By reason of being a railroad association controlled and maintained wholly or principally by two or more "employers" under the Railroad Retirement Act and engaged in the performance of services in connection with, or incidental to, railroad transportation, the above-named company has been an employer within the meaning of the Railroad Retirement and Railroad Unemployment Insurance Acts. Its name appears in the Employer Status List under Item No. 6310, with the period of creditable service shown as August 8, 1934, to date.

In a letter dated May 26, 1964, Mr. M. E. Greer, Director of Research, National Railway Labor Conference, stated that "the Southeastern Committee for the National Adjustment Board ceased to be an employer under the provisions of the Railroad Retirement Act on September 30, 1963, and all of their employees were transferred to the payrolls of the National Railway Labor Conference effective October 1, 1963."

On the basis of the foregoing, I conclude that on October 1, 1963, the Southeastern Committee for the National Adjustment Board ceased to be an employer under the Railroad Retirement Act and the Railroad Unemployment Insurance Act.

Appropriate Form G-341 will be released giving effect to the foregoing conclusion.
