### GREAT DEMOCRATIC MEETING.

Pursuant to public notice, about eight hundred of the democratic republicans of Belmont county, Ohio, met at the court-house in St. Clairsville, on Tuesday, March 11th, 1834.

James Alexander, esq., of Pease township, presided, assisted by the Hon. George Sharp and Thomas Major, esq.; and John Y. Glessner and Geo. W. Manypenny acted as secretaries. The following, (among other) resolutions, were *unanimously* passed at said meeting:

*Resolved*, That we approve of the removal of the public money from the Bank of the United States; and that, in no event, ought it to be returned to that institution; and that said bank ought not to be rechartered.

*Resolved*, That the reasons presented by Mr. Taney, to Congress, for the removal of the deposits are unanswered and unanswerable.

*Resolved*, That the proceedings of this meeting, or copies thereof, so far as they relate to the removal of the deposits, and the recharter of the bank, be forwarded to the Hon. Thomas Morris and the Hon. James M. Bell, with a request that they be laid before their respective Houses.
