REPORT :

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of Mary Dunscomb, report :

The petitioner alleges that her husband, a revolutionary soldier, to whom she was married 14th June, 1786, and dying in 1814, before the passage of any law giving pensions to revolutionary soldiers, gives her a special claim upon Congress for a new pension, in lieu of that given under the law of 1838, expired by its limitation. The committee do not coincide in opinion with the petitioner. They, therefore, recommend the adoption of the following resolution :

Resolved, That the prayer of the petitioner ought not to be granted.
