This will acknowledge your letter of July 2, 1941, to
Mr. [REDACTED], Assistant General Counsel of the Board.

As predicted in Mr. [REDACTED] letter of June 13, 1940,
to Mr. [REDACTED], the Board's subsequent decision on another case
involving an independent lessor railroad company permits a final
determination that the Oklahoma City Junction Railway Company, a
railroad corporation which operated its own line until May 1, 1929,
and over whose tracks interstate and other traffic has been handled
by a lessee railroad under a lease or license agreement since that
date, has been an "employer" within the meaning of the Railroad
Retirement and Railroad Unemployment Insurance Acts at least since
August 28, 1935. Accordingly, service to the company at any time
since the date of its incorporation, June 10, 1909, is creditable
toward annuities under the Railroad Retirement Act.

The company will shortly receive instructions regarding
the filing of reports and other information required by the Acts.
