The undersigned, Secretary of State, in compliance with a resolution of the House of Representatives of the 22d instant, respectfully reports, that having, previous to the passage of the act of the 26th of August, 1842, referred to in the resolution, in compliance with an act approved on the 18th of May of that year, advertised for proposals, and made contracts for furnishing, for one year from the 15th of June, 1842, such job printing, stationery, and book binding, as should be required for this Department and the Patent Office, he has not had occasion, as yet, to make contracts under the 17th section of the former act.
