

JAMES M. EDWARDS.

[To accompany bill H. R. No. 254.]

DECEMBER 28, 1837.

Mr. TAYLOR, of New York, from the Committee on Invalid Pensions,
made the following

REPORT:

The Committee on Invalid Pensions, to which was referred the petition of James M. Edwards, report :

That the petitioner clearly proves, by respectable and well authenticated testimony, that he was a soldier in the military service of the United States, in the year 1811 ; and that he was in the battle of Tippecanoe on the night of the 7th of November in that year ; and that while in the line of his duty in that battle, he received two gun-shot wounds—one in the groin, the other in the thigh, about four inches below the first ; which balls still remain in the wounds. The petitioner also proves, by two respectable physicians, that those wounds disable him two-thirds ; your committee, therefore, have

Resolved, That the prayer of the petitioner ought to be granted.
