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Executive Summary

The National Park Service (NPS)-Chihuahuan Desert Network (CHDN) and Amistad National Recreation Area (AMIS and NRA), with the assistance of the National Vegetation Inventory Program (NVIP) staff, are preparing to conduct vegetation classification plot sampling in support of creating a vegetation map and geodatabase beginning in spring 2011. As part of study plan (NPS-AMIS 2010) preparation, a preliminary list of 23 ecological systems and component vegetation alliances and plant associations was prepared, primarily from botanical field work conducted by Dr. Jackie Poole in 2004 and the NatureServe Explorer Web site (2010), then vetted by the AMIS species list generated primarily by Dr. Richard Worthington (2002) and Dr. Jackie Poole (2004) to inform the field crews, improve planning decisions, and generate cost estimates for project tasks.

The purpose of Task 3.0: Vegetation Classification List Update for AMIS, is to refine and, when appropriate, update the preliminary classification list of vegetation occurring within AMIS to the vegetation alliance and plant association levels of the National Vegetation Classification (NVC) maintained by NatureServe. The sources of new information include the legacy data evaluated under Task 1.0 of this project, and discussions with researchers sampling classification data on-park.

The plant species list provided by (NPS-CHDN) Biological Science Technician Missy Powell numbered 873 species and varieties (NPS-AMIS 2010) and, with more than 15 legacy research projects evaluated under Task 1.0 of this project, formed the basis for selecting and updating potential vegetation alliances and plant associations occurring within AMIS. The entire updated list presented in tabular form by physiognomic types presents 82 vegetation alliances and 102 plant associations that potentially occur in AMIS. In addition, 52 provisional plant communities described by Poole (2004) are included in this classification list to alert field researchers that previously undescribed communities may be present and should be sampled. There are 15 potential forest and woodland alliances comprising 24 potential associations and 8 provisional plant communities; 33 potential shrubland, dwarf-shrubland, and shrub herbaceous alliances comprising 53 potential associations and 32 provisional plant communities; and 34 potential herbaceous and sparse alliances comprising 25 potential associations and 12 provisional plant communities. As deemed appropriate from the NVC and from legacy research, semi-natural vegetation types characterized by nonnative plant species were included in this classification (representing 10 vegetation alliances and 11 plant associations).

This vegetation classification list will be invaluable as a guidance tool for field crews to apply provisional names to vegetation stands sampled in the field with classification plots, prior to formal classification using statistical analyses. By reviewing this classification list, field crews will also be able to determine when they have encountered a previously undescribed vegetation type. A structured alliance/association list also allows field crews to tally classification plot and observation point numbers on a daily or trip basis to reduce unnecessary field sampling and also to ensure distribution of plots to sample diversity NRA-wide, saving the project time and funding while ensuring thorough vegetation type sampling.

Introduction

CHDN and AMIS, with the assistance of the NVIP staff, are preparing to conduct vegetation classification plot sampling in support of creating a vegetation map and geodatabase beginning in spring 2011. Field crews benefit from having a preliminary list of vegetation alliances and plant associations from which to inform landscape observations of vegetation stands, classification plot site selection, plot density, and community type decisions when sampling vegetation types for classification under the NVC. The list provided herein was prepared using legacy data (analyzed in a companion research report, Task 1.0: Legacy Data Evaluation for AMIS), interviews with researchers directly involved in legacy data gathering, the AMIS plant species list (provided as appendix 1), and NatureServe's Explorer Web site (NatureServe 2010).

The NVC, as developed by The Nature Conservancy (TNC) and currently maintained by NatureServe, represents a national system containing eight levels: (1) Formation Class, (2) Formation Subclass, (3) Formation, (4) Division, (5) Macrogroup, (6) Group, (7) Alliance, and (8) Association, with the finest level being the plant association. Alliances are usually aggregations of associations that are physiognomically uniform and share one or more characteristic or diagnostic species. An association is defined as a plant community or type with a consistent species composition, uniform physiognomy, and homogenous habitat conditions (Flahault and Schroter 1910). The plant association or community type is determined by environmental patterns and disturbance processes.

Associations are separated from alliances through the use of total floristic composition and are named by the most dominant and/or indicator species. For the name or title assigned to an association or alliance, a single dominant species may be used (*Prosopis glandulosa* Woodland). If two dominant species occur in the same stratum a dash is used (e.g. *Acacia berlandieri* – *Leucophyllum frutescens* Shrubland). If two dominant species occur in different strata, then a slash is used to separate them (e.g. *Prosopis glandulosa* / *Panicum virgatum* Woodland). Parentheses are used when the diagnostic species are not consistent in the association or alliance (i.e., *Bothriochloa ischaemum* – (*Pappophorum bicolor*) Herbaceous Vegetation).

The purpose of the NVC is to provide a complete, standardized listing and description of all vegetation types that represent the variation in biological diversity at the community level and to identify those communities that require protection (Grossman et al. 1998). The NVC focuses on existing vegetation rather than potential natural vegetation, climax vegetation, or physical habitats. Because it is not restricted to static vegetation types, classification units are useful both for inventory, site description, and as the basis for building dynamic ecological models. The NVC also includes vegetation along the natural-invasive-cultural (semi-natural and modified) continuum, but it emphasizes natural communities as the focus of biodiversity protection.

The project minimum mapping unit (MMU) is 0.5 hectare (1.24 acres) and vegetation stands are sampled using classification plots. Typically, between three to five classification plots are required to adequately describe most plant associations. Small, unique vegetation patches or stands are often termed “park specials” in the NVIP because of their value for overall management, but they are less than the project MMU. Resource management staff at AMIS identified such stands of unique vegetation at the AMIS Study Plan (2010) kick-off meeting.

Background

The following discussion was excerpted in part from the AMIS Study Plan (2010) and users are encouraged to review the plan to place this classification research study in context with the larger project. Uninundated reaches of the Rio Grande and Pecos and Devils rivers support most of the woodland and forest vegetation types. The majority of AMIS vegetation consists of thornscrub shrubland communities and some sparsely vegetated rock outcrops. A broad drawdown zone can occur on the reservoir shoreline that may be unvegetated or may support shrubland or herbaceous vegetation types if the drawdown occurred over several growing seasons.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) (2009) describe this reach of the Rio Grande under the Trans-Pecos, Edwards Plateau, and South Texas Brush Country (Rio Grande Basin) Natural Regions and the Level III Ecoregion of the South Texas Plains, Edwards Plateau, and Trans-Pecos. During 2007-2008, the DHS-USBP used the NVC to describe the vegetation of the Rio Grande floodplain and adjacent toeslopes and canyons in the Del Rio sector (USDHS-USBP 2008). Poole (2004) recorded plant species frequency on pre-selected sites to prepare a plant species list for AMIS, and reported 76 different plant communities. Two major vegetation types are described in the AMIS General Management Plan (NPS 2006); Floodplain/Upland Riparian and Scrub Desert and Thornscrub, as follows:

Floodplain/Upland Riparian: consists of seven general categories including Chihuahuan Desert Scrub, Tamaulipan Floodplain, Thornscrub, Savannah, and North American Arid West Emergent Marsh (USDHS-USBP 2008). The Rio Grande, Devils River, and Pecos River have high water tables and dependable year-round flows and where not confined by steep canyon walls support dense stands of vegetation. Nonnative salt cedar or tamarisk (*Tamarix* spp.) and giant reed or carrizo (*Arundo donax*) are being systematically removed from some reaches of the Rio Grande allowing native riparian and wetland plants to reestablish.

Scrub Desert and Thornscrub: this vegetation structure was compiled from 76 plant communities listed in Poole (2004), 10 vegetative structures from Larson (2002), and corresponding types including Chihuahuan Desert Scrub and Tamaulipan Thornscrub vegetation described by USDHS-USBP (2008). Desert scrub is characterized by shrubs and succulents. Grasses are understory or occur in small patches and typically provide insufficient fuels to carry fire. Scrub Desert occurs on toeslopes, hills, and cliffs adjacent to the river floodplains and above the reservoir high-water line.

Project area vegetation distribution is influenced by several factors (ecologic drivers) that include hydrology, elevation, slope, aspect/slope exposure, precipitation patterns, temperature extremes, topographic position, geology, and soils. The environmental drivers have resulted in a unique assemblage of plant species and plant communities. The environmental drivers are discussed in detail and used to prepare bio-physical unit maps in support of field crews in the companion study (Task 2.0: Gradsect and Field Sampling Plan for AMIS).

The Rio Grande annual flows and sediment delivery/removal have been controlled by Amistad Dam and upstream dams and groundwater pumping for many decades resulting in diminished overbank flooding and allowing bank-armoring vegetation including salt-cedar, giant reed or carrizo, Johnson grass (*Sorghum halepense*), buffelgrass (*Cenchrus ciliaris*), and Bermuda grass

(*Cynodon dactylon*) to become established on riverbanks, point bars, and islands. These invasive, nonnative species have become a management concern and the assignment of AMIS resources to monitor populations and attempt focused control and eradication methods has occurred. Nonnative vegetation types are routinely sampled for classification and mapping purposes under the NVIP.

Legacy Data

Legacy data are existing qualitative and quantitative vegetation information collected in support of a variety of AMIS research projects over the years. Please refer to the companion study (Task 1.0: Legacy Data Evaluation for AMIS [2010]) and the AMIS Study Plan (2010) for an in-depth summary of this project task.

Plant species list development for AMIS was critical to this project task, and three principle legacy studies were undertaken to prepare a comprehensive floristic inventory. In the first, TPWD (1995) botanists in the Texas Natural Heritage Program identified 162 vascular plant species within AMIS, then managed by the U.S. Air force on 107 acres. Secondly, Dr. Richard Worthington (2002) submitted a working draft of plant species known to occur in AMIS. The tabular data were divided into families and each taxa was described by scientific name and author, common name, and known location within the NRA. Listed were 618 species of vascular plants (including club mosses, ferns, and fern allies). The third and most complete species list was prepared by Poole (2004) and totaled 829 taxa. Of these, 706 species were collected in and/or represented by herbarium specimens from AMIS and an additional 123 species had a high likelihood of occurring. Forty-nine plant species collected within AMIS are nonnative and an additional 13 nonnative plant species are expected to occur. Previously unknown AMIS plant species determined from this study were added to the species list provided in Appendix 1.

Also described in Poole (2004) are 76 plant communities (woodland, shrubland, herbaceous, and sparse) determined in the field using a visual estimate of species frequency. The dominant species comprising these communities were used in part to develop the potential list of AMIS vegetation alliances and plant associations (Tables 1, 2, and 3).

Results

The results of this research study are presented in Table 1; a list of 82 vegetation alliances and 102 plant associations was prepared to inform field crew classification plot sampling and guide CHDN-AMIS planning decisions in terms of timing and costs. Additionally, 52 plant communities described by Poole (2004) and not currently present in the NVC were included in the provisional list of vegetation alliances and plant communities to ensure that field crews are aware of potentially new types to sample. A field oversight trip by Cogan Technology, Inc. (CTI) ecologists on December 9, 2009, confirmed the presence of several of the upland and riparian/wetland plant communities included on the list. The final project classification list will appear in the final project report and will be based primarily on new plot data likely collected during 2011; it is unlikely that supplemental legacy data will be available. Additionally, an updated species list will be appended to the project final report and will be available in the project geodatabase.

The preliminary vegetation classification list presented herein supports two AMIS Study Plan assumptions relative to field data collection: (1) sufficient vegetation data occurs for this area that a relatively accurate preliminary list of ecological systems, vegetation alliances, and plant associations was created; and (2) new plant associations and possibly vegetation alliances will be classified from the plot database following field sampling for plots and accuracy assessment points. Vegetation alliances and plant associations listed in Tables 1, 2, and 3 and having an element code (A. or CEGl, respectively) have been previously classified and described on the NatureServe Explorer Web site: (www.natureserve.org/explorer/servlet/NatureServe?init=Ecol). The Poole (2004) provisional plant communities not presently recognized in the NVC are designated with CEGl00xxxx.

For the state of Texas, the NVC currently includes 118 environmental systems, 248 vegetation alliances, and 525 plant associations (NatureServe 2010). When vetted with the AMIS species list of more than 800 taxa, the habitats known for the Trans-Pecos Region and acquired from more than 15 legacy studies, and an oversight field trip, this task resulted in identification of 23 ecological systems, 82 vegetation alliances, and 154 plant associations and provisional communities as possibly occurring within AMIS. The AMIS vegetation inventory area consists of approximately 15,000 upland and shallow water acres and an adequate level of sampling determined in the AMIS Study Plan (2010) was estimated to be between 200 to 350 classification plots; no legacy plots are considered to be potentially useful, instead all new sampling is recommended.

Because vegetation alliances and plant associations can occur across more than one ecological system, that breakdown (featured in the AMIS Study Plan [2010]) is not used in this task to avoid confusion and repetition. Rather, the list of plant communities presented herein is alphabetized and separated by physiognomic or structural types to be easily and efficiently accessed by field crews. Table 1 includes the forest and woodland types that number 15 vegetation alliances and 24 plant associations (plus eight Poole [2004] plant communities); Table 2 includes the shrubland, dwarf-shrubland, and shrub herbaceous types that number 33 vegetation alliances and 53 plant associations (plus 32 Poole [2004] plant communities); and

Table 3 includes the herbaceous and sparse types that number 34 vegetation alliances and 25 plant associations (plus 12 Poole [2004] plant communities).

Two important uses of the AMIS classification list by field crews are readily identified. The first important use includes documenting vegetation classification plot and observation point collection on a daily and field trip basis to avoid wasteful oversampling, but also to guide representative sampling across the project area so each type is represented by its diversity NRA-wide. Rare types may be sampled as little as one time, while common types may receive 10 to 15 classification plots to document regional diversity. The second important use is to apply the correct provisional plant community name sampled on the vegetation classification plot field form or in the electronic data logger.
