

SARAH HARING, WIDOW OF CAPTAIN SAMUEL HARING.

Mr. C. MORRIS, from the Committee on Invalid Pensions, submitted the following

REPORT:

*The Committee on Invalid Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of Sarah Haring, widow of Samuel Haring, deceased, formerly a captain in the army, praying for a pension, report :*

That a pension having been allowed the husband of the said widow, she rests her claim for a pension upon the grounds that he lived to enjoy it but a few months, and that he was a great expense to her for his support and medical attendance, from the 27th of May, 1813, till 9th of July, 1839.

The first section of the law of 4th of July, 1836, (the only one applying to the last war,) granted pensions to those widows only whose husbands were of the militia, volunteers, &c. Captain Haring, it seems, was of the 13th regiment of infantry.

The petition is not accompanied with any evidence or facts, other than those stated by the petitioner herself.

The committee report unfavorably.

## REPORT.

The Committee on Naval & Marine Penitentiaries, to report a bill relating to the  
of Supply, Paying, & other of the General Penitentiary, & other  
in the army, & Navy, for a pension, &c.

For a pension paid to the widow of the said widow, who  
lives for claim for a pension upon the grounds that she is  
but a few months, and that she was a widow on the 1st of July, 1839,  
and medical infirmary, from the 1st of July, 1839, (the only one able  
to be first pension of the sum of \$100 per month, only wages, punctually  
of the last war,) during her services to those whom only wages punctually  
were to the widow, & pension, &c. Captain Herring, & others, was of the  
13th Regt. of Infantry of Infantry.

The pension is for accumulation with any deficiency to meet, after giving  
pence stated by the pensioner, &c.

The committee is about to report this bill.
