The Committee on Expenditures for the Public Buildings, report:

That the account of the Commissioner of Public Buildings hereunto

It also appears by certificates from the First Comptroller of the Treasury Department, that the accounts of the Commissioner of Public Buildings

have been regularly examined and adjusted.
