RESOLUTION.

*Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Louisiana in General Assembly convened,* That our senators and representatives in Congress be, and they are hereby requested to use their best exertions to have established at New Orleans a naval depot, and navy yard, for the construction and repairing of United States vessels; and also, that the said senators and representatives be requested to confer with the Secretary of the Navy of the United States, and solicit his aid and exertions and to procure from Congress a suitable appropriation for the objects herein embraced.

*Be it further resolved,* That the governor be requested to have forwarded to each of our senators and representatives in Congress, and to the Secretary of the Navy, a copy of the forgoing resolution.
