

RESOLUTION

Calling for information in relation to alterations in mail routes.

AUGUST 14, 1841.

Submitted, and ordered to be printed.

Mr. SEVIER submitted the following resolution :

Resolved, That the Postmaster General be instructed to inform the Senate whether any changes have been made in the mode of transporting the mails in any of the States or Territories, since the 4th of March last; and, if so, what changes; and, also, if any mail routes have been *discontinued* since that period; and, if so, what routes, and in which States and Territories. And, also, if there have been, during the time aforesaid, any alterations in the times of carrying the mails, from daily to tri-weekly, and from tri-weekly to weekly mails, or in any other respect. And, if so, on what routes have the alterations been made, and in which of the States and Territories. And, further, whether any new mail routes have been put in operation since the 4th of March last; and, if so, what routes, and in which States and Territories.
