Mr. WALDO, from the Committee on Revolutionary Pensions, made the following

REPORT:

*The Committee on Revolutionary Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of Anna L. Scott, respectfully report:*

The petitioner alleges that she is the widow of James Scott, to whom she was married in the month of October, 1781; that said James Scott was a revolutionary pensioner of the United States, at the rate of twenty dollars per annum, and that he deceased on the 1st day of December, 1840; and she asks Congress to pass an act authorizing the Commissioner of Pensions to issue to her a certificate for the same amount of pension to which her husband would be entitled if he had lived to the present time.

If the allegations above stated are true, the petitioner can obtain the relief sought by virtue of the joint resolution passed by the House of Representatives on the — day of March, 1850. The committee, therefore, ask to be discharged from the further consideration of this case, and recommend that the petition be laid upon the table.
