To the Senate and House of Representatives:

In compliance with the provisions of law, I have the honor to submit the annual report of this office, showing "the exact condition of the public printing, binding, and engraving, the amount and cost of such printing, binding, and engraving, the amount of paper purchased for the same, and such further information as may be within my knowledge in regard to all matters connected therewith." Also, a statement showing "the number of hands employed, and the length of time each has been employed." The tabular statements accompanying this report are made up for the year ending on the 30th of September, 1868, and are as follows:

- No. 1. Showing the documents printed by authority of law, or by order of either house of Congress, the cost of printing and binding them, and the manner in which they were distributed.
- No. 2. Showing the cost of the printing and binding ordered by the executive and judicial departments of the government.
- No. 3. Showing the disbursements on account of the public printing.
- No. 4. Showing the disbursements on account of paper for the public printing.
- No. 5. Showing the disbursements on account of the public binding.
- No. 6. Showing the disbursements on account of lithographing and engraving for the Senate and House of Representatives, and for copies in *fac simile* of maps, plats, diagrams, &c., for the use of the Supreme Court of the United States.
- No. 7. Showing the number of hands employed, the length of time each was employed, and the amount earned by each, for the year ending October 31, 1868.

COST OF THE PUBLIC PRINTING AND BINDING.

Statements No. 1 and No. 2 will show the *approximate* cost of the public printing and binding for each department of the government during the year ending on the 30th of September, 1868, as it appears on the books of this office. The statement No. 1, exhibiting the cost of the printing, binding, and lithographing and engraving for Congress, is given very much in detail, with the view of showing the cost, as nearly as is practicable, of each of the annual reports and other public documents which were printed in excess of the usual number, (1,550 copies,) and the manner in which they were authorized to be distributed. The *actual* disbursements of the office, as detailed in statements Nos. 3, 4, 5, and 6, were as follows:

The cost of the paper and other materials remaining on hand on the 30th of September, 1868, was \$176,181 70, being \$195,444 36 *less* than at the commencement of the year; so that the aggregate cost of the printing and binding amounts to the sum of \$1,504,513 21, (or \$126,071 72 *less* than for the preceding year,) which may be apportioned as follows:

By reference to statement No. 1, it will be seen that a large number of the public documents ordered to be printed, either by law, by order of the Senate, or the House of Representatives, were for distribution by the executive departments and bureaus.

The amount realized during the year from the sale of paper, paper shavings, documents, &c., is \$21,315 15, which has been deposited in the treasury of the United States, as required by law.

DISTRIBUTION OF THE PUBLIC DOCUMENTS.

Inquiry is frequently made as to the manner in which the usual or regular number (1,550) of executive and miscellaneous documents and reports of committees are distributed; as also the bills and joint resolutions, of which 700 copies are printed. This information is given in the following statement:

By a recent act of Congress, the usual number of the public documents has been increased to 1,700, 50 copies of the additional number to be furnished to the Librarian to Congress, for exchange with foreign governments.

Such number of *extra* copies of the public documents are printed as are authorized by law, or may be directed by the special order of the Senate or House of Representatives; and these are distributed in the manner directed by law or by the house ordering them.

PAPER FOR THE PUBLIC PRINTING.

The fourth section of the act of July 27, 1866, gives to the Joint Committee on Printing the exclusive control of contracting for paper for the public printing, and of "fixing a standard of paper for the different descriptions of congressional and executive printing." Under the direc-

tion of the committee contracts were entered into for supplying any required quantities of the various kinds for the year ending on the 31st December, 1868, with the following persons:

CLASS 1.—*Fine uncalendered Printing Paper, measuring 24 by 38 inches, 45 pounds to the ream of 500 sheets.*

W. H. Hoffman, Baltimore, Maryland, 2,000 reams, at \$6 83.55.

Timothy Keeney, North Manchester, Connecticut, 20,000 reams, (more or less,) at \$6 96.6.

CLASS 2.—*Fine calendered Printing Paper, measuring 24 by 38 inches, 53 pounds to the ream of 500 sheets.*

Christian Baer, Lancaster, Pennsylvania, 8,000 reams, (more or less,) at \$9 22.2.

CLASS 3.—*Superfine Printing Paper, hard-sized and supercalendered, 24 by 32 inches, 45 pounds to the ream of 500 sheets.*

William Russell, Lawrence, Massachusetts, 1,000 reams, at \$9.

CLASS 4.—*Map Paper.*

William Russell, Lawrence, Massachusetts, 1,000 reams, (more or less,) of any required sizes and weights, at 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents per pound.

CLASS 5.—*Writing Papers.*

William J. Bryan, New York, 26,000 reams, (more or less,) of such sizes and weights as might be required, at 23 cents per pound.

CLASS 6.—*Paper for Post Office Blanks.*

B. H. Moore, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 155,000 pounds, (more or less,) of various weights and sizes, at 18.48 cents per pound.

Statement No. 4, appended to this report, exhibits the exact quantity of each kind of paper purchased during the year ending on the 30th of September, 1868, and the cost per ream. The aggregate amount expended was \$385,440 97. There remained on hand at the end of the year papers of various kinds, as will be seen by reference to the same statement, amounting in value to \$124,794 21.

The contracts for paper for the year 1867 were made at prices averaging about 30 per cent. lower than for several years preceding, and those for 1868 were made at prices much lower than for 1867. It is not thought, however, that any further material reduction in the price of paper will be made in the contracts for the ensuing year.

I regret to have to state that the contractor for furnishing the paper designated as Class 2 failed, in part, in filling his contract, and that I was consequently compelled to purchase 2,000 reams in the open market at \$12 56.1, and to make a special contract, after public advertisement for 3,000 reams, at \$9 85.8, which contract was awarded to the lowest bidder, Mr. L. Hollingsworth, of Boston.

LITHOGRAPHING AND ENGRAVING FOR CONGRESSIONAL DOCUMENTS.

The aggregate amount paid for this character of work was \$105,356 77, the details of which will be found in Statement No. 6. The illustrations accompanying the Annual Report of the Commissioner of Patents on Arts and Manufactures absorb the principal part of the appropriation for lithographing and engraving, those for the Report for 1867 costing about \$88,000, and the cost of those for the report for 1868, now under contract, will exceed \$100,000. They are indispensable to a proper understanding of the Report, and are very handsomely executed, at prices which are deemed reasonable for the character of the engravings. Proposals for this work are invited by public advertisement yearly, and the contract is awarded by the Joint Committee on Printing to the lowest bidder for the style of work advertised for.

MAPPING FOR THE SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES.

Some of the Records of the Supreme Court of the United States, which are ordered to be printed, are accompanied by maps, plats, diagrams, &c., and a small number of copies in *fac-simile*, on tracing linen, are required for the use of the court. These, for the last year, cost the sum of \$3,102 75.

THE PUBLIC BINDING.

The amount expended on account of the public binding during the year ending on the 30th of September, 1868, was \$346,723 82, the details of which will be found in Statement No. 5. The value of the materials on hand at the end of the year was \$51,387 49, being \$6,951 26 less than the amount remaining over at the end of the preceding year.

CONDITION OF THE PUBLIC PRINTING AND BINDING.

Attached to Statement No. 1 will be found a list of the documents, &c., unfinished on the 30th of September, 1868, the end of the year for which the statistical portion of this report is made up. At the present time, (December 30,) the condition of the public printing and binding is as follows:

Coast Survey Report for 1866 and 1867, 6,050 copies of each, with numerous charts.—The report for 1866 is nearly completed, and will be ready for distribution during the present session of Congress; that for 1867 has not yet been commenced, nor have the materials of which it is to be composed been received. It may be proper to state that the delay in the publication of these reports is not caused at this office.

Agricultural Report for 1867.—This report is in a single volume of 532 large octavo pages, handsomely embellished with numerous engravings on wood; 224,500 copies are ordered to be printed—20,000 for distribution by senators, 180,000 by representatives, and 23,000 by the Commissioner of Agriculture. It is barely possible that it will be ready for distribution before the close of the present Congress.

Patent Office Report for 1867.—Although all the means at the command of this office have been exhausted to bring this rapidly growing report within the smallest practicable limits, that for 1867 will make about 3,000 pages, in four volumes, nearly one-half of which is composed of handsomely engraved illustrations of machinery, &c. The printing and binding of 20,550 copies, (61,650 volumes,) has been ordered by Congress, 4,000 for distribution by senators, 10,000 by representatives, and 5,000 by the Commissioner of Patents. The report will not be ready for distribution before the expiration of the present session of Congress. The report for 1868, the engravings for which are now being executed by the contractor, will make four large octavo volumes.

The Report of the Commissioner of the General Land Office for 1867 has been ordered to be printed in various forms, as follows: 12,000 copies of the full report, and 14,000 of an abridgment in English, 3,000 in German, and 1,000 each in French and Swedish. All the copies of the abridgments are to be accompanied by a large connected land map of the United States, engraved on copper and printed in colors. This report, in its several forms, is now nearly completed.

Documents accompanying the Annual Report of the Commissioner of Education for 1867, a large octavo volume, of which 1,500 copies were ordered to be printed for the use of the Commissioner, has been completed since the 30th of September, 1868.

Report of the Commissioner of Education, on Educational Interests, in the District of Columbia, of which 3,000 copies were ordered to be printed for the use of the Senate. All of the manuscript has not yet been received at this office.

Receipts and Expenditures of the United States for the year ending June 30, 1866.—This report is now completed in one large octavo volume.

Reports of the United States Commissioners to the Paris Exposition of 1867.—These reports, about fifteen in number, are being printed by order of the Senate under the direction of the Department of State. It is estimated that they will make, in the aggregate, about 3,000 large octavo pages, with numerous though not costly engravings, and are to be arranged into volumes of suitable size for binding, or bound separately, as the Secretary of State may direct. Several of them have already been printed, and the whole will be completed at the earliest practicable period.

Colonial Charters and State Constitutions.—On the 2d of March, 1867, the Senate adopted a resolution directing "that the Committee on Printing cause to be prepared for publication a volume containing the colonial charters and the various State constitutions of each State of the United States, together with all amendments thereto at any time in force, arranging the same in chronological order for each State, with suitable indexes; and that it be printed for the use of the Senate." The manuscript for this volume has not yet been received.

The Medical and Surgical History of the Rebellion, authorized to be printed by the first section of the act of July 28, 1866, will make several large quarto volumes. The printing of this work has been commenced, but, from the peculiar character of the work, its progress must necessarily be slow and tedious. No period can be fixed at which its completion may be expected.

Since the last annual report from this office the volume entitled "*Expressions of Condolence and Sympathy on the Assassination of President Lincoln*" has been completed. It is a handsomely printed quarto volume of 962 pages, of which 3,000 copies were printed. As exaggerated statements of the cost of this volume have been made in the newspapers, I will state that the actual cost of printing and binding was \$18,179 54.

The *Army Register of Volunteers* has also been completed in eight volumes. Fifty thousand copies were ordered to be printed, *for sale at cost*, by the joint resolution of June 30, 1864. An edition of five thousand copies of the first four volumes was printed, but finding very little demand for the work, the edition of the residue of the volumes was reduced to one thousand.

The delay in completing the volumes of the documents, journals, &c., reserved for binding was occasioned by the late period fixed for the final adjournment of the last session of Congress, as the indexes could not be previously prepared. These volumes are now being bound as rapidly as possible.

I trust that I shall be excused for repeating what was stated in the last report from this office, and to express the hope that the subject may receive the consideration of Congress. The laws providing for extra copies of the bureau reports for the use of the bureaus do not, in many cases, accomplish the purposes for which they were intended—to save labor in this office and expense to the government. In some cases the number of copies authorized by law are not deemed sufficient for public purposes, and applications are frequently made to Congress for an increase of the number, which are always successful, when the entire work has to be reprinted. Moreover, requisitions are continually being made upon this office by the Executive Departments and Bureaus for extra copies of reports either made or to be made to Congress, which, it appears to me, the law plainly prohibits me from printing. By a revision of the laws, so as to allow the Chiefs of Bureaus all the copies that may be necessary, and including the extra copies of all the annual reports authorized by law to be made to Congress, the work could be executed more promptly, at less cost, and with far greater satisfaction to all concerned.
