Mr. ROWAN made the following

REPORT:

The Judiciary Committee have had under consideration the resolution instructing them to inquire into the expediency of erecting, in Savannah, at the expense of the General Government, a suitable building for the accommodation of the District Court of the United States for the District of Georgia, and have come to the conclusion, that it is not expedient, at this time, to erect such building. The practice has been to rent, through the agency of the marshals, suitable buildings for the accommodation of the District Courts, in the States where such buildings were not gratuitously furnished by the States; and the committee are of opinion, that, until a different mode of furnishing suitable buildings for *all* the District Courts of the United States shall be ordained by Congress, it is not expedient to make special provision for the District of Georgia. They therefore submit the following resolution, viz:

Resolved, That the committee be discharged from the further consideration of the subject.

 United States shall be ordained by Congress, it is not expedient to make
 special provision for the District of Georgia. They therefore submit the
 following resolution, viz:
