REPORT:

The petitioner states that he rendered service, during the late war between the United States and Great Britain and the Creek Indians; and, also, during the Seminole war; for which he asks compensation. It appears satisfactorily to the committee that the petitioner rendered service, in various capacities, for the space of about fifteen months; that, for the service thus rendered, they think he should receive the pay and emoluments of a major of infantry. For that purpose, the committee report a bill.
