COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

In the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

RESOLVES RELATING TO THE RE-ELIGIBILITY OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, AND TO THE LIMITATION OF THE OFFICE TO A SINGLE TERM.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives, That the Constitution of the United States should be so far amended as to restrict the eligibility of the President of the United States to a single term.

Resolved, That it is the duty of Congress to provide that the election of electors of President and Vice President shall take place on one and the same day throughout all the States.

Resolved, That our Senators and Representatives in Congress be, and they are hereby, requested to use their best endeavors to procure amendments of the Constitution of the United States according to the principles contained in the foregoing resolves.

Resolved, That His Excellency the Governor be requested to transmit a copy of the foregoing resolves to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress, and to the Governors of the several States, with a request that they lay the same before their respective Legislatures.
