#### MEMORIAL

#### OF

### THE VOTERS OF LIVINGSTON COUNTY, STATE OF NEW YORK,

Setting forth the embarrassments under which they are suffering, and praying for a restoration of the deposites, and a renewal, for a longer or a shorter period, of the charter of the United States Bank, as the most obvious source of relief.

# MAY 5, 1834. Read, and laid upon the table.

## GREAT DEMOCRATIC MEETING.

At a meeting of more than eight hundred of as respectable citizens as ever before convened in the county of Livingston, held at the court-house, in Geneseo, on the 28th of March, 1834, to take into consideration "those measures of the ad-"ministration of the General Government, the effects of which have been to de-"range the currency of the country, to withdraw the circulating medium, to pros-"trate all credit, to destroy confidence in the trading community, to produce a "general stagnation of business, to threaten bankruptcy to our most wealthy and "substantial men, to depress the prices of property, and to spread want and ruin "throughout our beloved and happy country:"

The meeting was organized by the appointment of General MICAH BROOKS, of Mount Morris, as president; Col. WM. FITZHUGH, of Groveland, and JOHN MC-KENZIE, of Caledonia, vice presidents; and Hugh McNair, Jun., Chauncey R. Bond, and Holloway Long, secretaries.

The objects of the meeting having been explained by the Hon. Charles H. Carroll, in an eloquent and able address, in which the present distress and disasters of the country were faithfully and truly presented, on motion of John Young, Esq., a resolution was adopted, that a committee, consisting of one person from each town in the county, be appointed to prepare and report resolutions for the adoption of the meeting:

Whereupon the following gentlemen were appointed said committee:

Charles H. Carroll, of Groveland; Reuben Sleeper, of Mount Morris; George W. Patterson, of Leicester; John Young, Esq., of Geneseo; Wm. T. Hosmer, of Avon; Cyril Child, of York; William Barron, of Caledonia; Nelson Wells, of Springwater; Andrew Sill, of Livonia; William D. McNair, of Sparta; Andrew Arnold, of Conesus; Joseph Marvin, of Lima.

On motion of Maj. Wm. H. Spencer, it was resolved that a committee, consisting of seven persons, be appointed to report an address to this meeting; whereupon the following gentlemen were appointed:

Chauncey R. Bond, of Geneseo; Wm. C. Dwight, of Leicester; Samuel Salisbury, of Avon; Daniel H. Fitzhugh, of Groveland; Elias P. Metcalf, of Geneseo; Wm. H. Spencer, of Geneseo; Amos Dann, of Avon.

Which committee, by their chairman, reported an address, which was adopted as expressing the sentiments of the meeting, and ordered to be printed.

Elias Clark, Esq., of Geneseo, then addressed the meeting, which address was also ordered to be published.

The committee who had retired to draught resolutions, by their chairman reported the following preamble and resolutions, which were adopted with great spirit and perfect unanimity:

#### PREAMBLE.

Whereas, The people of this section of the country, emphatically agricultural, who were but yesterday prosperous and happy to a degree hitherto unparalleled, and enjoying, in an eminent degree, the benefits of an abundant harvest, as a kind return for honest and persevering industry, and to-day suffering under pecuniary distress and embarrassments, before unknown to but few (if any of us) who compose this meeting:

And whereas, The right to petition Congress, and to express our opinions, freely and fearlessly, but respectfully, to Congress, and to our fellow-citizens, upon all matters of public interest, is guaranteed to us by the constitution and laws of our country: therefore,

*Resolved*, That, whatever uncandid and desperate politicians may say to the contrary, the history of our republic furnishes no instance of pecuniary distress like the present time: a general alarm pervades the whole land; the cry of "what shall we do?" is in the mouth of every one; the rich and the poor, the professional man and the day laborer, the farmer and the mechanic, the merchant and the manufacturer, all re-echo the cry of "want of money" to continue the ordinary channels of business.

Resolved, That within a few short months the circumstances of our country have changed from its greatest prosperity to its greatest suffering. Then every channel was open to industry and enterprise; the prices of every species of property operated as a stimulus to the industrious and enterprising to acquire it. The farmer, by the fair prices he obtained for his surplus products, was enabled to contribute to the support of those engaged in other occupations. The facility of obtaining money enabled the merchant to meet his engagements, and share in the general prosperity. The mechanic and day-laborer were enabled to obtain a fair remuneration for their daily earnings. The more enterprising laborer, without capital, was enabled to purchase and pay for a farm that would make a comfortable and independent home for himself and his family. But now how changed the scene! Money cannot be obtained except on terms so exorbitant, that, in a short time, the interest exceeds the principal; produce and property of every kind have depreciated to an alarming degree; money cannot be borrowed by the best men, and on the best security, to meet their engagements; the consequences of which are, that our merchants are breaking, one after another; no new contracts are made; business is suspended; enterprise is paralyzed; and, in a word, our lately prosperous and happy country presents now a scene of want and threatening Whereupon the following gentlemen were applicated ruin.

**Resolved**, That as the public moneys were deposited in the Bank of the United States, by an act of Congress, as a place of safety, only to be removed by the Secretary of the Treasury in case they were in jeopardy; and as the previous Congress had, after due examination, refused to remove them from their place of keeping, because it was the safest, most proper, and lawful place for them to be, (the recommendation of the President to the contrary notwithstanding;) in the opinion of this meeting, the removal of the deposites by the President, although cloaked under the sanction of his Secretary, was a wanton, high-handed, and arbitrary measure, unauthorized by law, and inconsistent with the good faith of the nation, which had been pledged that they should there remain, if safe, until the expiration of the charter of the Bank. **Resolved**, That the ground taken by the President, that the deposites were removed by the Secretary of the Treasury, and not by himself, because the order of removal was signed by the Secretary; when one Secretary was removed by him because he would not sign the order, and another appointed whose pleasure is the President's will, is an insult to the understanding of freemen, and could never have been advanced in this or any other country by any man possessing just ideas of freedom.

*Resolved*, That the power now assumed by the President over the treasury of the United States, of depositing the whole or any part of it where and with whom he pleases, as a place of safe keeping, is a usurpation of power never conferred on him by law, nor intended to be by the constitution; and gives him the control of the purse of the nation, which neither the constitution nor the laws ever intended to be controlled by him who had, at the same time, the command of the armies and the navy; and is, in our opinion, too dangerous to our liberties to be suffered to be thus usurped.

*Resolved*, That the resolutions of our State Legislature approbatory of the removal of the deposites, and of the conduct of the Executive in relation to the same, were, in our opinion, precipitately adopted and unwarranted by the actual or expressed opinions of a majority of the people of this State.

**Resolved**, That the removal of the deposites from the Bank of the United States, and the persevering determination of the President to crush the institution and to destroy its credit, have sapped the foundation of all our banking institutions, and all the business of the country, which are dependent upon public as well as private credit. The destruction of this credit has undermined the foundation of the whole business of the country. The United States Bank is afraid of the State banks; the State banks are afraid of the Bank of the United States. The banks are afraid of individuals; individuals are afraid of banks; and the alarm has become universal, and extends to business in all its ramifications.

*Resolved*, That it is unfair and ungenerous to attribute the pervading distress and pressure to the Bank of the United States, when that Bank has only reduced its discounts one-half of the amount of the deposites removed from it, and when the State banks have reduced their accommodations in the same time to a much greater degree, although the deposites have been removed from the vaults of the former to those of the latter.

Resolved, That the curtailment of accommodations of the State banks (which we do not here pronounce unnecessary or wanton) has had a more direct agency in producing distress in the money market in this State than the curtailments of the accommodations of the branches of the Bank of the United States located within our limits, inasmuch as the aggregate curtailment of the former has been greater than that of the latter, and inasmuch as the notes of the former constituted a much greater part of the circulating medium, and inasmuch as our citizens were more in the habit of doing business with the former, because more numerous and more convenient to them.

**Resolved**, That if there is any soundness in the objections of the President to the Bank of the United States, that it is "tyrannical, oppressive, and dangerous to our liberties," we cannot see why the objections do not apply with equal, if not greater, force to our State banks. The legal rate of interest of the former is less than that of the latter, in the proportion of six to seven per cent. This difference is further increased by the practice of our State banks, located in the country, making their discounted notes payable at Albany or New York, at the end of sixty or ninety days, and then selling drafts to meet them; thus swelling the interest paid by the borrower, and realized by the bank, to the enormous sum of from ten to fifteen per cent. The mode of doing business of the former enables it to make a profit of from seven to eight per cent. per annum; while that of our State banks, which is patiently borne, and in nowise oppressive or dangerous to our liberties, enables them to realize an annual profit of from fifteen to twenty per cent. Resolved, That the language and deportment of the President of the United States to the different committees that have been appointed to wait upon him, to present before him the distress of the country, and to implore relief, representing, as they did, thousands and tens of thousands of respectable citizens, show a vindictive spirit and obstinacy of purpose, an undignified demeanor, and an unfeeling heart, ill becoming the President of a free people, and leaves no hope of relief, unless from the legislative branch of the Government.

Resolved, That as experiments on the currency of the country are at all times attended with great hazard and destructive consequences; as our citizens are indebted to the Bank of the United States, and to the State banks, to a much larger amount than can be paid by them without producing great and universal distress; and should the capital of the United States Bank be withdrawn before there is as much capital created to take its place; as, in the opinion of this meeting, this Bank has been eminently useful in sustaining and resuscitating the credit of our country, when it was at its lowest ebb; as its usefulness, until a very short period, not only was generally admitted, and even by those who are now most loud in their denunciations against it, and not only to the Government, but to the whole community; and as all objections to its constitutionality have been overruled by the decisions of the highest judicial tribunals of our country; that the Congress of the United States now in session be respectfully requested, before they adjourn, either to extend for a few years, or renew, the charter of the Bank of the United States; and, having an eye to the present distressed state of the country, that they will be governed in their legislation by a spirit of concession and compromise; the friends of the Bank yielding to amendments to obviate the reasonable objections of the opponents of the present charter, and its opponents requiring no amendments which will destroy or impair its usefulness.

**Resolved**, That, in the opinion of this meeting, our national faith and honor require that the public deposites should be restored to the Bank of the United States as speedily as possible; and that the experiment, which the President and his Secretary of the Treasury said they would try until the Bank charter expires, has already been tried long enough.

Resolved, That we can but view with consternation and alarm a doctrine publicly advanced and practically adhered to in this nation, by which public and private justice, individual and national right are sacrificed at the shrine of partisan feeling—"perish credit, perish commerce,"—the glory of this nation is departed!

**Resolved**, That a copy of these resolutions be transmitted to each of the members of the House of Representatives and Senators in Congress from this State, accompanied with a request, made in the most friendly and respectful manner, that they would take into consideration the sufferings of their fellow-citizens, and, rising above all party considerations, adopt such measures as will relieve the present distress, and restore credit and confidence; and that they will not consent to the adjournment of Congress until such measures are adopted.

*Resolved*, That Elias Clark, S. G. Havens, Charles Colt, Andrew Sill, Amos Dann, H. A. Wilmerding, and Daniel H. Fitzhugh, be a committee to draught and forward a memorial to Congress in furtherance of the objects of the above resolutions, and to circulate the same through the county for signatures.

Resolved, That our representative in Congress, the honorable Philo C. Fuller, be requested to present the memorial and proceedings of this meeting to the House of Representatives, and that our Senators in Congress from this State be requested to present them to the Senate.

**Resolved**, That a committee of five persons be appointed in each town in the county, to circulate the memorial, and to return the same to the committee appointed to draught and send the memorial to Congress; whereupon the following persons were appointed said committees:

#### MEMORIAL.

To the honorable the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States, in Congress assembled: The memorial of the subscribers, inhabitants of the county of Livingston, in the State of New York,

#### RESPECTFULLY REPRESENTS:

That the inhabitants of this county are severely suffering under an unprecedented derangement of the currency of the country, which suspends their business; paralyzes their enterprise; arrests their manufacturing and mercantile interests; totally checks their advancement in agricultural pursuits; in a word, which presents them with scenes of want, and threatens them with ruin.

Your memorialists reside in a district of country eminently agricultural; and they are made to feel that this, the most stable of all pursuits, owes its successful prosecution, if not its absolute existence, to the soundness and stability of the currency and credit of the country; and when this currency is deranged, and this credit destroyed, that interest, no more than others, can escape from the desolating influence consequent upon such derangement and destruction.

A few months since, and your memorialists enjoyed prosperity and plenty, growing out of a sound and sufficient medium of exchange and an established system of credit. But now the soundness and sufficiency of that medium have ceased. That established system of credit has either become fluctuating and uncertain, or is entirely broken up. Under these painful circumstances, our expectations are earnestly and anxiously directed to Congress, as that branch of Government intrusted by the constitution with the control of the currency of the country. If our expectations in that quarter are not realized, we know not where to look with hope; for our local institutions profess to be utterly unable to extend to us any assistance, or yield us any relief.

Your memorialists believe that the causes of their distress are to be found in the unlawful removal of the public money from the Bank of the United States, and in the destruction of public confidence consequent upon such removal. We see no other cause; and we think this cause adequate to produce the great change that has blighted our interests and disappointed our hopes. Your memorialists, therefore, respectfully ask that Congress, before it adjourn, will adopt some measures which may relieve our present embarrassment, and destroy our gloomy anticipations; and such measures, we think, are only to be found in an immediate restoration of the deposites to the United States Bank, and in renewing the charter of the Bank of the United States, or extending it for a term of years.
