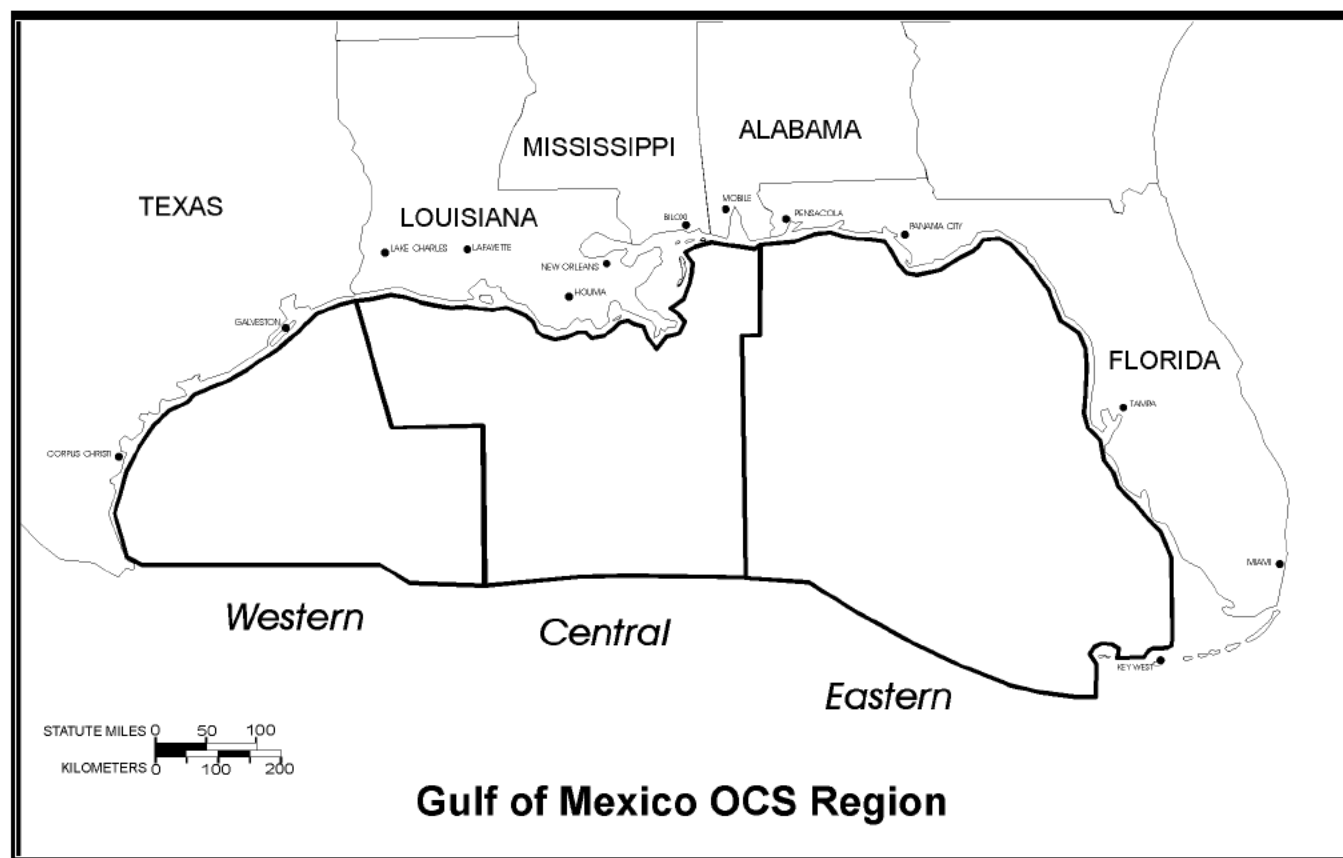

ABSTRACT

This database is constructed as part of "A Socioeconomic Baseline Study for the Gulf of Mexico (Phase I)." It contains over 3,000 variables that include information about population, employment, income, establishments, and government finance for counties (or parishes) in Alabama, Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas for the period 1930-90. The data assembled include extracts from machine readable datasets as well as data entered manually. Information on oil/gas dependency is also added based on an industry-occupation matrix specially obtained from the U.S. Bureau of the Census.

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1. OVERVIEW

1.1. The Purpose of the Database

Despite the long history of offshore oil and gas activities in the Gulf of Mexico (GOM) region, little information exists on the socioeconomic impact of offshore drilling in the GOM region in general, and its coastal areas in particular. The purpose of this database, therefore, is to provide a consolidated source of information for the five states in the GOM region (Alabama, Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas), which will enable the researchers to

1. identify counties/parishes whose employment structures were strongly affected by oil/natural gas extraction activities,
2. examine how this impact has changed over the period 1930-90,
3. analyze the socio-economic impact of oil/natural gas extraction for the period 1930-90.

This database has a number of unique features as well as potential pitfalls, because the information is extracted from various datasets collected under different survey designs. In the following, the characteristics of the database are briefly described. More detailed descriptions and explanations will be provided in Sections 3 and 4.

1.2. Universe Description

The universe varies depending on the data sources. For example, the universe of demographic information obtained from the decennial censuses is either the entire population or every housing unit. The universe of data on government finance and employment is all governmental units including states, counties, municipalities, townships, special districts and school districts. The universe of the establishment data is all establishments.

The accuracy of data depends on the size of sample, the method of sampling as well as the method of data collection, such as field interview or mail canvass. For example, the data on government finance and employment and on establishment are based on comprehensive surveys. Therefore, they are not subject to sampling errors. However, the government censuses are generally based on mail canvass, which gives rise to reporting errors.

The demographic data, in comparison, may be based on either the 100% count or a sample of a relevant universe. The demographic data based on a sample are subject to sampling errors, the magnitude of which depends on the size and method of selecting a sample, which varies from one census year to the next.

More information on the definition of sample and survey design of each survey from which data are extracted is provided later (Section 3). Regarding the accuracy of the data, please consult the reference materials mentioned below (Section 2.7.)

1.3. Organization of the Database

1.3.1. Subject Matter

The data in this dataset are classified and organized in terms of the following modules: demography (except vital statistics), vital statistics, civilian employment, establishments, income and poverty status, and government finance and employment. For more detail on each module, refer to the Variable Names and Type (Section 1.3.2), Guide to Subject Category (Section 3.) and Data Dictionary (Section 4.)

The demographic data include information on age, sex, marital status, race, educational attainment, place of birth, and migration experience. Many of these data are cross-tabulated by race and sex. The data on vital statistics (live birth, deaths, marriage, and divorce) are collected separately to supplement the demographic data. The data on civilian employment include information on labor force status, class of worker, industry and occupation. These data are also cross-tabulated by race and sex whenever data are available. The employment information on mining for 1940-70, oil/natural gas for 1980-90, and the location quotient for employment in the mining industry for 1940-90 are also added to facilitate the analysis on oil dependency.

The data on government revenue include the sources of revenue (inter-governmental and own sources). Expenditure data are collected in terms of major functions such as education, highways, and public welfare that comprise the direct general expenditure. The data on debt and assets are added whenever available. The government employment data include "full-time employment equivalent" workers by major function. The data on establishment include the number, size and employment for manufacturing, retail, wholesale, service establishments and farms. Lastly, the income data include personal and family (household) income as well as poverty status.

1.3.2. Variable Names and Types

In general, variable names are defined in terms of subject prefixes, followed by two digit numbers showing the reference year, and the sequential number of the variable in a particular reference year. The subject prefixes used in this dataset are,

The variable names for vital statistics and establishment statistics are organized differently. For vital statistics, the variable names consist of a prefix showing the subject category (digit 1-2), table number (digit 3-5), and reference year (last two digits).

E.g. VS00148 Vital statistics table 1 (live birth) for 1948
 VS00150 Vital statistics table 1 (live birth) for 1950

For establishment statistics, the variable names consist of subject category (digit 1-2), table number (digit 3-4), and reference year (remaining digits).

ES0182 Establishment statistics, table 1 (the number of manufacturing establishments) for 1982.

ES0187 Establishment statistics, table 1 (the number of manufacturing establishments) for 1987.

The most original datasets on the CD-ROM are the SAS/Windows and SAS/transport files (lpdc sas.ssd and lpdc sas.exp). All other files are derived from these two files including the ASCII dataset.

1.4. Geographic Coverage

All data in this dataset are presented by county (or parish in Louisiana) in the five GOM states. The values of most variables are simply the sum of single sampling units, such as person, household, establishment, etc. For government finance and employment data, however, they are the summation of all financial (or employment) data of all local governments (such as county government, school, fire, police districts) within the geographic boundary of respective county area (or parish).

All counties and states are assigned a unique geographic identification code based on the Federal Information Processing System (FIPS) (See Appendix B).

1.5. Reference Periods

The exact reference periods covered vary from subject to subject. While every effort was made to collect data for the period between 1930 and 1990, the data for earlier periods are either not available or only partially available. For example, while demographic and employment data are generally available from decennial censuses conducted every 10 years, government finance and employment data include only those from the 1957, 1962, 1972, 1977, 1982, and 1987 Census of Government. Data on vital statistics, establishments and personal income are available for some other years.

1.6. Data Suppression

1.6.1. 1970 Census

Variables taken from the 1970 Census may include suppression flags. According to the 1970 Census User's Guide, there are two types of suppression represented by -1 and -2, respectively. For type one (-1) suppression, both total and breakdown of the relevant table are suppressed, represented by a blank (or a single dot in SAS dataset).

E.g. Aggregate income of population 14 Years old and over by sex:

Minus one above indicates the presence of suppression that applies to total population as well as males and females.

With type two (-2) suppression, the suppression code will appear in the first item, a total count of the universe is supposed to appear in the second item, and all further items will be blank (or represented by a single dot in SAS dataset).

E.g. Counts of persons by age:

However, the inspection of the original data tape (Summary Tape File 4C) from which the 1970 data were extracted revealed that the total frequency in the second item is also not suppressed. For that reason, the present dataset cannot distinguish between type 1 and type 2 suppression.

Unlike the 1980 and 1990 Censuses, there is no explanation in the 1970 Census documentation as to the criteria for the decision to apply one of these types of suppression to a given table, strata, or cell. Thus, with the suppression information available, all we know for the 1970 Census is that more than zero frequency exists, presumably a small one, though the exact quantity cannot be determined. It is recommended that negative values for 1970 Census variables be replaced with zero.

The investigation by another researcher suggests that there was very little suppression at the county (parish) level other than on the ethnicity variable. For more details, see the documentation to the "Census of Population and Housing, 1970 United States: Extract Data" by Terry K. Adams (ICPSR 9694).¹

1.6.2. 1980 Census

The data suppression is represented by zero. Thus, unlike the 1970 Census, it cannot be determined if zero is due to suppression or due to zero frequency. The data tables that include breakdowns such as frequency by sex, race and age groups are often subject to suppression.

The following variables are never suppressed: total persons (D80001), total white persons (D80011), total black persons (D80012) and total hispanic origin persons (D80013). Totals for white, black, hispanic persons are provided separately (D80016, D8019, D80022, D80025), which are derived by summing the components categories given by age and sex. These totals are subject to suppression that applies to component categories. The comparison of two kinds of totals (totals with and without suppression) will reveal the presence and extent of suppression in this census year.

1.6.3. 1990 Census

The suppression is more undetectable in the 1990 Census. Since there are no flags as in the 1970 Census or discrepancies as in the 1980 Census between the totals of some variables given as a separate

variable and the corresponding totals derived by summing the component categories such as age breakdowns, there is no way to know the presence of suppression. Consequently, only one set of totals are given for this census year.

In general, the 1990 Census underwent a confidentiality edit in the following manner. First, a small subset of individual households was selected and the data items on these households were blanked. Responses to those data items were then imputed using the same imputation procedures that were used for nonresponse. A large subset of households is selected for the confidentiality edit for small areas to provide greater protection for these areas (for more information, see the 1990 Census Appendix C "Accuracy of the Data").

The following variables taken from Co-Stata 4 and USA Counties 1994 include character strings for numeric variables that indicate missing values for various reasons:

The meaning of the missing value codes are:

NA(N)	Not available
D	Suppressed to avoid disclosure of confidential information
X	Not applicable
S	Suppressed; does not meet publication standards
Z	Value greater than zero but less than half unit of measure shown.

1.6.4. Missing Values and Software

In general, all missing values in the ASCII dataset are replaced with blanks. However, partly because the data are extracted from various data sources with different coding schemes for representing missing values, some numeric fields may contain character strings as described above.

SAS and SPSS, when encountering such data, convert them into the system-missing value and exclude them from subsequent statistical computation unless told otherwise explicitly. However, whereas SAS converts all such data into the system-missing values, SPSS by default issues up to 80 warnings and stops processing further. For SPSS to continue to read all data (because there are more than 80 such cases), include the following statement at the top of the data definition program:

This statement is not necessary when reading the SPSS export file or system file.

However, if one wants to retain missing value codes rather than automatically convert them into the system-missing value, one must define the variable as character rather than as numeric. This is done in the following manners:

The dollar (\$) sign in SAS and (A) in SPSS indicate that the variable is a character variable, rather than numeric variable.

In the Loutus 123 version of this dataset, every missing value is replaced with blank cells.

2. GUIDE TO MAJOR SUBJECT CATEGORIES

The following chart illustrates the variables included in the dataset together with their availability by year. The purpose of this chart is to give users a quick overview regarding the range of information available from this dataset. It differs from the "real" dataset (see Data Dictionary in detail) in the following ways:

1. Many variables, although not shown explicitly in this chart, may be available by race and sex.
2. Some variables are available for more detailed categories than presented in the chart. For example, the educational attainment variables for 1940 are available for grades 1-4, grades 5-6 and grades 7-8 separately. However, to make it more comparable with other years which do not have any breakdown (for instance, the 1990 Census), and to make viewing easier, the availability information is presented just in terms of grades 1-8 combined.

It is important to recognize that data availability across several periods does not guarantee comparability because of possible changes in the definition of variables. Detailed information on the definition of variables is provided in Section 4.

3. DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATION OF SELECTED TERMS

Terms presented in this section are primarily compiled from the latest censuses, supplemented by earlier censuses and surveys listed in Section 2.7. Each section below consists of two parts: the description of data sources wherever appropriate and a brief definition/explanation of selected terms relevant to this dataset.

3.1. Census Geography

3.1.1. Government Units and Types of Governments

3.1.1.1. Government Units

A government is an organized entity whose governmental character is evidenced by popular election of the officials or their appointment by public officials, a high degree of public accountability, and the power to raise revenue to provide authorized services. In addition, a governmental unit must have sufficient discretion in the management of its own affairs to distinguish it from the administrative structure of any other governmental unit.

3.1.1.2. Local Governments

The Census Bureau classifies local governments by five major types as described below: county (or parish in Louisiana), municipality which includes cities, towns and villages, township, school system and special district.

3.1.1.3. County Area

Geographic areas corresponding to the boundaries of county or county-type areas. The "county area" statistics are derived from the aggregation of all local governments (county, municipal, township, school district, and special district) in these county or county-type geographic areas.

3.1.2. Urban, Rural, Extended City, and Urbanized Area

3.1.2.1. Urban and Rural

The Census Bureau defines "urban" for the 1990 Census as comprising all territory, population, and housing units in urbanized areas and in places of 2,500 or more persons outside urbanized areas. More specifically, "urban" consists of territory, persons, and housing units in:

1. Places of 2,500 or more persons incorporated as cities, villages, boroughs (except in Alaska and New York), and towns (except in the six New England States, New York, and Wisconsin), but excluding the rural portions of "extended cities (see below)."
2. Census designated places of 2,500 or more persons.
3. Other territory, incorporated or unincorporated, included in urbanized areas.

Territory, population, and housing units not classified as urban constitute "rural." In this dataset (which is based on the sample data), rural population and housing units are subdivided into "rural farm" and "rural nonfarm." "Rural farm" comprises all rural households and housing units on farms (places from which \$1,000 or more of agricultural products were sold in 1989); "rural nonfarm" comprises the remaining rural.

The urban and rural classification cuts across the other hierarchies; for example, there is generally both urban and rural territory within both metropolitan and nonmetropolitan areas.

In censuses prior to 1950, "urban" comprised all territory, persons, and housing units in incorporated places of 2,500 or more persons, and in areas (usually minor civil divisions) classified as urban under special rules relating to population size and density. This definition of urban excluded many large, densely settled areas merely because they were not incorporated. Prior to the 1950 Census, the Census Bureau attempted to avoid some of the more obvious omissions by classifying selected areas as "urban under special rules." Even with these rules, however, many large, closely built-up areas were excluded from the urban category.

To improve its measure of urban territory, population, and housing units, the Census Bureau adopted the concept of urbanized area and delineated boundaries for unincorporated places (now, census designated places) for the 1950 Census. Urban was defined as territory, persons, and housing units in urbanized areas and, outside urbanized areas, in all places, incorporated or unincorporated, that had 2,500 or more persons. With minor changes, the 1950 census definition of urban has continued essentially unchanged.

The data for the 1960 urban and rural-farm population were taken from the City and County Data Book. Unlike other years, the figures were provided in percentage with one decimal place. To maintain consistency with other census years, the urban-rural population were derived by multiplying the total population by these percentages. Consequently, the urban-rural population for this year in this dataset, albeit with small margin of errors, may not agree with the published statistics.

Documentation of the urbanized area and extended city criteria is available from the Chief, Geography Division, U.S. Bureau of the Census, Washington, DC 20233.

3.1.2.2. Extended City

Since the 1960 Census, there has been a trend in some States toward the extension of city boundaries to include territory that is essentially rural in character. The classification of all the population and living quarters of such places as urban would include in the urban designation territory, persons, and housing units whose environment is primarily rural. For the 1970, 1980, and 1990 censuses, the Census Bureau identified as rural such territory and its population and housing units for each extended city whose closely settled area was located in an urbanized area. For the 1990 Census, this classification also has been applied to certain places outside urbanized areas.

3.1.2.3. Urbanized Areas (UA)

The Census Bureau delineates urbanized areas (UA's) to provide a better separation of urban and rural territory, population, and housing in the vicinity of large places. A UA comprises one or more places ("central place") and the adjacent densely settled surrounding territory ("urban fringe") that together have a minimum of 50,000 persons. The urban fringe generally consists of contiguous territory having a density of at least 1,000 persons per square mile. The urban fringe also includes outlying territory of such density if it was connected to the core of the contiguous area by road and is within 1 1/2 road miles of that core, or within 5 road miles of the core but separated by water or other undevelopable territory. Other territory with a population density of fewer than 1,000 people per square mile is included in the urban fringe if it eliminates an enclave or closes an indentation in the boundary of the urbanized area.

The population density is determined by (1) outside of a place, one or more contiguous census blocks with a population density of at least 1,000 persons per square mile or (2) inclusion of a place containing census blocks that have at least 50 percent of the population of the place and a density of at least 1,000 persons per square mile. The complete criteria are available from the Chief, Geography Division, U.S. Bureau of the Census, Washington, DC 20233.

3.2. Population Characteristics

3.2.1. Data Sources

3.2.1.1. Decennial Censuses

Most population (and employment) statistics for the period 1930-1990 are based on results from Censuses of Population and Housing conducted by the Bureau of the Census as of April 1 in each of those

years. Data from the decennial censuses are based on tabulations of 100-percent, or complete, counts (i.e., information obtained for all persons and housing units) and sample estimates (i.e., additional information asked of a sample of persons). The sampling rates and sampling methods are different in each census year. Consequently, the accuracy of data varies from table to table depending on the sampling rates and sampling methods. For more detail on accuracy, please refer to the technical note in Census publications in each census year.

3.2.1.2. Vital Statistics

The registration of births, deaths, fetal deaths, and other vital events in the United States is primarily a state and local function. The civil laws of every state provide for a continuous and permanent birth- and death-registration system. Through the National Vital Statistics System, the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) collects and publishes data on births and deaths for the country as a whole. The Division of Vital Statistics at NCHS obtains information on births and deaths from the registration offices of all States, New York City, and the District of Columbia.

In the United States today, practically all births and deaths are registered. The most recent test of the completeness of birth registration, conducted on a sample of births from 1964 to 1968, showed that 99.3 percent of all births in the United States during that period were registered.

State requirements for reporting fetal deaths vary. Most states require reporting of fetal deaths of gestations of 20 weeks or more. There is substantial evidence that not all fetal deaths for which reporting is required are indeed reported.

Since most data items on demography including vital statistics, employment, and establishments in this dataset come from the Census of Population and Housing, the terminologies related to them will be described together below. In general, the definitions adapted in the 1990 Census will be described first, followed by a comparison with those of earlier censuses.

3.2.2. Selected Terms

3.2.2.1. Age

The data on age for the 1990 Census are based on the age of the person in complete years as of April 1, 1990. However, when the age response was unacceptable or unavailable, a person's age was derived from an acceptable year-of-birth response.

Age data have been collected in every census. In each census since 1940, the age of a person was assigned when it was not reported. In censuses before 1940, with the exception of 1880, persons of unknown age were shown as a separate category. Since 1960, assignment of unknown age has been performed by a general procedure described as "imputation." The specific procedures for imputing age have been different in each census.

Median age. This measure divides the age distribution into two equal parts: one-half of the cases falling below the median value and one-half above that value. Generally, median age is computed on the basis of more detailed age intervals than are shown in this dataset; thus, a median based on a less detailed distribution (generally 5-year interval in this dataset) may differ slightly from a corresponding median for the same population based on a more detailed distribution.

3.2.2.2. Birth

Birth represents the number of births during the year. The data are by place of residence and excludes events occurring to nonresidents of the United States. Birth rates represent the number of births per

1,000 resident population enumerated as of April 1 for decennial census years and estimated as of July 1 for other years.

3.2.2.3. Citizenship

The data on citizenship for the 1990 Census were asked of a sample of persons. Citizens are persons who indicated that they were native-born, or foreign-born persons who indicated that they have become naturalized. (For more information on native and foreign born, see the discussion under "Place of Birth.") There are four categories of citizenship: (1) born in the United States, (2) born in Puerto Rico, Guam, the Virgin Islands of the United States, or the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, (3) born abroad of American parents, and (4) citizen by naturalization.

Similar questions on citizenship were asked in the censuses of 1820, 1830, 1870, 1890 through 1950, 1970, and 1980. The 1980 question was asked of a sample of the foreign-born population. In 1990, both native and foreign-born persons who received the long-form questionnaire were asked to respond to the citizenship question.

3.2.2.4. Death

Death represents the number of deaths during the year. The data are by place of residence and exclude events occurring to nonresidents of the United States. Death rates represent the number of deaths per 1,000 resident population enumerated as of April 1 for decennial census years and estimated as of July 1 for other years.

Figures for infant deaths include deaths of children under 1 year of age; they exclude fetal deaths. The infant death rate represents the number of infant deaths per 1,000 live births.

3.2.2.5. Divorce (See Marital Status, Section 3.2.3.4; Marriage and Divorce, Section 3.2.3.5)

3.2.2.6. Educational Attainment

Data on educational attainment for the 1990 Census were asked of a sample of persons. Data are tabulated as attainment for persons 15 years old and over. Persons are classified according to the highest level of school completed or the highest degree received. The question included instructions to report the level of the previous grade attended or the highest degree received for persons currently enrolled in school. The question included response categories which allowed persons to report completing the 12th grade without receiving a high school diploma, and which instructed respondents to report as "high school graduate(s)"-persons who received either a high school diploma or the equivalent, for example, passed the Test of General Educational Development (G.E.D.), and did not attend college. (On the Military Census Report questionnaire, the lowest response category was "Less than 9th grade.")

From 1840 to 1930, the Census measured educational attainment by means of a basic literacy question. In 1940, a single question was asked on highest grade of school completed. In the Censuses of 1950 through 1980, a two-part question was used to construct highest grade or year of school completed: (1) highest grade of school attended, and (2) whether that grade was completed. For persons who have not attended college, the response categories in the 1990 educational attainment question should produce data which are comparable to data on highest grade completed from earlier censuses.

The response categories for persons who have attended college were modified from earlier censuses because there was some ambiguity in interpreting responses in terms of the number of years of college completed. For instance, it was not clear whether "completed the fourth year of college," "completed the senior year of college," and "college graduate" were synonymous. Research conducted shortly before the census suggests that these terms were more distinct in 1990 than in earlier decades, and this change may have

threatened the ability to estimate the number of "College graduates" from the number of persons reported as having completed the fourth or a higher year of college. It was even more difficult to make inferences about post-baccalaureate degrees and "Associate" degrees from highest year of college completed. Thus, comparisons of post-secondary educational attainment in this and earlier censuses should be made with great caution.

In the 1960 and subsequent censuses, persons for whom educational attainment was not reported were assigned the same attainment level as similar persons whose residence was in the same or a nearby area. In the 1940 and 1950 censuses, persons for whom educational attainment was not reported were not allocated.

In prior censuses, "Median school years completed" was used as a summary measure of educational attainment. In 1990, the median can only be calculated for groups of which less than half the members have attended college. "Percent high school graduate or higher" and "Percent bachelors degree or higher" are summary measures which can be calculated from the present data and offer measures of differences between population subgroups that are quite readily interpretable. To make comparisons over time, "Percent high school graduate or higher" can be calculated and "Percent bachelor's degree or higher" can be approximated with data from previous censuses.

3.2.2.7. Hispanic Origin

Information about Spanish/Hispanic origin for the 1990 Census was asked of all persons. Persons of Hispanic origin are those who classified themselves in one of the specific Hispanic- origin categories listed on the questionnaire-"Mexican," "Puerto Rican," or "Cuban"-as well as those who indicated that they were of "other Spanish/Hispanic" origin. Persons of "Other Spanish/Hispanic" origin are those whose origins are from Spain, the Spanish-speaking countries of Central or South America, or the Dominican Republic, or they are persons of Hispanic origin identifying themselves generally as Spanish, Spanish-American, Hispanic, Hispano, Latino, and so on. Write-in responses to the "other Spanish/Hispanic" category were coded only for sample data.

Origin can be viewed as the ancestry, nationality group, lineage, or country of birth of the person or the person's parents or ancestors before their arrival in the United States. Persons of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

Some tabulations are shown by the Hispanic origin of the householder. In all cases where households, families, or occupied housing units are classified by Hispanic origin, the Hispanic origin of the householder is used. (See the discussion of householder under "Household Type and Relationship.")

During direct interviews conducted by enumerators, if a person could not provide a single origin response, he or she was asked to select, based on self-identification, the group which best described his or her origin or descent. If a person could not provide a single group, the origin of the person's mother was used. If a single group could not be provided for the person's mother, the first origin reported by the person was used.

If any household member failed to respond to the Spanish/Hispanic origin question, a response was assigned by the computer according to the reported entries of other household members by using specific rules of precedence of household relationship. In the processing of sample questionnaires, responses to other questions on the questionnaire, such as ancestry and place of birth, were used to assign an origin before any reference was made to the origin reported by other household members. If an origin was not entered for any household member, an origin was assigned from another household according to the race of the householder.

There may be differences between the total Hispanic origin population based on 100-percent tabulations and sample tabulations. Such differences are the result of sampling variability, nonsampling error, and more extensive edit procedures for the Spanish/ Hispanic origin item on the sample questionnaires.

The 1990 data on Hispanic origin are generally comparable with those for the 1980 census. However, there are some differences in the format of the Hispanic origin question between the two censuses.

For 1990, the word "descent" was deleted from the 1980 wording. In addition, the term "Mexican-Amer." used in 1980 was shortened further to "Mexican-Am. " to reduce misreporting (of "American") in this category detected in the 1980 Census. Finally, the 1990 question allowed those who reported as "other Spanish/ Hispanic" to write in their specific Hispanic origin group.

Misreporting in the "Mexican-Amer." category of the 1980 Census item on Spanish/Hispanic origin may affect the comparability of 1980 and 1990 Census data for persons of Hispanic origin for certain areas of the country. An evaluation of the 1980 Census item on Spanish/ Hispanic origin indicated that there was misreporting in the Mexican origin category by White and Black persons in certain areas. That study results showed evidence that the misreporting occurred in the South (excluding Texas), the Northeast (excluding the New York City area), and a few States in the Midwest Region. Also, results based on available data suggest that the impact of possible misreporting of Mexican origin in the 1980 Census was severe in those portions of the above-mentioned regions where the Hispanic origin population was generally sparse. However, national 1980 Census data on the Mexican origin population or total Hispanic origin population at the national level were not seriously affected by the reporting problem. (For a more detailed discussion of the evaluation of the 1980 Census Spanish/Hispanic origin item, see the 1980 Census Supplementary Reports.)

The 1990 and 1980 Census data on the Hispanic population are not directly comparable with 1970 Spanish origin data because of a number of factors: (1) overall improvements in the 1980 and 1990 censuses, (2) better coverage of the population, (3) improved question designs, and (4) an effective public relations campaign by the Census Bureau with the assistance of national and community ethnic groups.

Specific changes in question design between the 1980 and 1970 Censuses included the placement of the category "No, not Spanish/ Hispanic" as the first category in that question (The corresponding category appeared last in the 1970 question.) Also, the 1970 category "Central or South American" was deleted because in 1970 some respondents misinterpreted the category; furthermore, the designations "Mexican-American" and "Chicano" were added to the Spanish/Hispanic origin question in 1980. In the 1970 Census, the question on Spanish origin was asked of only a 5-percent sample of the population.

3.2.3. Household Type and Relationship

3.2.3.1. Household

A household includes all the persons who occupy a housing unit. A housing unit is a house, an apartment, a mobile home, a group of rooms, or a single room that is occupied (or if vacant, is intended for occupancy) as separate living quarters. Separate living quarters are those in which the occupants live and eat separately from any other persons in the building and which have direct access from the outside of the building or through a common hall. The occupants may be a single family, one person living alone, two or more families living together, or any other group of related or unrelated persons who share living arrangements.

The 1990 definition of a household is the same as that used in 1980. The 1980 relationship category "Son/daughter" has been replaced by two categories, "Natural-born or adopted son/daughter" and "Stepson/stepdaughter." "Grandchild" has been added as a separate category. The 1980 nonrelative categories: "Roomer, boarder and "Partner, roommate" have been replaced by the categories "Roomer, boarder, or foster child Housemate, roommate," and "Unmarried partner." The 1980 non-relative category "Paid employee" has been dropped.

3.2.3.2. Family Type

A family consists of a householder and one or more other persons living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. All persons in a household who are related to the householder are regarded as members of his or her family. A household can contain only one family for purposes of census tabulations. Not all households contain families since a household may comprise a group of unrelated persons or one person living alone.

Families are classified by type as either a "married-couple family" or "other family" according to the sex of the householder and the presence of relatives. The data on family type are based on answers to questions on sex and relationship which were asked on a 100 percent basis.

Married-couple family. A family in which the house-holder and his or her spouse are enumerated as members of the same household.

Other family. Male Householder, No Wife Present: A family with a male householder and no spouse of householder present. Female Householder, No Husband Present: A family with a female householder and no spouse of householder present.

3.2.3.3. Subfamily

A subfamily is a married couple (husband and wife enumerated as members of the same household) with or without never-married children under 18 years old, or one parent with one or more never-married children under 18 years old, living in a household and related to, but not including, either the householder or the householder's spouse. The number of subfamilies is not included in the count of families, since subfamily members are counted as part of the householder's family.

3.2.3.4. Marital Status

Marital status for the 1990 Census was asked of all persons. The marital status classification refers to the status at the time of enumeration. Data on marital status are tabulated only for persons 15 years old and over.

All persons were asked whether they were "now married," "widowed," "divorced," "separated," or "never married." Couples who live together (unmarried persons, persons in common-law marriages) were allowed to report the marital status they considered the most appropriate.

Never married. This term includes all persons who have never been married, including persons whose only marriage(s) was annulled.

Ever married. This term includes persons married at the time of enumeration as well as those separated, widowed, or divorced.

Now married (except separated). This term includes persons whose current marriage has not ended through widowhood, divorce, or separation (regardless of previous marital history). The category may also include couples who live together or persons in common-law marriages if they consider this category the most appropriate. In certain tabulations, currently married persons are further classified as "spouse present" or "spouse absent."

Separated. This term includes persons legally separated or otherwise absent from their spouse because of marital discord. Included are persons who have been deserted or who have parted because they no longer want to live together but who have not obtained a divorce.

Widowed. This term includes widows and widowers who have not remarried.

Divorced. This term includes persons who are legally divorced and who have not remarried.

Now married. This term refers to all persons whose current marriage has not ended by widowhood or divorce. This category includes persons defined above as separated.

Differences between the number of currently married males and the number of currently married females occur because of reporting differences and because some husbands and wives have their usual residence in different areas. In sample tabulations, these differences can also occur because different weights are applied to the individual's data. Any differences between the number of "now married, spouse present" males and females are due solely to sample weighting. By definition, the numbers would be the same.

When marital status was not reported, it was imputed according to the relationship to the householder and sex and age of the person.

The 1990 marital status definitions are the same as those used in 1980 with the exception of the term "never married" which replaces the term "single" in tabulations. A general marital status question has been asked in every census since 1880.

3.2.3.5. Marriage and Divorce

Marriage and divorce statistics are total counts of events gathered by collecting already summarized data reported by State offices of vital statistics and by county offices of registration.

Marriage and divorce statistics are limited to events occurring in the specified area during the year and include events occurring to nonresidents of the United States. Marriages or divorces occurring to U.S. residents outside the United States are excluded. Reported annulments are included in the divorce statistics.

The marriage and divorce rates are based on resident population enumerated as of April 1 for decennial census years and estimated as of July 1 for other years.

3.2.3.6. Place of Birth

The data on place of birth were asked on a sample basis. The place-of-birth question asked respondents to report the U.S. State, commonwealth or territory, or the foreign country where they were born. Persons born outside the United States were asked to report their place of birth according to current international boundaries. Since numerous changes in boundaries of foreign countries have occurred in the last century, some persons may have reported their place of birth in terms of boundaries that existed at the time of their birth or emigration, or in accordance with their own national preference.

Persons not reporting place of birth were assigned the birthplace of another family member or were allocated the response of another person with similar characteristics. Persons allocated as foreign born were not assigned a specific country of birth but were classified as "Born abroad, country not specified."

Nativity. Information on place of birth and citizenship was used to classify the population into two major categories: native and foreign born. When information on place of birth was not reported, nativity was assigned on the basis of answers to citizenship, if reported, and other characteristics.

Native. This term includes persons born in the United States, Puerto Rico, or an outlying area of the United States. The small number of persons who were born in a foreign country but have at least one American parent also are included in this category.

The native population is classified in the following groups: persons born in the State in which they resided at the time of the census; persons born in a different State, by region; persons born in Puerto Rico or an outlying area of the U.S.; and persons born abroad with at least one American parent.

Foreign born. This term includes persons not classified as "Native." Prior to the 1970 Census, persons not reporting place of birth were generally classified as native. The foreign-born population

is shown by selected area, country, or region of birth: the places of birth shown in data products were selected based on the number of respondents who reported that area or country of birth.

Data on the State of birth of the native population have been collected in each census beginning with that of 1850. Similar data were shown in tabulations for the 1980 Census and other recent censuses. Non-response was allocated in a similar manner in 1980; however, prior to 1980, non-response to the place of birth question was not allocated. Prior to the 1970 Census, persons not reporting place of birth were generally classified as native.

The questionnaire instruction to report mother's State of residence instead of the person's actual State of birth (if born in a hospital in a different State) was dropped in 1990. Evaluation studies of 1970 and 1980 Census data demonstrated that this instruction was generally either ignored or misunderstood. Since the hospital and the mother's residence is in the same State for most births, this change may have a slight effect on State of birth data for States with large metropolitan areas that straddle State lines.

3.2.3.7. Race

Race was asked of all persons in the 1990 Census. The concept of race as used by the Census Bureau reflects self-identification; it does not denote any clearcut scientific definition of biological stock. The data for race represent self-classification by people according to the race with which they most closely identify. Furthermore, it is recognized that the categories of the race item include both racial and national origin or sociocultural groups.

During direct interviews conducted by enumerators, if a person could not provide a single response to the race question, he or she was asked to select, based on self-identification, the group which best described his or her racial identity. If a person could not provide a single race response, the race of the mother was used. If a single race response could not be provided for the person's mother, the first race reported by the person was used. In all cases where occupied housing units, households, or families are classified by race, the race of the householder was used.

The racial classification used by the Census Bureau generally adheres to the guidelines in Federal Statistical Directive No. 15, issued by the Office of Management and Budget, which provides standards on ethnic and racial categories for statistical reporting to be used by all Federal agencies.

White: Includes persons who indicated their race as "White" or reported entries such as Canadian, German, Italian, Lebanese, Near Easterner, Arab, or Polish.

Black: Includes persons who indicated their race as "Black or Negro", or reported entries such as African American, Afro-American, Black Puerto Rican, Jamaican, Nigerian, West Indian, or Haitian.

If the race entry for a member of a household was missing on the questionnaire, race was assigned based upon the reported entries of race by other household members using specific rules of precedence of household relationship. For example, if race was missing for the daughter of the householder, then the race of her mother (as female householder or female spouse) would be assigned. If there were no female householder or spouse in the household, the daughter would be assigned her father's (male householder) race. If race were not reported for anyone in the household, the race of a householder in a previously processed household was assigned. This procedure is a variation of the general imputation procedures described in Appendix C, Accuracy of the Data.

In the 1990 Census, respondents sometimes did not fill in a circle or filled the "Other race" circle and wrote in a response, such as Arab, Polish, or African American in the shared write-in box for "Other race" and "Other API" responses. During the automated coding process, these responses were edited and assigned to the appropriate racial designation. Also, some Hispanic origin persons did not fill in a circle, but provided entries such as Mexican or Puerto Rican. These persons were classified in the "Other race" category during the coding and editing process.

Differences between the 1990 Census and earlier censuses affect the comparability of data for certain racial groups and American Indian tribes. The 1990 Census was the first census to undertake, on a 100-percent basis, an automated review, edit, and coding operation for written responses to the race item. The automated coding system used in the 1990 Census greatly reduced the potential for error associated with a clerical review. Specialists with a thorough knowledge of the race subject matter reviewed, edited, coded, and resolved inconsistent or incomplete responses. In the 1980 Census, there was only a limited clerical review of the race responses on the 100-percent forms with a full clerical review conducted only on the sample questionnaires.

Another difference between 1990 and preceding censuses is the approach taken when persons of Spanish/Hispanic origin did not report in a specific race category but reported as "Other race" or "Other." These persons commonly provided a write-in entry such as Mexican, Venezuelan, or Latino. In the 1990 and 1980 censuses, these entries remained in the "Other race" or "Other" category, respectively. In the 1970 Census, most of these persons were included in the "White" category.

3.2.3.8. Residence in 1985

The 1990 Census asked for the State (or foreign country), county, and place of residence on April 1, 1985 for those persons reporting that on that date they lived in a different house than their current residence. Residence in 1985 is used in conjunction with location of current residence to determine the extent of residential mobility of the population and the resulting redistribution of the population across the various States, metropolitan areas, and regions of the country.

When no information on residence in 1985 was reported for a person, information for other family members, if available, was used to assign a location of residence in 1985. All cases of nonresponse or incomplete response that were not assigned a previous residence based on information from other family members were allocated the previous residence of another person with similar characteristics who provided complete information.

The tabulation category, "Same house," includes all persons 5 years old and over who did not move during the 5 years as well as those who had moved but by 1990 had returned to their 1985 residence. The category, "Different house in the United States," includes persons who lived in the United States in 1985 but in a different house or apartment from the one they occupied on April 1, 1990. These movers are then further subdivided according to the type of move.

In most tabulations, movers are divided into three groups according to their 1985 residence: "Different house, same county," "Different county, same State," and "Different State." The last group may be further subdivided into region of residence in 1985. The category, "Abroad," includes those persons who were residing in a foreign country, Puerto Rico, or an outlying area of the U.S. in 1985, including members of the Armed Forces and their dependents. Some tabulations show movers who were residing in Puerto Rico or an outlying area in 1985 separately from those residing in other countries.

In tabulations for metropolitan areas, movers are categorized according to the metropolitan status of their current and previous residences, resulting in such groups as movers within an Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA)/Primary Metropolitan Statistical Area (PMSA), movers between MSA/PMSA's, movers from nonmetropolitan areas to MSA/PMSA, and movers from central cities to the remainder of an MSA/ PMSA. In some tabulations, these categories are further subdivided by size of MSA/ PMSA, region of current or previous residence, or movers within or between central cities and the remainder of the same or a different MSA/ PMSA.

The number of persons who were living in a different house in 1985 is somewhat less than the total number of moves during the 5-year period. Some persons in the same house at the two dates had moved during the 5-year period but by the time of the census had returned to their 1985 residence. Other persons who were living in a different house had made one or more intermediate moves. For similar reasons, the

number of persons living in a different county, MSA/PMSA, or State or moving between nonmetropolitan areas may be understated.

Similar questions were asked on all previous censuses beginning in 1940, except the questions in 1950 referred to residence 1 year earlier rather than 5 years earlier. Although the questions in the 1940 Census covered a 5-year period, comparability with that census was reduced somewhat because of different definitions and categories of tabulation. Comparability with the 1960 and 1970 census is also somewhat reduced because non-response was not allocated in those earlier censuses. For the 1980 Census, nonresponse was allocated in a manner similar to the 1990 allocation scheme.

3.2.3.9. Year of Entry

Information on year of entry came from a sample of persons. The question, "When did this person come to the United States to stay?" was asked of persons who indicated in the question on citizenship that they were not born in the United States. (For more information, see the discussion under "Citizenship.")

The 1990 Census questions, tabulations, and census data products about citizenship and year of entry include no reference to immigration. All persons who were born and resided outside the United States before becoming residents of the United States have a date of entry. Some of these persons are U.S. citizens by birth (e.g., persons born in Puerto Rico or born abroad of American parents). To avoid any possible confusion concerning the date of entry of persons who are U.S. citizens by birth, the term, "year of entry" is used in this report instead of the term "year of immigration."

The census questions on nativity, citizenship, and year of entry were not designed to measure the degree of permanence of residence in the United States. The phrase, "to stay" was used to obtain the year in which the person became a resident of the United States. Although the respondent was directed to indicate the year he or she entered the country "to stay," it was difficult to ensure that respondents interpreted the phrase correctly.

A question on year of entry, (alternately called "year of immigration") was asked in each decennial census from 1890 to 1930, 1970, and 1980. In 1980, the question on year of entry included six arrival time intervals. The number of arrival intervals was expanded to ten in 1990. In 1980, the question on year of entry was asked only of the foreign-born population. In 1990, all persons who responded to the long-form questionnaire and were not born in the United States were to complete the question on year of entry.

3.3. Civilian Employment

3.3.1. Data Sources

See decennial censuses in Section 3.2.above.

3.3.2. Selected Terms

3.3.2.1. Employment Status

Information on employment status for the 1990 Census is based on a sample of persons. The series of questions on employment status was asked of all persons 15 years old and over and was designed to identify, in this sequence: (1) persons who worked at any time during the reference week; (2) persons who did not work during the reference week but who had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent (excluding layoff); (3) persons on layoff; and (4) persons who did not work during the reference week, but who were looking for work during the last four weeks and were available for work during the reference week. (For more information, see the discussion under "Reference Week.")

The data on employment status data in this and other 1990 Census tabulations relate to persons 16 years old and over. Some tabulations showing employment status, however, include persons 15 years old. By definition, these persons are classified as "Not in Labor Force." In the 1940, 1950, and 1960 censuses, employment status data were collected for persons 14 years old and over. The change in the universe was made in 1970 to agree with the official measurement of the labor force as revised in January 1967 by the U.S. Department of Labor. The 1970 Census was the last to show employment data for persons 14 and 15 years old. This dataset, therefore, includes, for the 1970 Census, employment status data for persons 16 years and over as well as persons 15 and 16 years. The definition of employment status for the 1990 Census is as follows:

Employed: All civilians 16 years old and over who were either (1) "at work"-those who did any work at all during the reference week as paid employees, worked in their own business or profession, worked on their own farm, or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers on a family farm or in a family business; or (2) were "with a job but not at work" -those who did not work during the reference week but had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent due to illness, bad weather, industrial dispute, vacation, or other personal reasons. Excluded from the employed are persons whose only activity consisted of work around the house or unpaid volunteer work for religious, charitable, and similar organizations; also excluded are persons on active duty in the United States Armed Forces.

Unemployed: All civilians 16 years old and over are classified as unemployed if they (1) were neither "at work" nor "with a job but not at work" during the reference week, and (2) were looking for work during the last 4 weeks, and (3) were available to accept a job. Also included as unemployed are civilians who did not work at all during the reference week and were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off. Examples of job seeking activities are:

- * Registering at a public or private employment office
- * Meeting with prospective employers
- * Investigating possibilities for starting a professional practice or opening a business
- * Placing or answering advertisements
- * Writing letters of application
- * Being on a union or professional register

Civilian labor force: Persons classified as employed or unemployed in accordance with the criteria described above.

Experienced unemployed: Unemployed persons who have worked at any time in the past.

Experienced civilian labor force: The employed and the experienced unemployed.

Labor force: All persons classified in the civilian labor force plus members of the U. S. Armed Forces (persons on active duty with the United States Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard).

Not in labor force: All persons 16 years old and over who are not classified as members of the labor force. This category consists mainly of students, housewives, retired workers, seasonal workers enumerated in an off season who were not looking for work, institutionalized persons, and persons doing only incidental unpaid family work (less than 15 hours during the reference week).

Worker. This term appears in connection with several subjects: journey-to-work items, class of worker, weeks worked in 1989, and number of workers in family in 1989. Its meaning varies and, therefore, should be determined in each case by referring to the definition of the subject in which it appears.

The census could understate the number of employed persons because persons who have irregular, casual, or unstructured jobs sometimes report themselves as not working. The number of employed persons "at work" is probably overstated in the census (and conversely, the number of employed "with a job, but not at work" is understated), since some persons on vacation or sick leave erroneously reported themselves as working. This problem has no effect on the total number of employed persons. The reference week for the employment data is not the same for all persons. Since persons can change their employment status from one week to another, the lack of a uniform reference week may mean that the employment data do not reflect the reality of the employment situation of any given week. (For more information, see the discussion under "Reference Week.")

The questionnaire items and employment status concepts for the 1990 Census are essentially the same as those used in the 1980 and 1970 censuses. However, these concepts differ in many respects from those associated with the 1940, 1950 and 1960 censuses. As mentioned above, employment data in the 1940-60 censuses were collected for persons 14 years old and over, whereas later censuses collected data for persons 16 years old and over. Significant changes also took place between the 1940 Census and the 1950 Census. Three points merit special attention:

First, in the 1940 Census, the classification of the labor force is not available in terms of civilian and non-civilian (armed forces), whereas beginning with the 1950 Census, such classification became available. The number of employed persons between 1940 and 1950, therefore, is not comparable, for the 1940 figures include those employed by the armed forces.

Second, the 1940 Census definition of persons in the labor force included three categories: (1) persons actually at work, (2) with a job (not at work but with jobs, businesses, or professional enterprises from which they were temporarily absent, and (3) persons on public emergency work. In the original 1940 Census tables as well as in this dataset for 1940, "employed" comprises only the first two categories.

Lastly, in 1940, unemployed was defined as persons (1) seeking work and without any form of public or private employment and (2) on public emergency work programs established to provide jobs for the unemployed. However, considerable number of public emergency workers were reported as "at work" rather than "on public emergency work." The number of unemployed persons, for this reason, is understated, the extent of which varies from State to State.

Since employment data from the census are obtained from respondents in households, they differ from statistics based on reports from individual business establishments, farm enterprises, and certain government programs. Persons employed at more than one job are counted only once in the census and are classified according to the job at which they worked the greatest number of hours during the reference week. In statistics based on reports from business and farm establishments, persons who work for more than one establishment may be counted more than once. Moreover, some tabulations may exclude private household workers, unpaid family workers, and self-employed persons, but may include workers less than 16 years of age.

An additional difference in the data arises from the fact that persons who had a job but were not at work are included with the employed in the census statistics, whereas many of these persons are likely to be excluded from employment figures based on establishment payroll reports. Furthermore, the employment status data in census tabulations include persons on the basis of place of residence regardless of where they work, whereas establishment data report persons at their place of work regardless of where they live. This latter consideration is particularly significant when comparing data for workers who commute between areas.

For several reasons, the unemployment figures of the Census Bureau are not comparable with published figures on unemployment compensation claims. For example, figures on unemployment compensation claims exclude persons who have exhausted their benefit rights, new workers who have not earned rights to unemployment insurance, and persons losing jobs not covered by unemployment insurance systems (including some workers in agriculture, domestic services, and religious organizations, and self-

employed and unpaid family workers). In addition, the qualifications for drawing unemployment compensation differ from the definition of unemployment used by the Census Bureau. Persons working only a few hours during the week and persons with a job but not at work are sometimes eligible for unemployment compensation but are classified as "Employed" in the census. Differences in the geographical distribution of unemployment data arise because the place where claims are filed may not necessarily be the same as the place of residence of the unemployed worker.

The figures on employment status from the decennial census are generally comparable with similar data collected in the Current Population Survey. However, some difference may exist because of variations in enumeration and processing techniques.

3.3.3. Industry, Occupation, and Class of Worker

Information on data on industry, occupation, and class of worker for the 1990 Census was asked of a sample of persons. Information on industry relates to the kind of business conducted by a person's employing organization; occupation describes the kind of work the person does on the job; class of worker provides information about the employment status of a person.

For employed persons, the data refer to the person's job during the reference week. For those who worked at two or more jobs, the data refer to the job at which the person worked the greatest number of hours. For unemployed persons, the data refer to their last job. The industry and occupation statistics are derived from the detailed classification systems developed for the 1990 Census as described below. The Classified Index of Industries and Occupations provided additional information on the industry and occupation classification systems.

3.3.3.1. Industry

The industry classification system developed for the 1990 Census consists of 235 categories for employed persons, classified into 13 major industry groups. Since 1940, the industrial classification has been based on the Standard Industrial Classification Manual (SIC). The 1990 Census classification was developed from the 1987 SIC published by the Office of Management and Budget Executive Office of the President.

The SIC was designed primarily to classify establishments by the type of industrial activity in which they were engaged. However, census data, which were collected from households, differ in detail and nature from those obtained from establishment surveys. Therefore, the census classification systems, while defined in SIC terms, cannot reflect the full detail in all categories. There are several levels of industrial classification found in census products. For example, the 1990 CP-2 (Social and Economic Characteristics) report includes 41 unique industrial categories, while the 1990 Summary Tape File 4 (STF 4) presents 72 categories.

3.3.3.2. Occupation

The occupational classification system developed for the 1990 Census consists of 500 specific occupational categories for employed persons arranged into 6 summary and 13 major occupational groups. This classification was developed to be consistent with the Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) Manual: 1980, published by the Office of Federal Statistical Policy and Standards, U.S. Department of Commerce. Tabulations with occupation as the primary characteristic present several levels of occupational detail. The most detailed tabulations are shown in a special 1990 subject report and tape files on occupation. These products contain all 500 occupational categories plus industry or class of worker subgroupings of occupational categories.

Some occupation groups are related closely to certain industries. Operators of transportation equipment, farm operators and workers, and private household workers account for major portions of their respective industries of transportation, agriculture, and private households. However, the industry categories include persons in other occupations. For example, persons employed in agriculture include truck drivers and

bookkeepers; persons employed in the transportation industry include mechanics, freight handlers, and payroll clerks; and persons employed in the private household industry include occupations such as chauffeur, gardener, and secretary.

New occupations emerge with the change in technologies which gave rise to the change in the occupational and industrial classifications. However, this change makes the across-time comparison difficult. For example, before the 1970 Census, some technical occupations such as health technicians, electrical engineers, lab technicians, and air plane pilots were considered "professionals." Beginning with the 1980 Census, these occupations are called "technicians and related support occupations" and are treated as part of sales and clerical occupations. Thus, to compare the number of professionals over time, it is necessary to combine "professionals" and "technicians and related support occupations" for 1980 and 1990. The matrix chart (Section 3) presents the most comparable categories across time.

3.3.3.3. Class of Worker

The information on class of worker refers to the same job as a respondent's industry and occupation and categorizes persons according to the type of ownership of the employing organization. The class of worker categories are defined as follows:

Private wage and salary workers: Includes persons who worked for wages, salary, commission, tips, pay-in-kind, or piece rates for a private for profit employer or a private not-for-profit, tax-exempt or charitable organization. Self-employed persons whose business was incorporated are included with private wage and salary workers because they are paid employees of their own companies. Some tabulations present data separately for these subcategories: "For profit," "Not for profit," and "Own business incorporated." Employees of foreign governments, the United Nations, or other formal international organizations were classified as Private-not-for-profit.

Government workers: Includes persons who were employees of any local, State, or Federal governmental unit, regardless of the activity of the particular agency. For some tabulations, the data were presented separately for the three levels of government.

Self-employed workers: Includes persons who worked for profit or fees in their own unincorporated business, profession, or trade, or who operated a farm.

Unpaid family workers: Includes persons who worked 15 hours or more without pay in a business or on a farm operated by a relative.

Salaried/self-employed. In tabulations that categorize persons as either salaried or self-employed, the salaried category includes private and government wage and salary workers; self-employed includes self-employed persons and unpaid family workers.

The industry category, "Public administration," is limited to regular government functions such as legislative, judicial, administrative, and regulatory activities of governments. Other government organizations such as schools, hospitals, liquor stores, and bus lines are classified by industry according to the activity in which they are engaged. On the other hand, the class of worker category "government" includes all government workers.

Comparability of industry and occupation data is affected by a number of factors, primarily by the systems used to classify the questionnaire responses. For both the industry and occupation classification systems, the basic structures were generally the same from 1940 to 1970, but changes in the individual categories limited comparability of the data from one census to another. These changes were needed to recognize the "birth" of new industries and occupations, the "death" of others, and the growth and decline in existing industries and occupations, as well as the desire of analysts and other users for more detail in the presentation of the data. Probably the greatest cause of incomparability is the transfer of a segment of a

category to a different category in the next census. Changes in the nature of jobs and respondent terminology and refinement of category composition made these movements necessary.

In the 1990 Census, the industry classification underwent minor revisions to reflect recent changes to the SIC. The 1990 occupational classification system is essentially the same as that for the 1980 Census. However, the conversion of the census classification to the SIC in 1980 meant that the 1990 classification system was less comparable to the classifications used prior to the 1980 Census.

Other factors that affect data comparability include the universe to which the data referred (in 1970, the age cutoff for labor force was changed from 14 years to 16 years); how the industry and occupation questions were worded on the questionnaire (for example, important changes were made in 1970); improvements in the coding procedures (the Employer Name List technique was introduced in 1960); and how the "not reported" cases are handled. Prior to 1970, they were placed in the residual categories, "Industry not reported" and "Occupation not reported." In 1970, an allocation process was introduced that assigned these cases to major groups. In 1990, as in 1980, the "Not reported" cases were assigned to individual categories. Therefore, the 1980 and 1990 data for individual categories included some persons who were tabulated in a "Not reported" category in previous censuses.

The following publications contain information on the various factors affecting comparability and are particularly useful for understanding differences in the occupation and industry information from earlier censuses: U.S. Bureau of the Census, Changes Between the 1950 and 1960 Occupation and Industry Classifications With Detailed Adjustments of 1950 Data to the 1960 Classifications, Technical Paper No. 18, 1968; U.S. Bureau of the Census, 1970 Occupation and Industry Classification Systems in Terms of their 1960 Occupation and Industry Elements, Technical Paper No. 26, 1972; and U.S. Bureau of the Census, The Relationship Between the 1970 and 1980 Industry and Occupation Classification Systems, Technical Paper No. 59, 1988. For citations for earlier census years, see the 1980 Census of Population report, PC80-1-D, Detailed Population Characteristics.

The 1990 Census introduced an additional class of worker category for "private not-for-profit" employers. This category is a subset of the 1980 category "employee of private employer." Also in 1990, employees of foreign governments, the United Nations, etc., are classified as "private not-for-profit," rather than Federal Government as in 1970 and 1980. While this change in theory represents a change in comparability, the small number of U.S. residents working for foreign governments makes this change negligible for the counties included in the present database.

Comparability between the statistics on industry and occupation from the 1990 Census and statistics from other sources is affected by many of the factors described in the section on "Employment Status." These factors are primarily geographic differences between residence and place of work, different dates of reference, and differences in counts because of dual job holding. Industry data from population censuses cover all industries and all kinds of workers, whereas data from establishments often excluded private household workers, government workers, and the self-employed. Also, the replies from household respondents may have differed in detail and nature from those obtained from establishments.

Occupation data from the census and data from government licensing agencies, professional associations, trade unions, etc., may not be as comparable as expected. Organizational listings often include persons not in the labor force or persons devoting all or most of their time to another occupation; or the same person may be included in two or more different listings. In addition, relatively few organizations, except for those requiring licensing, attained complete coverage of membership in a particular occupational field.

3.3.3.4. Oil Dependency

For the period 1940-90, the data on employment in mining are available from published decennial censuses included in this database. For 1980 and 1990, breakdowns of mining employment are available

from the special tabulation obtained from the census office that provides employment data in oil/natural gas, metal, coal and other mining.

The data extracted from the special tabulation are different from the data in the published decennial censuses. Employment data in decennial censuses are based on employed persons 14 years (or 16 years) and over who are civilians at work or with a job but not at work at the data of census, whereas the special tabulation data refer to persons 16 years and over ever worked between 1975-80 for the 1980 data, and 1985-90 for the 1990 data. Consequently, the special tabulation data include unemployed and retired persons at the data of census.

Based on the data on employment in mining (for the period 1940-90) and oil/gas employment (for the period 1980-90), we have derived two measures of mining (or oil/gas) dependency for each county: (1) the percentage of workers employed in mining (or oil/gas) industry, and (2) location quotient. Location quotient in mining (oil/gas) of county A is defined as,

$$\text{LQ (mining)} = \frac{\begin{array}{c} \% \text{mining (or oil/gas) in county A} \\ \\ \% \text{mining (or oil/gas) of the state} \\ \text{in which county A is located.} \end{array}}$$

3.3.3.5. Reference Week

The data on labor force status work were related to a reference week; the reference week refers to the calendar week preceding the date on which respondents completed their questionnaires or were interviewed by enumerators. This week is not the same for all respondents since the enumeration was not completed in one week. The occurrence of holidays during the enumeration period could affect the data on actual hours worked during the reference week, but probably had no effect on overall measurement of employment status (see the discussion below on "Comparability").

The reference weeks for the 1990 and 1980 Censuses differ in that Passover and Good Friday occurred in the first week of April 1980, but in the second week of April 1990. Many workers presumably took time off for those observances. The differing occurrence of these holidays could affect the comparability of the 1990 and 1980 data on actual hours worked for some areas if the respective weeks were the reference weeks for a significant number of persons. The holidays probably did not affect the overall measurement of employment status since this information was based on work activity during the entire reference week.

3.4. Income and Poverty Status

3.4.1. Data Sources

Two types of income statistics are included in this dataset: money income and personal income. The former, money income, is obtained from the Census, whereas the latter, personal income, is obtained from the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA). Unless specifically mentioned as personal income, the variables on income refer to money income. For the definitions of money and personal income, see Money Income and Per Capita Personal Income below.

The data on income in 1989 were requested from persons 15 years old and over. "Total income" is the algebraic sum of the amounts reported separately for

- wage or salary income
- net non-farm self-employment income
- net farm self-employment income
- interest, dividend, or net rental or royalty income
- Social Security or railroad retirement income
- public assistance or welfare income
- retirement or disability income
- and all other income.

"Earnings" is defined as the algebraic sum of wage or salary income and net income from farm and nonfarm self-employment. "Earnings" represent the amount of income received regularly before deductions for personal income taxes, Social Security, bond purchases, union dues, medicare deductions, etc.

Receipts from the following sources are not included as income: money received from the sale of property (unless the recipient was engaged in the business of selling such property); the value of income "in kind" from food stamps, public housing subsidies, medical care, employer contributions for persons, etc.; withdrawal of bank deposits; money borrowed; tax refunds; exchange of money between relatives living in the same household; gifts and lump-sum inheritances, insurance payments, and other types of lump-sum receipts.

The income data collected in the 1980 and 1970 censuses are similar to the 1990 Census data, but there are variations in the detail of the questions. In 1980, income information for 1979 was collected from persons in approximately 19 percent of all housing units and group quarters. Each person was required to report:

- Wage or salary income
- Net nonfarm self-employment income
- Net farm self-employment income
- Interest, dividend, or net rental or royalty income
- Social Security income
- Public assistance income
- Income from all other sources

In 1970, information on income in 1969 was obtained from all members in every fifth housing unit and small group quarters (less than 15 persons) and every fifth person in all other group quarters. Each person was required to report:

- Wage or salary income
- Net nonfarm self-employment income
- Net farm self-employment income
- Social Security or Railroad Retirement
- Public assistance or welfare payments
- Income from all other sources

In 1960, data on income were obtained from all members in every fourth housing unit and from every fourth person 14 years old and over living in group quarters. Each person was required to report:

- wage or salary income
- net self-employment income
- income other than earnings received in 1959.

An assumption was made in the editing process that no other type of income was received by a person who reported the receipt of either wage and salary income or self-employment but who had failed to report the receipt of other money income.

For several reasons, the income data shown in census tabulations are not directly comparable with those that may be obtained from statistical summaries of income tax returns. Income, as defined for Federal tax purposes, differs somewhat from the Census Bureau concept. Moreover, the coverage of income tax statistics is different because of the exemptions of persons having small amounts of income and the inclusion of net capital gains in tax returns. Furthermore, members of some families file separate returns and others file joint returns; consequently, the income reporting unit is not consistently either a family or a person.

The earnings data shown in census tabulations are not directly comparable with **earnings records** of the Social Security Administration. The earnings record data for 1989 excluded the earnings of most civilian government employees, some employees of nonprofit organizations, workers covered by the Railroad Retirement Act, and persons not covered by the program because of insufficient earnings. Furthermore, earnings received from any one employer in excess of \$48,000 in 1989 are not covered by earnings records. Finally, because census data are obtained from household questionnaires, they may differ from Social Security Administration earnings record data, which are based upon employers' reports and the Federal income tax returns of self-employed persons.

The Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) of the Department of Commerce publishes annual data on aggregate and per-capita personal income received by the population for States, metropolitan areas, and selected counties. Aggregate income estimates based on the income statistics shown in census products usually would be less than those shown in the BEA income series for several reasons. The Census Bureau data are obtained directly from households, whereas the BEA income series is estimated largely on the basis of data from administrative records of business and governmental sources. Moreover, the definitions of income are different. The BEA income series includes some items not included in the income data shown in census publications, such as income "in kind," income received by nonprofit institutions, the value of services of banks and other financial intermediaries rendered to persons without the assessment of specific charges, Medicare payments, and the income of persons who died or emigrated prior to April 1, 1990. On the other hand the census income data include contributions for support received from persons not residing in the same household and employer contributions for social insurance.

3.4.2. Selected Terms

3.4.2.1. Income of Households

Household income includes the income of the householder and all other persons 15 years old and over in the household, whether related to the householder or not. Because many households consist of only one person, average household income is usually less than average family income.

3.4.2.2. Income of Families and Persons

In compiling statistics on family income, the incomes of all members 15 years old and over in each family are summed and treated as a single amount. However, for persons 15 years old and over, the total amounts of their own incomes are used. Although the income statistics covered the calendar year 1989, the

characteristics of persons and the composition of families refer to the time of enumeration (April 1990). Thus, the income of the family does not include amounts received by persons who were members of the family during all or part of the calendar year 1989 if these persons no longer resided with the family at the time of enumeration. Yet, family income amounts reported by related persons who did not reside with the family during 1989 but who were members of the family at the time of enumeration are included. However, the composition of most families was the same during 1989 as in April 1990.

3.4.2.3. Mean Income

Mean income is the amount obtained by dividing the total income of a particular statistical universe by the number of units in that universe. Thus, mean household income is obtained by dividing total household income by the total number of households. For the various types of income the means are based on households having those types of income. "Per capita income" is the mean income computed for every man, woman, and child in a particular group. It is derived by dividing the total income of a particular group by the total population in that group.

Care should be exercised in using and interpreting mean income values for small subgroups of the population. Because the mean is influenced strongly by extreme values in the distribution, it is especially susceptible to the effects of sampling variability, misreporting, and processing errors. The median, which is not affected by extreme values, is, therefore, a better measure than the mean when the population base is small. The mean, nevertheless, is shown in some data products for most small subgroups because, when weighted according to the number of cases, the means can be added to obtain summary measures for areas and groups other than those shown in census tabulations.

3.4.2.4. Median Income

The median divides the income distribution into two equal parts, one having incomes above the median and the other having incomes below the median. For households and families, the median income is based on the distribution of the total number of units including those with no income. The median for persons is based on persons with income. The median income values for all households, families, and persons are computed on the basis of more detailed income intervals than shown in most tabulations. Median household or family income figures of \$50,000 or less are calculated using linear interpolation. For persons, corresponding median values of \$40,000 or less are also computed using linear interpolation. All other median income amounts are derived through Pareto interpolation. (For more information on medians and interpolation, see the discussion under "Derived Measures.")

3.4.2.5. Money Income

The income data obtained from the censuses covers money income only. The fact that many farm families receive an important part of their income in the form of "free" housing and goods produced and consumed on the farm rather than in money should be taken into consideration in comparing the income of farm and nonfarm residents. Nonmoney income such as business expense accounts, use of business transportation and facilities, or partial compensation by business for medical and educational expenses was also received by some nonfarm residents. Many low income families also receive income "in kind" from public welfare programs. In comparing income data for 1989 with earlier years, it should be noted that an increase or decrease in money income does not necessarily represent a comparable change in real income, unless adjustments for changes in prices are made.

3.4.2.6. Per Capita Personal Income

Data for personal income earnings obtained from the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) are based on place of work, unlike civilian labor force data obtained from the Bureau of the Census, which are based on place of residence. Total personal income is adjusted to place of residence.

Per capita personal income is defined as the personal income of the residents of an area divided by the resident population of the area. It is based on resident population enumerated as of April 1 for decennial census years and estimated as of July 1 for other years.

Personal income differs from money income, which is prepared by the Census Bureau, in that money income is measured before deduction of personal contributions for social insurance and does not include imputed income, lump sum payments, and income received by quasi-individuals. Money income does include income from private pensions and annuities and from interpersonal transfer, such as child support.

3.4.2.7. Poverty Status

The data on poverty status were derived from answers to the same questions as the income data asked in the census. Poverty statistics presented in census publications were based on a definition originated by the Social Security Administration in 1964 and subsequently modified by Federal interagency committees in 1969 and 1980 and prescribed by the Office of Management and Budget in Directive 14 as the standard to be used by Federal agencies for statistical purposes.

At the core of this definition was the 1961 economy food plan, the least costly of four nutritionally adequate food plans designed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). It was determined from USDA's 1955 survey of food consumption that families of three or more persons spend approximately one-third of their income on food; hence, the poverty level for these families was set at three times the cost of the economy food plan. For smaller families and persons living alone, the cost of the economy food plan was multiplied by factors that were slightly higher to compensate for the relatively larger fixed expenses for these smaller households.

The income cutoffs used by the Census Bureau to determine the poverty status of families and unrelated individuals included a set of 48 thresholds arranged in a two-dimensional matrix consisting of family size (from one person to nine or more persons) cross-classified by presence and number of family members under 18 years old (from no children present to eight or more children present). Unrelated individuals and two-person families were further differentiated by age of the householder (under 65 years old and 65 years old and over).

The total income of each family or unrelated individual in the sample was tested against the appropriate poverty threshold to determine the poverty status of that family or unrelated individual. If the total income was less than the corresponding cutoff, the family or unrelated individual was classified as "below the poverty level."

The number of persons below the poverty level was the sum of the number of persons in families with incomes below the poverty level and the number of unrelated individuals with incomes below the poverty level.

The poverty thresholds are revised annually to allow for changes in the cost of living as reflected in the Consumer Price Index. The average poverty threshold for a family of four persons was \$12,674 in 1989, (For more information see Table A below.)

Poverty thresholds were applied on a national basis and were not adjusted for regional, State or local variations in the cost of living. For a detailed discussion of the poverty definitions, see U.S. Bureau of the Census, Current Population Reports, Series P-60, No. 171, Poverty in the United States: 1988 and 1989.

The poverty definition used in the 1990 and 1980 censuses differed slightly from the one used in the 1970 Census. Three technical modifications were made to the definition used in the 1970 Census as described below:

1. The separate thresholds for families with a female householder with no husband present and all other families were eliminated. For the 1980 and 1990 censuses, the weighted average of the poverty thresholds for these two types of families was applied to all types of families, regardless of the sex of the householder.
2. Farm families and farm unrelated individuals no longer had a set of poverty thresholds that were lower than the thresholds applied to non-farm families and unrelated individuals. The farm thresholds were 85 percent of the corresponding levels for non-farm families in the 1970 Census. The same thresholds were applied to all families and unrelated individuals regardless of residence in 1980 and 1990.
3. The thresholds by size of family were extended from seven or more persons in 1970 to nine or more persons in 1980 and 1990.

These changes resulted in a minimal increase in the number of poor at the national level. For a complete discussion of these modifications and their impact, see **The Current Population Reports**, Series P-60, No. 133.

The population covered in the poverty statistics derived from the 1980 and 1990 censuses was essentially the same as in the 1970 Census. The only difference was that in 1980 and 1990, unrelated individuals under 15 years old were excluded from the poverty universe, while in 1970, only those under 14 years old were excluded. The poverty data from the 1960 Census excluded all persons in group quarters and included all unrelated individuals regardless of age. It is unlikely that these differences in population coverage would have had significant impact when comparing the poverty data for persons since the 1960 censuses.

Because of differences in the questionnaires and data collection procedures, estimates of the number of persons below the poverty level by various characteristics from the 1990 Census may differ from those reported in the March 1990 Current Population Survey.

3.4.2.8. Specified Poverty Levels

Because the poverty levels currently in use by the Federal Government do not meet all the needs of data user, some of the data are presented for alternate levels. These specified poverty levels are obtained by multiplying the income cutoffs at the poverty level by the appropriate factor. For example, the average income cutoff at 125 percent of poverty level was \$15,843 (\$12,674 x 1.25) in 1989 for a family of four persons.

3.4.2.9. Weighted Average Thresholds at the Poverty Level

The average thresholds shown in the first column of Table A are weighted by the presence and number of children. For example, the weighted average threshold for a given family size is obtained by multiplying the threshold for each presence and number-of- children category within the given family size by the number of families in that category. These products are then aggregated across the entire range of presence and number of children categories, and the aggregate is divided by the total number of families in the group to yield the weighted average threshold at the poverty level for that family size.

Since the basic thresholds used to determine the poverty status of families and unrelated individuals are applied to all families and unrelated individuals, the weighted average poverty thresholds are derived using all families and unrelated individuals rather than just those classified as being below the poverty level. To obtain the weighted poverty thresholds for families and unrelated individuals below alternate poverty levels,

the weighted thresholds shown in table A may be multiplied directly by the appropriate factor. The weighted average thresholds presented in Table A are based on the March 1990 Current Population Survey. However, these thresholds would not differ significantly from those based on the 1990 Census.

3.4.2.10. Poverty Status of Households in 1989

The data on poverty status of households were derived from answers to the income questions. The income items were asked on a sample basis. Households are classified below the poverty level when the total 1989 income of the family or of the non-family householder is below the appropriate poverty threshold. The income of persons living in the household who are unrelated to the householder is not considered when determining the poverty status of a household, nor does their presence affect the household size in determining the appropriate poverty threshold. The poverty thresholds vary depending upon three criteria: size of family, number of children, and age of the family householder or unrelated individual for one and two-persons households (For more information, see the discussion Of "Poverty Status in 1989" and "Income in 1989" under Population Characteristics.)

3.5. Establishments

3.5.1. Data Sources

3.5.1.1. The Census of Agriculture

The 1987 Census of Agriculture, the latest included in this dataset, is the 23rd taken by the U.S. Bureau of the Census. The first agricultural census was taken in 1840 as part of the sixth decennial census of population. From 1840 to 1950, an agricultural census was taken as part of the decennial census. A separate mid-decade Census of Agriculture was conducted in 1925, 1935, and 1945. From 1954 to 1974, a Census of Agriculture was taken for the years ending in a 4 and 9. In 1976, Congress authorized the Census of Agriculture to be taken for 1978 and 1982 to adjust the data reference year so that it coincided with the economic censuses covering manufacturing, mining, construction, retail trade, wholesale trade, service industries, and selected transportation activities. This adjustment in timing established the Census of Agriculture on a 5-year cycle collecting data for years ending in 2 and 7. The census is conducted primarily by mail, the list of which is comprised of all individuals, businesses, and organizations that could be readily identified as being associated with agriculture.

3.5.1.2. The Census of Manufactures

Since 1947, the Census of Manufactures has covered all establishments as defined in the 1987 and earlier editions of the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual. The SIC Manual defines manufacturing as the mechanical or chemical transformation of inorganic or organic substances into new products. The assembly of component parts of products is also considered to be manufacturing if the resulting product is neither a structure nor other fixed improvement. These activities are usually carried out in plants, factories, or mills that characteristically use power-driven machines and materials-handling equipment.

The Census of Manufactures is conducted on an establishment basis. That is, a company with operations at more than one location is required to submit a report for each location. On the other hand, a company engaged in distinctly different lines of activity at one location is required to submit a separate report for activity if the plant records permit such a separation and if the activities are substantial in size. This census includes information for separately operated administrative offices, warehouses, garages, and other auxiliary units that serve manufacturing establishments of the same company.

In accordance with Federal law governing census reports, no data are published that would disclose the operations of an individual establishment or business.

3.5.1.3. The Surveys of Retail Trade

Retail (and wholesale) trade data were first collected in 1930; in 1933 information on selected service industries was added. These business censuses, as they were called, were again taken for 1935, 1939 (as part of the 1940 decennial program), 1948, 1954, 1958, 1963, and 1967. Since 1967, these censuses have been taken quinquennially (covering years ending in 2 and 7) as part of the Census Bureau's economic census program.

A significant innovation for the 1948 and succeeding censuses was that the classifications were based on the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual. In previous censuses, the Bureau had developed its own classifications after consultation with specialists in Government and the private sector.

The 1987 Census of Retail Trade covered retail trade as defined in the 1987 SIC Manual. It included all establishments primarily engaged in selling merchandise for personal or household consumption and rendering services incidental to the sale of goods. The census excluded governmental organizations classified in the covered industries except for liquor stores operated by State and local governments. Data for direct sellers with no paid employees, post exchanges, ship stores, and similar establishments operated on military posts by agencies of the Federal Government are not included. Establishments that are auxiliary (primary function is providing a service, such as warehouses) to retail establishments within the same organization are not included.

Census of Retail Trade information represents a summary of reports for individual establishments rather than companies. For cases where a census report was received, separate information was obtained for each location where business was conducted. When administrative records of other Federal agencies were used instead of a census report, no information was available on the number of locations operated. Estimates of this number were derived from a sample. Each retail establishment was tabulated according to the physical location at which business was conducted.

Establishments covered by the census were assigned kind-of-business classifications according to the industry classification defined in the 1987 SIC Manual and earlier versions. For 1982 and 1987, data are not shown by kind of business for all establishments, but only for establishments with payroll. In 1977, kind-of business data were available for both types of establishments. Retail trade covers major groups 52 through 59.

The 1977 and 1982 Censuses of Retail Trade were conducted under similar conditions and procedures except for the following:

(1) Geographic areas

The boundaries of a number of areas for which data are shown in the 1982 Census are not the same as in the 1977 Census because of annexations, other boundary changes, redefinitions of SMSA's, and changes in qualifying criteria since 1977.

(2) Nonemployer firms

In 1977, the census included any retail nonemployer firm which reported a sales volume of \$2,500 or more, plus firms in operation for less than the full year that reported sales which, if projected to an annual basis, would have reached a total of \$2,500 or more. In the 1982 Census, nonemployer firms are included if, on an annual basis, they reported a sales volume of at least \$1,000. Had the 1982

criterion been applied in the 1977 Census of Retail Trade, an additional 62,000 non-employers with sales of \$120.6 million would have been included.

(3) Leased departments

In 1977 and prior censuses, data for leased departments were consolidated with the data for stores in which they were located. In the 1982 Census, each leased department was treated as a separate establishment and was classified according to the kind of business it conducted. For detailed information on 1987 Census changes, see the source (U.S. Bureau of the Census).

3.5.1.4. The Survey of Wholesale Trade

The first census of business, which included wholesale trade, was conducted in 1930. Between 1933 and 1963, seven subsequent business censuses were taken (see The Survey of Retail Trade above for specific years.) Beginning with 1967, the economic censuses have been taken at 5-year intervals covering years ending in 2 and 7.

The 1987 Census of Wholesale Trade covered wholesale trade as defined in the 1987 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual. It includes all establishments with one or more paid employees primarily engaged in selling merchandise to retailers; to industrial, commercial, institutional, farm or professional users; or to other wholesalers. Companies selling products to which they have title, as well as those acting as agents or brokers in buying merchandise for or selling merchandise to others, are included. Two major industry groups, durable goods and nondurable goods, are classified in wholesale trade. Their two-digit SIC code numbers are 50 and 51, respectively. The census included wholesale liquor warehouses operated by State and local governments. Excluded were warehouses and other units that serviced or were auxiliary to wholesale establishments within the same organization.

The 1977 and 1982 Censuses were conducted under similar conditions and procedures except for the following:

- (1) The boundaries of a number of areas for which data are shown in the 1982 Census are not the same as in the 1977 Census because of annexations, other boundary changes, redefinitions of SMSA's, and changes in qualifying criteria since 1977.
- (2) The 1977 employment item included three pay-period statistics omitted from the 1982 inquiry: The number of paid employees for the pay period including the 12th of May, August, and November. These statistics are collected and published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- (3) In 1982, inventories were reported at cost or market using generally accepted accounting methods. Inventories calculated on a LIFO basis were reported before the LIFO adjustment. In 1977, inventories were reported by valuation method and summed to a total for each establishment. Method of valuation data are collected by the Bureau of the Census in the Annual Trade Survey.

3.5.1.5. The Survey of Service Industries

Information on selected service industries, which were part of the economic censuses, was first collected in 1933. Between 1933 and 1967, seven subsequent censuses were taken. Since 1967, the census of service industries, as well as the other economic censuses, have been taken at 5-year intervals for years ending in 2 and 7.

The 1987 Census of Service Industries covered service industries as defined in the 1987 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual (see LBR 300-390). For 1982 and 1987, only establishments with some payroll during the year are covered. For previous years, all establishments were covered. The data do not include establishments that are auxiliary (primary function is providing a service, such as warehouses) to

service establishments within the same organization. There are major revisions to the earlier structure which limit the comparability of data between 1982 and 1987 censuses.

The 1977 and 1982 Censuses of Service Industries were conducted under similar conditions and procedures except for the following:

(1) Geographic areas

For discussion, see The Survey of Retail above.

(2) Non-employer firms

For discussion, see The Survey of Retail above.

(3) Scope

Some industries covered in the 1977 Census were not covered for 1982: SIC's 806 (Hospitals), 821 (Elementary and secondary schools), 822 (Colleges, universities, professional schools, and junior colleges), 863 (labor unions and similar labor organizations), and 865 (political organizations). SIC 4722 (Arrangement of passenger transportation) was covered in 1982 under the Census of Transportation, not service industries.

(4) Federal income tax status/kind-of-business combinations

In 1977, a few kinds of business were assumed to be exempt from Federal income tax and were tabulated in the tax-exempt category. Establishments of firms that were exempt from Federal income tax, but which were in a kind of business not expected to be exempt, were tabulated in a miscellaneous kind-of-business category. For 1982, the same kinds of business are definitionally considered exempt from Federal income tax and tabulated in the tax-exempt category; the remaining kinds of business are definitionally considered subject to Federal income tax. The miscellaneous kind-of-business category has been eliminated.

3.5.2. Selected Terms

3.5.2.1. Apparel (and Accessory) (Retail)

Apparel (and accessory) stores (SIC Major Group 56) include retail stores primarily engaged in selling clothing of all kinds and related articles for personal wear and adornment. Not included are establishments that meet the criteria for department stores or miscellaneous general merchandise stores even though most of their receipts are from the sale of apparel and apparel accessories. They consist of men's and boys' clothing and furnishings stores; women's ready-to-wear stores; women's accessory and specialty stores; children's and infants' wear stores; family clothing stores; men's, women's, children's and juveniles', and family shoe stores; furriers and fur shops; and establishments primarily engaged in the retail sale of lines of apparel and accessories not elsewhere classified, such as uniforms, bathing suits, raincoats, riding apparel, sports apparel, umbrellas, wigs, and toupees. Also included are custom tailors primarily engaged in making and selling men's and women's clothing (except fur apparel) to individual order.

3.5.2.2. Automotive Dealers (Retail)

Automotive dealers excluding gasoline service stations (SIC Major Group 55 less SIC 554) are retail dealers selling new and used automobiles, boats, recreational vehicles and utility trailers, and motorcycles and mopeds, and dealers selling new automobile parts and accessories. They include establishments dealing exclusively in used automobiles, but not establishments dealing exclusively in used parts. Also included are automobile repair shops maintained by establishments engaged in the sale of new automobiles. Automotive distributors, the greater part of whose sales are to dealers or to institutional or industrial users, are classified in wholesale trade.

3.5.2.3. Eating and Drinking (Retail)

Eating and drinking places (SIC Major Group 58) include retail establishments selling prepared food and drinks for consumption on the premises; they also include lunch counters and refreshment stands selling prepared foods and drinks for immediate consumption. They consist of restaurants and lunchrooms, social caterers, cafeterias, refreshment places, contract feeding, ice cream and frozen custard stands, and drinking places (alcoholic beverages).

3.5.2.4. Employers (Manufacturing)

The all employees number is the average number of production workers plus the number of other employees in mid-March. Included are all persons on paid sick leave, paid holidays, and paid vacations during the pay period. Officers of corporations are included as employees; proprietors and partners of unincorporated firms are excluded.

3.5.2.5. Establishment

An establishment is a single physical location at which business is conducted. It is not necessarily identical with a company or enterprise, which may consist of one or more establishments. The count of establishments for 1987 represents the number in business at any time during the year. For prior censuses, the count represents the number of establishments in business at the end of the year.

When two or more activities were carried on at a single location under a single ownership, all activities generally were grouped together as a single establishment. The entire establishment was classified on the basis of its major activity, and all data for it were included in that classification. However, when distinct and separate economic activities (for which different industry classification codes were appropriate) were conducted under the same ownership at a single location, and when conditions prescribed by the SIC Manual for recognizing the existence of more than one establishment were met, separate establishment reports for each of the different activities were obtained in the census.

3.5.2.6. Farm

Since 1850, when minimum criteria defining a farm for census purposes first were established, the farm definition has been changed nine times. The current definition, first used for the 1974 Census, is any place from which \$1,000 or more of agricultural products were produced and sold or normally would have been sold during the census year.

3.5.2.7. Food (Retail)

Food stores (SIC Major Group 54) are establishments primarily engaged in selling food for home preparation and consumption. They include grocery stores; meat and fish (seafood) markets; fruit stores and vegetable markets; candy, nut, and confectionery stores; dairy products stores; retail bakeries; and establishments primarily engaged in the retail sale of specialized foods not elsewhere classified, such as eggs and poultry, health foods, spices, herbs, coffee, and tea.

3.5.2.8. Home Furnishings (and Furniture) (Retail)

Furniture and home furnishings stores (SIC Major Group 57) include retail stores selling goods used for furnishing the home, such as furniture, floor coverings, draperies, glass and chinaware, domestic stoves, refrigerators, and household electrical and gas appliances. Establishments selling electrical and gas appliances are included in this group only if the major part of their sales consists of articles for home use. Dealers primarily engaged in selling antique and second-hand furniture are classified in miscellaneous retail stores (SIC Major Group 59). Stores primarily engaged in selling merchandise but also providing an interior

decorating service are classified according to the merchandise handled. Interior designers primarily engaged in advising clients on the selection of interior decorations are classified in service industries.

3.5.2.9. Gasoline Service (Retail)

Gasoline service stations (SIC 554) are establishments primarily engaged in selling gasoline and automotive lubricants. Usually these establishments also sell tires, batteries, and accessories, and perform minor repair work and services. Establishments called garages but deriving more than half of their receipts from the sale of gasoline and automotive lubricants are included.

3.5.1.10. General Merchandise (Retail)

General merchandise stores (SIC Major Group 53) include retail stores that sell a number of lines of merchandise, such as dry goods, apparel and accessories, furniture and home furnishings, small wares, hardware, and food. The stores included in this group are known as department stores, variety stores, general merchandise stores, general stores, etc. Establishments primarily engaged in selling used general merchandise and those selling general merchandise by mail, vending machine, or direct selling are classified in miscellaneous retail stores (SIC Major Group 59).

3.5.1.11. Land in Farms

The acreage designated as "land in farms" consists primarily of agricultural land used for crops, pasture, or grazing. It also includes woodland and wasteland not actually under cultivation or used for pasture or grazing, provided it was part of the farm operator's total operation.

Land in farms is an operating-unit concept and includes land owned and operated, as well as land rented from others. Land used rent free was to be reported as land rented from others. Land rented or assigned to a tenant was considered the tenant's farm and not the owner's. All land in Indian reservations used for growing crops or grazing livestock was to be included as land in farms.

With few exceptions, the land in each farm was tabulated as being in the operator's principal county. The principal county was defined as the one where the largest value of agricultural products were raised or produced. It was usually the county containing all or the largest proportion of the land in the farm. For a limited number of Western States, this procedure resulted in the allocation of more land in farms to a county than the total land area of the county. To minimize this distortion, separate reports were required for large farms, identified from the 1974 Census and prior special surveys as having more than one separately reportable farm unit. Other reports showing land in more than one county were separated into two or more reports if the data would significantly affect the county totals. These reports were assigned to the appropriate counties during office processing.

Farmland as a percent of total land is based on the approximate total land area of counties.

3.5.2.12. Paid Employees (Retail/Wholesale/Service)

Paid employees consist of the full-time and part-time employees, including salaried officers and executives of corporations, who were on the payroll in the pay period including March 12. Included are employees on paid sick leave, paid holidays, and paid vacations; not included are proprietors and partners of unincorporated businesses.

3.5.2.13. Unincorporated Businesses (Retail)

Figures for establishments operated by unincorporated businesses represent the number of retail establishments that were unincorporated as defined by law. In 1982, the legal form of organization for firms in the mail universe was based on the response to the organization status inquiry on the various census forms.

The legal form of organization of non-mail firms was generally based on information available from the administrative records from other Federal agencies.

3.5.2.14. Value of Farm Products Sold

The value of farm products sold by farms represents the gross market value before taxes and production expenses of an agricultural products sold or removed from the place, regardless of who received the payment. It includes sales by the operator as well as the value of any shares received by partners, landlords, contractors, and others associated with the operation. It represents the sum of all crops, including nursery products sold and livestock and poultry and their products sold. It excludes income from farm-related sources such as custom work or agricultural service, income from non-farm sources, and sales of forest products from farms and ranches. The value of agricultural products sold was collected from all operators. Where the operator failed to report a value of sales, estimates were made based on the amount of crops harvested or the number of livestock or poultry sold. Extensive estimation was required for farmers growing crops and livestock under contract.

The value of crops sold for a year does not necessarily represent the sales from crops harvested that year. The data include sales from crops produced in earlier years and exclude some crops produced that year but held in storage and not sold. For crops sold through a co-op that made payments in several installments, only the amount received that year was to be reported.

3.6. Government Finance and Employment

3.6.1. Data Sources

3.6.1.1. The Census of Governments

Data on local governments are based on results of the Census of Governments. During the period 1850 to 1942, the census was taken at approximately 10-year intervals. The Census of Governments for the year 1957 was the first census taken after 1942. Information on county areas (explained below) are not available from the 1942 Census. Therefore, this dataset includes information after the 1957 census. The data were obtained primarily by mail canvass.

Beginning with 1957, the census has been conducted by the Bureau every fifth year (for years ending in 2 and 7). For each county area, the financial data comprise amounts for all local governments; not only the county government but also any municipalities, townships, school districts, and special districts within the county. Data from governmental units located in two or more county areas are assigned to the county area containing the administrative office.

The original universe of the 1987 Census of Government consists of the Federal Government, the 50 State governments, and the 82,934 local governments in existence as of October 1987 (3,042 counties; 19,227 municipalities; 16,685 townships; 29,270 special districts; and 14,710 school districts). The universe of other government censuses is similar to that of the 1987 Census with the actual number of local government slightly varying from census to census.

The concepts, categories and terms applied in each census round from which data are assembled is reasonably comparable. However, the data on total expenditure in particular (and total direct expenditure to a lesser degree) turned out to be very problematic, and are included in this dataset only as references (for detail, see the section on expenditure below).

In addition, changes in the level or type of government providing particular services occur over time. Thus, for example, a decrease in employment for a particular function of a government does not, in and of itself, signify a diminution of services the population receives. Moreover, certain services may be "contracted

out" and the contractor's employees are not counted as employees of the contracting government. Also, annexations, other boundary changes, consolidations of governmental entities, and changes in the demographic makeup of the area served may affect not only the number of persons for whom services must be provided, but also the nature and scope of the necessary services.

3.6.1.2. Comparability of Data

The data on total expenditure, total direct expenditure, intergovernmental expenditure and total direct general expenditure for the county area are all available, and believed to be accurate, for the year 1982 and 1987. Prior to 1982, the information about total expenditure and total direct expenditure becomes less reliable because:

For 1977, total direct expenditure and total expenditure are not available from the published Census of Government volume. They are derived by summing the appropriate expenditure categories in the data tape. However, the data on intergovernmental expenditure (which comprises the total expenditure) in the census publication does not agree with the result of our computations based on the data in the data tape (ICPSR 8118). Since the same method of calculation are used for computing the 1982 and 1987 data, the discrepancy suggests that either the published data have errors, or items included under intergovernmental expenditure have changed between 1977 and 1982. We were unable to identify the source of these errors. Consequently, the total expenditure, which is a sum of total direct expenditure and intergovernmental expenditure, is less reliable. It is shown here only as a reference.

For 1972, the data on intergovernmental expenditure are not available from the published Census of Government volumes. Although they are included in the data tape (ICPSR 0069), there is no way to check the accuracy of the total expenditure derived using the data in the data tape since the intergovernmental expenditure (and total expenditure) data are not published. The comparison of the difference between total expenditure and total direct general expenditure for the period 1972-1987 suggests that total expenditure for 1972 may be substantially underestimated.

For 1962, no data on intergovernmental data (and thus, total expenditure) are available either from published sources or in a data tape (ICPSR 0017). Thus it is not possible to derive data on total expenditure. Furthermore, since no information is available on utility expenditure other than water (there should be expenditure on gas, electricity and transit), government-run liquor store and insurance trust (or retirement system), we could not derive data on total direct expenditure.

The 1957 data, in comparison with the 1962, 1972, and 1977, are actually more comparable with the 1982 and 1987 dataset. Both utility expenditure from all sources and intergovernmental expenditure are available. However, since the data on government-run liquor store and insurance trust (or retirement system) are not available, total direct expenditure and total expenditure data may be underestimated.

In conclusion, the most consistently available, and probably accurate figure representing the overall spending level of the county area for the periods 1957-1987 is total direct general expenditure, which is a sum of all function (for detail, see below). Total direct general expenditure comprises about 85% of total expenditure, judging from the 1982 and 1987 datasets.

3.6.2. Selected Terms: Government Revenue

3.6.2.1. Total Revenue

Total revenue refers to all amounts received by a government from external sources, that is, total intergovernmental revenue, general revenue from own sources, utility and liquor and insurance trust revenue-net of refunds and other correcting transactions excluding revenue from issuance of debt, liquidation of

investments, and as agency and private trust transactions. Note that revenue excludes noncash transactions such as receipt of services, commodities, or other "receipts in kind."

3.6.2.2. Total General Revenue

Total general revenue refers to all government revenue except utility revenue, liquor store revenue, and employee retirement and other insurance trust revenue. The basis for distinction is not the fund or administrative unit receiving particular amounts, but rather the nature of the revenue sources concerned.

3.6.2.3. Total General Revenue From Own Sources

Total general revenue from own sources includes all government revenue from taxes, charges and other miscellaneous general revenue. It excludes intergovernmental revenue, utility revenue, liquor store revenue, and employee retirement and other insurance trust revenue.

3.6.2.4. Current Charges

Current charges are the amounts received from the public for performance of specific services benefiting the person charged, and from sales of commodities and services except by government utilities and liquor stores. They include fees, assessments, and other reimbursements for current services, rents and sales derived from commodities or services furnished incident to the performance of particular functions, gross income of commercial activities, and the like. They exclude amounts received from other governments (see Intergovernmental Revenue) and interdepartmental charges and transfers. Current charges are distinguished from license taxes, which relate to privileges granted by the government or regulatory measures for the protection of the public.

3.6.2.5. Insurance Trust System

Insurance trust system is a government-administered program for employee retirement and social insurance protection relating to unemployment compensation, workmen's compensation, old age, survivors', disability, and health insurance, and the like.

3.6.2.6. Insurance Trust Revenue

Insurance trust revenue comprises amounts from contributions required of employers and employees for financing these social insurance programs and earnings on assets of such systems.

3.6.2.7. Intergovernmental Revenue

Intergovernmental revenue refers to amounts received from other governments as fiscal aid in the form of shared revenues and grants-in-aid, as reimbursements for performance of general government functions and specific services for the paying government (e.g., care of prisoners or contractual research) or in lieu of taxes. Excludes amounts received from other governments for sale of property, commodities, and utility services. All intergovernmental revenue is classified as general revenue.

Total intergovernmental revenue. This term includes intergovernmental revenue from federal and state government.

Intergovernmental revenue from federal government: Intergovernmental revenue received by a government directly from the Federal Government. For local governments excludes Federal aid channeled through state governments.

Intergovernmental revenue from state government: All intergovernmental revenue received from the state government, including amounts originally from the Federal Government but channeled through the state.

Intergovernmental revenue for general local government support: Fiscal aid revenue that allows the receiving government unrestricted use as to function or purpose.

3.6.2.8. Liquor Store Revenue

Amounts received from sale of liquor by government liquor stores and other revenues from government liquor store operations. Excludes any taxes collected by government liquor monopoly systems.

3.6.2.9. Miscellaneous Commercial Activities

Miscellaneous commercial activities are provision and operation of commercial facilities not classified under particular functions. Includes only activities owned by the government concerned. Typical examples are markets, cemeteries, and disaster insurance systems.

3.6.2.10. Taxes

Taxes are compulsory contributions exacted by a government for public purposes, except employee and employer assessments for retirement and social insurance purposes, which are classified as insurance trust revenue. All tax revenue is classified as general revenue and comprises amounts received (including interest and penalties but excluding protested amounts and refunds) from all taxes imposed by a government. Note that local government tax revenue excludes any amounts from shares of state-imposed and collected taxes which are classified as intergovernmental Revenue. The taxes included in the tabulation are:

Corporation Net Income Taxes

Death and Gift Taxes

Individual Income Taxes

License Taxes

Property Taxes

Property Tax Relief

Sales and Gross Receipts Taxes

General Sales or Gross Receipts Taxes

Selective Sales and Gross Receipts Taxes

Severance Taxes

Property taxes. Property taxes are taxes conditioned on ownership of property and measured by its value. They include general property taxes related to property as a whole, real and personal, tangible or intangible, whether taxed at a single rate or at classified rates, and taxes on selected types of property, such as motor vehicles or certain or all intangibles.

3.6.2.11. Utility

A government owned and operated water supply, electric light and power, gas supply or transit system. Government revenue, expenditure, and debt relating to utility facilities leased to other governments or persons, and other commercial type activities of governments, such as port facilities, airports, housing projects, radio stations, steam plants, ferries, abattoirs, etc., are classified as general government activities.

Electric power: Operation and maintenance of electric power system including production or acquisition and distribution of electric power.

Gas supply: Operation and maintenance of gas supply systems including acquisition and distribution of natural gas.

Water supply: Operation and maintenance of water supply system including acquisition and distribution of water to the general public or to other local governments for domestic or industrial use. Acquisition and distribution of water for irrigation of agricultural lands are classified under Natural Resources.

3.6.2.12. Utility Revenue

This refers to revenue from sale of utility commodities and services to the public and to other governments. Does not include amounts from sales to the parent government. It also excludes income from utility fund investments and from other non-operating properties (treated as general revenue). Any revenue from taxes, special assessments, and intergovernmental aid is classified as general revenue, not utility revenue.

3.6.3. Selected Terms: Government Expenditure

3.6.3.1. Cash Assistance (See Public Welfare, Sections 3.6.3.21 and 3.6.5.15)

3.6.3.2. Correction

This refers to confinement and correction of adults and minors convicted of offenses against the law, and pardon, probation, and parole activities.

3.6.3.3. Education

Education is defined as the provision or support of schools and facilities for elementary and secondary, higher, and other education. Elementary and Secondary Education includes the provision of public kindergarten through high school education by state and local governments.

It encompasses instructional, support, and auxiliary services (school lunch, student activities, and community services) offered by public school systems revenues and expenditures for enterprise activities are included on a gross basis. Higher Education consists of all state and local institutions of higher education.

It excludes agricultural experiment stations and agricultural extension services (included under Natural Resources), university-operated hospitals (included under Hospitals), and scholarship and fellowship payments (included under Other Education).

Other Education includes all federal Government educational activities with the exception of service academies (which are classified as part of national defense and international relations), state government administrative supervision of elementary and secondary and higher education, scholarship and fellowship payments, aid to private schools, and support of special schools for deaf, blind, and other handicapped persons.

3.6.3.4. Expenditure

Expenditure refers to all amounts of money paid out by a government--net of recoveries and other correcting transactions--other than for retirement of debt, investment in securities, extension of credit, or as agency transactions. Note that expenditure includes only external transactions of a government and excludes noncash transactions such as the provision of perquisites or other payments in kind.

Total expenditure: Total direct expenditure plus intergovernmental expenditure.

Total direct expenditure: Total direct general expenditure plus utility expenditure, liquor stores expenditure, and employee-retirement or other insurance trust expenditure. This item includes payments to employees, suppliers, contractors, beneficiaries and other final recipients of government payments.

Total direct general expenditure: All government expenditure other than the specially enumerated kinds of expenditure classified as utility expenditure, liquor stores expenditure, and employee-retirement or other insurance trust expenditure.

Intergovernmental expenditure: Amounts paid to other governments as fiscal aid in the form of shared revenues and grants-in-aid, as reimbursements for performance of general government activities and for specific services for the paying government, or in lieu of taxes. Excludes amounts paid to other governments for purchase of commodities, property, or utility services, any tax imposed and paid as such, and employer contributions for social insurance-e.g., contributions to the federal government for Old-Age, Survivors' Disability, and Health Insurance for government employees. All intergovernmental expenditure is classified as general expenditure.

3.6.3.5. Financial Administration

Financial administration includes officials and agencies concerned with tax assessment and collection, accounting, auditing, budgeting, purchasing, custody of funds, and other central finance activities.

3.6.3.6. Fire Protection

Fire protection consists of fire fighting organization and auxiliary services; fire inspection and investigation; support of volunteer fire forces; and other fire prevention activities. Includes cost of fire fighting facilities, such as fire hydrants and water, furnished by other agencies of the government.

3.6.3.7. Health

This term refers to out-patient health services, other than hospital care, including: public health administration; research and education; categorical health programs; treatment and immunization clinics; nursing; environmental health activities such as air and water pollution control; ambulance service if provided separately from fire protection services; and other general public health activities such as mosquito abatement. School health services provided by health agencies (rather than school agencies) are included here. Sewage treatment operations are classified under Sewerage.

3.6.3.8. Hospitals

The definition of hospitals includes financing, construction, acquisition, maintenance or operation of hospital facilities, provision of hospital care, and support of public or private hospitals. It includes expenditures by public hospitals under welfare programs for medical assistance such as medicaid. However, see Public Welfare (Section 3.6.3.21) concerning vendor payments under welfare programs

3.6.3.9. Housing and Community (Urban) Development

This category refers to construction and operation of housing and redevelopment projects, and other activities to promote or aid housing and community development.

3.6.3.10. Insurance Trust Expenditure

This term corresponds with the character and object category, insurance benefits and repayments, and comprises only cash payments to beneficiaries (including withdrawals of contributions). These categories exclude costs of administering insurance trust systems, which are classed as general expenditure. Insurance trust revenue and expenditure do not include any contributions of a government to a system it administers. Any amounts paid by a government as employer contributions to an insurance trust system administered by another government are classed as general expenditure for current operation, and as insurance trust revenue of the particular system and receiving government.

Insurance benefits and repayments: Social insurance payments to beneficiaries, employee-retirement annuities and other benefits, and withdrawals of insurance or employee-retirement contributions. Includes only amounts paid to beneficiaries; administrative expenditure for such activities are classified as Current Operation.

3.6.3.11. Interest Expenditure (Interest on General Debt)

This is the amount paid for the use of borrowed money. Interest on utility debt is included in Utility Expenditures.

3.6.3.12. Libraries

This term refers to establishment and operation of public libraries and support of privately operated libraries (excludes those operated as part of a school system, primarily for the benefit of students and teachers, and law libraries).

3.6.3.13. Liquor Store Expenditure

This is defined as expenditures for purchase of liquor for resale and provision and operation of liquor stores. It excludes expenditure for law enforcement and licensing activities carried out in conjunction with liquor store operations.

3.6.3.14. Natural Resources

Natural resources include conservation, promotion, and development of natural resources, such as soil, water, forests, minerals, and wildlife. Includes irrigation, drainage, flood control, forestry and forest fire protection, soil reclamation, soil and water conservation, fish and game programs, and agricultural fairs. For the Federal Government, includes agricultural experiment stations and extension services, farm price stabilization programs, farm insurance and credit activities, and multipurpose power and reclamation projects.

3.6.3.15. N.E.C. (Not elsewhere classified)

3.6.3.16. Other Governmental Administration

This includes the functions of judicial and legal, and general public buildings; and activities of the governing body, office of the chief executive, and central staff services and agencies concerned with personnel administration, recording, planning, zoning, and the like.

General public buildings (state-local): Provision and maintenance of public buildings not allocated to particular functions. This category is not applied in reporting federal data.

Judicial and legal: Courts and activities associated with courts including law libraries, prosecutorial and defendant programs, probate functions, and juries.

3.6.3.17. Own Hospitals (See Hospitals, Section 3.6.3.8)

3.6.3.18. Parks and Recreation

Provision and support of recreational and cultural-scientific facilities and activities including golf courses, play fields, playgrounds, public beaches, swimming pools, tennis courts, parks, auditoriums, stadiums, auto camps, recreation piers, marinas, botanical gardens, galleries, museums, and zoos. It also includes building and operation of convention centers and exhibition halls.

3.6.3.19. Police Protection

Police protection refers to preservation of law and order and traffic safety, including police patrols and communications, crime prevention activities, detention and custody of persons awaiting trial, traffic safety and vehicular inspection.

3.6.3.20. Protective Inspection and Regulation

Regulation of private enterprise for the protection of the public and inspection of hazardous activities except for major functions, such as fire prevention, health, natural resources, etc. Distinctive licensing collection activities are classified under Financial Administration.

3.6.3.21. Public Welfare

Support of, and assistance to, needy persons contingent upon their need. It excludes pensions to former employees and other benefits not contingent on need. Expenditures under this heading include cash assistance paid directly to needy persons under the federal categorical programs (Supplemental Security Income and Age Assistance Aid to Families With Dependent Children) and under any other welfare programs; Vendor Payments made directly to private purveyors for medical care, burials, and other commodities and services provided under welfare programs; and provision and operation by the government of welfare institutions. Other public welfare includes payments to other governments for welfare purposes, amounts for administration, support of private welfare agencies, and other public welfare services. Health and hospital services including those under public welfare programs like medicaid, provided directly by the government through its own hospitals and health agencies, and any payments to other governments for such purposes are classed under those functional headings rather than here.

Sanitation other than sewerage: Street cleaning, solid waste collection and disposal, and provision of sanitary landfills.

3.6.3.22. Securities

Stocks and bonds, notes, mortgages, and other formal evidences of indebtedness.

3.6.3.23. Sewerage

Provision of sanitary and storm sewers and sewage disposal facilities and services, and payments to other governments for such purposes.

3.6.3.24. Transportation

Comprises the functions of highways, air transportation, parking facilities, water transport and terminals, and transit subsidies.

Air transportation: Construction, maintenance, operation, and support of airport facilities, assistance and subsidies. Cash contributions and subsidies to persons and foreign governments, not in payment for goods or services or for claims against the government. For local governments, this object category comprises only direct Cash Assistance Payments to public welfare recipients. For states, it includes also veterans' bonuses and direct cash grants for tuition, scholarships, and aid to nonpublic educational institutions. Major federal subsidy payments are for veterans' benefits, agricultural support programs, and foreign aid.

Highways: Construction, maintenance, and operation of highways, streets, and related structures, including toll highways, bridges, tunnels, ferries, street lighting and snow and ice removal. However, highway policing and traffic control are classed under Police Protection.

Parking facilities: Construction, purchase, maintenance, and operation of public-use parking lots, garages, parking meters, and other distinctive parking facilities on a commercial basis. Applies only to local governments.

Water transport and terminals: Construction, maintenance, operation, and support of canals and other waterways, harbors, docks, wharves, and related marine terminal facilities.

Transit subsidies: Payments in support of subway, bus, surface rail and street railroad, and other passenger transportation systems, including public support of a private utility or railroad and intergovernmental subsidy payments. Excludes amounts paid by a parent government to its dependent transit utility. Also see under Utility.

3.6.3.25. Utility Expenditure

Expenditure for construction of utility facilities or equipment, for production and distribution of utility commodities and services (except those furnished to parent government), and for interest on utility debt. It does not include expenditure in connection with administration of utility debt and investments (treated as general expenditure) and the cost of providing services to the parent government (such costs, when identifiable, are treated as expenditure for the function served).

3.6.3.26. Vendor Payments (See Public Welfare, Section 3.6.3.21)

3.6.4. Selected Terms: Government Debt

3.6.4.1. Debt

All long-term credit obligations of the government and its agencies whether backed by the government's full faith and credit or nonguaranteed, and all interest-bearing short-term credit obligations. It includes judgments, mortgages, and revenue bonds as well as general obligation bonds, notes, and interest-bearing warrants. Excludes noninterest-bearing short-term obligations, interfund obligations, amounts owed in a trust or agency capacity, advances and contingent loans from other governments, and rights of individuals to benefits from government-administered employee retirement funds. Refunding of Long-Term Debt is the issuance of long-term obligations in exchange for, or to finance the retirement of, outstanding long-term debt, generally to obtain more favorable interest rates.

Long-term debt: Debt payable more than 1 year after date of issue

Short-term debt: Interest-bearing debt payable within 1 year from date of issue, such as bond anticipation notes, bank loans, and tax anticipation notes and warrants, Includes obligations having no fixed maturity date if payable from a tax levied for collection in the year of their issuance.

Utility debt: Debt originally issued specifically to finance government owned and operated water, electric, gas, or transit utility facilities.

3.6.5. Selected Terms: Government Employment

3.6.5.1. Correction

Activities pertaining to the confinement and correction of adults and minors convicted of criminal offenses. Pardon, probation, and parole activities are also included here.

3.6.5.2. Education

Elementary and secondary education: All activities associated with the operation of public elementary and secondary schools and locally operated vocational-technical schools. Special education programs operated by elementary and secondary school systems are also included as are all ancillary services associated with the operation of schools, such as pupil transportation and food service.

Higher education: State and local government degree granting institutions which provide academic training above grade 12. Instructional employees includes persons engaged in teaching and related academic research.

Instructional employees: Instructional employees includes not only classroom teachers, but also principals, supervisors of instruction, librarians, teacher aides, library aides, and guidance and psychological personnel. Other employees includes all persons not included as instructional employees (e.g., school superintendents and other administrative personnel clerical and secretarial staffs, plant operation and maintenance personnel health and recreation employees, transportation and food service personnel and any student employees).

3.6.5.3. Employment and Employers

Employment refers to all persons gainfully employed by and performing services for a government. Employees include all persons paid for personal services performed, including persons paid from federally funded programs; paid elected officials; persons in paid leave status; and persons paid on a per meeting, annual, semiannual, or quarterly basis. Unpaid officials, pensioners, persons whose work is performed on a fee basis, and contractors and their employees are excluded from the count of employees.

Full-time employment. Full-time employees are defined to include those persons whose hours of work represent full-time employment in their employer government; part-time employees are those persons who work less than the standard number of hours for full-time work in their employer government.

Full-time equivalent employment. This is a computed statistic representing the number of full-time employees that could have been employed if the reported number of hours worked by part-time employees had been worked by full-time employees. This statistic is calculated separately for each function of a government by dividing the "part-time hours paid" by the standard number of hours for full-time employees in the particular government and then adding the resulting quotient to the number of full-time employees.

3.6.5.4. Financial Administration

This includes activities concerned with tax assessment and collection, custody and disbursement of funds, debt management, administration of trust funds, budgeting, and other government wide financial management activities. This function is not applied to school district or special district governments.

3.6.5.5. Fire Protection

Fire protection applies to local government fire protection and prevention activities plus any ambulance, rescue, or other auxiliary services provided by the fire protection agency. Volunteer fire fighters, if remunerated for their services on a "per fire" or some other basis, are included as part-time employees. The subcategory of fire fighters includes personnel trained and/or engaged in fire suppression and prevention.

3.6.5.6. Health

Health includes the following services: Administration of public health programs, community and visiting nurse services, immunization programs, drug abuse rehabilitation programs, health and food inspection activities, operation of outpatient clinics, and environmental pollution control activities.

3.6.5.7. Hospitals

This category includes only government-operated medical care facilities which provide inpatient care. Employees and payrolls of private corporations which lease and/or operate government-owned hospital facilities are excluded.

3.6.5.8. Housing and Community Development (Urban Renewal)

This category refers to the operation of housing and redevelopment projects and other activities to promote or aid housing and community development.

3.6.5.9. Judicial and Legal

The judicial and legal categories includes all court and court related activities (except probation and parole activities which are included in the "Correction" category), court activities of sheriffs offices, prosecuting attorneys and public defender's offices, legal departments, and attorneys providing government wide legal service.

3.6.5.10. Libraries

This category applies only to libraries operated by local governments for use by the general public. School and law libraries are included in the "Elementary and secondary education" or "Higher education," and "Judicial and legal" categories, respectively.

3.6.5.11. Natural Resources

These are activities primarily concerned with the conservation and development of natural resources, forest fire prevention and control, flood control, irrigation, drainage, land and forest reclamation, fish and game preservation and control, soil conservation, forestry, agricultural fairs and research, agricultural development and inspection, and mineral resources activities.

3.6.5.12. Other and Unallocatable

This classification represents all activities not individually specified.

3.6.5.13. Other Government Administration

Other government administration applies to the legislative and government wide administrative agencies of governments. Included here are overall planning and zoning activities, central personnel and administrative activities. This function is not applied to school district or special district governments.

3.6.5.14. Police Protection

This category comprises all activities concerned with the enforcement of law and order, including coroner's offices, police training academies, investigation bureaus, and local jails, "lockups," or other detention facilities not intended to serve as correctional facilities. The subcategory of police officers includes only persons with the power of arrest.

3.6.5.15. Public Welfare

Included in this category are such activities as the administration of various public assistance programs for the needy, operation of homes for the elderly, indigent care institutions, and programs that provide payments for medical care and other services for the needy. Health care and hospital services provided directly by a government, however, are included in the "Health" and "Hospital" functions rather than here.

3.6.5.16. Sanitation Other than Sewerage

Refuse collection and disposal, operation of sanitary landfills, and street cleaning activities are included in this category.

3.6.5.17. Sewerage

Sewerage refers to the provision, maintenance, and operation of sanitary and storm sewer systems and sewage disposal and treatment facilities.

3.6.5.18. Social Insurance Administration

The administration and conduct of social insurance programs include unemployment compensation and worker compensation programs, work/study programs, and determination of eligibility for federal old age, survivors, disability, and health insurance (social security). Federal activities in this category are primarily those performed by the social security administration and the pension benefit Guarantee Corporation.

3.6.5.19. Transportation

Air transportation: Operation and support of publicly operated airport facilities.

Highways: Activities associated with the maintenance and operation of streets, roads, sidewalks, bridges, tunnels, toll roads, and ferries are included at this function. Snow and ice removal, street lighting, and highway and traffic engineering activities are also included here.

Parks and recreation: Government activities that include operation and maintenance of parks, playgrounds, swimming pools, public beaches, auditoriums, public golf courses, museums, marinas, botanical gardens, and zoological parks.

Water transport and terminals: Activities which are connected with the operation and support of canals and other waterways, harbors, docks, wharves, and other related marine terminal facilities.

3.6.5.20. Utilities

Electric power: Activities associated with the production or acquisition and distribution of electric power.

Gas supply: Government activities associated with the acquisition of gas supplies and distribution to individual consumers.

Water supply: Activities associated with the production or acquisition of water and distribution to the public.

As a bureau of the Department of the Interior, the Minerals Management Service's (MMS) primary responsibilities are to manage the mineral resources located on the Nation's Outer Continental Shelf (OCS), collect revenue from the Federal OCS and onshore Federal and Indian lands, and distribute those revenues.

Moreover, in working to meet its responsibilities, the **Offshore Minerals Management Program** administers the OCS competitive leasing program and oversees the safe and environmentally sound exploration and production of our Nation's offshore natural gas, oil and other mineral resources. The MMS **Minerals Revenue Management** meets its responsibilities by ensuring the efficient, timely and accurate collection and disbursement of revenue from mineral leasing and production due to Indian tribes and allottees, States and the U.S. Treasury.

The MMS strives to fulfill its responsibilities through the general guiding principles of: (1) being responsive to the public's concerns and interests by maintaining a dialogue with all potentially affected parties and (2) carrying out its programs with an emphasis on working to enhance the quality of life for all Americans by lending MMS assistance and expertise to economic development and environmental protection.
