact that the House printed 5000 additional copies, and the Senate but 500, doc. 181 is not reported as missing from any copies of serial 289.

If any library to which these lines come may chance to have a copy of S. doc. 209, 24-1, or of serial 281 containing doc. 209, which it can possibly part with, the Public Documents Library will be glad to accept the same and to reciprocate in any feasible and agreeable documentary way that may be proposed. The "sheep set" in the Public Documents Library is so nearly complete that it is worth the while not only of that library but of all libraries to assist it to entire completeness. It is to the interest of every library to have some one place where all the documents of the Congressional series may be found.
