CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS in relation to General Robert Anderson.

Whereas General Robert Anderson, by his heroic defence of Fort Sumter, and his patriotic devotion to the flag of the country, under trials, temptations and perils which have never been equalled, has impaired his health: Therefore,

*Resolved, (if the senate concur,)* That a just and patriotic estimate of the distinguished services of General Robert Anderson should, in the opinion of the legislature of the State, induce the Congress of the United States to place General Anderson on the retired list of his country's veteran officers, with the full pay and emoluments of his rank.

*Resolved,* That the governor of this State be requested to transmit a copy of these resolutions to our senators and representatives in Congress, with the request that, in all proper ways, they urge upon Congress such means as will make effective the purpose of these resolutions.
