REPORT.

The Committee on Pensions, to whom was referred the memorial of Hannah Walker, widow of Francis Walker, a soldier of the revolution, praying to be allowed a pension and arrears of pension; beg leave to report:

That the petitioner prays a pension and arrears of pension on account of alleged services of her husband, Francis Walker, who was drafted into the service of the United States in the war of the revolution, but she offers no evidence of those services, except the affidavit of said Francis Walker, and by her own statement can bring no other proof. This evidence, unsupported by other proof, being thought insufficient to establish her claim, therefore the committee submit the following resolution:

Resolved, That the prayer of the petitioner be denied.
