# NINTH GENERAL REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF CLAIMS.

WASHINGTON, D. C., *December 16, 1879.*

*To the honorable the Speaker of the House of Representatives :*

SIR: The Commissioners of Claims respectfully present their ninth general report.

## NUMBER OF CASES ALLOWED AND DISALLOWED.

The number of claims decided since their last report is 2,290. In each of these cases a special report is submitted, with the petition, evidence, and all papers relating thereto. The reasons for the allowance and disallowance of the claims are therein set forth. The commissioners are unanimous in all their reports.

Annexed is a table setting forth the number of claims decided, the number allowed and disallowed, the whole amounts passed upon, and the amounts allowed and disallowed in the States wherein the commissioners have jurisdiction :

Of the whole number of 2,290 claimants 53 were bankrupts, whose claims were disallowed pursuant to the decision of the commissioners, that, as in bankruptcy the property of the bankrupt passes to his assignee, the bankrupt was not the owner of the claim and could not be allowed therefor.

Of the 553 claims allowed 55 of the claimants were in the Union Army and 3 in the United States Navy during the war.

Of the 1,737 claims disallowed 238 of the claimants were in the Confederate military service, 29 were in the Confederate civil service, 70 voted for the ordinance of secession or for separation, 19 took the oath of allegiance to the Confederacy, and one signed the ordinance of secession—in all, 357.

Of the 5,702 not yet reported there are about 250 in the hands of the commissioners, some of which are in the hands of the agents for investigation and others so recently closed and submitted or still open for rebutting evidence that the commissioners have not been able to include them in this report. These 250 cases will all be decided and reported to Congress by the time the term of this commission ends, on the 10th of next March.

The rest of the 5,702 cases not yet reported are claims in which no evidence whatever on the part of the claimant to sustain the claim was filed by the 10th day of March, 1879. The act of Congress of June 15, 1878, provides, in regard to all such claims, that they "shall be barred forever thereafter, and the Commissioners of Claims shall report all such claims so barred to Congress at its next session thereafter." In compliance with this act of Congress the commissioners are preparing a list of all such claims, which they will report to Congress at the present session.

The acts of Congress of June 15, 1878, and of June 23, 1879, relating to this commission, are annexed, and the rules prescribed by the commissioners in pursuance thereof.

#### APPENDIX.

##### *Acts of Congress.*

SEC. 4. That the time of taking evidence and of submitting their claims for decision by claimants in cases now pending before the Commissioners of Claims is hereby extended to the tenth day of March, anno Domini eighteen hundred and seventy-nine; and the term of office of the Commissioners of Claims is hereby extended for one year from the tenth day of March, anno Domini eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, with the authority, powers, and duties now vested in them by law: *Provided*, That nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to extend the time for filing claims before said commission, or to enlarge its jurisdiction, or to authorize the filing of new claims.

SEC. 5. That the Commissioners of Claims shall not receive any evidence on behalf

of any claimant or claimants for the allowance of any claim or claims unless such evidence shall have been taken, presented, and filed by the tenth day of March, eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, except in rebuttal of evidence introduced on behalf of the government; and all claims wherein the evidence of the claimant or claimants is not so filed in the office of the Commissioners of Claims, and which have not been submitted to the commissioners for decision within the time herein limited, shall be barred forever thereafter; and the Commissioners of Claims shall report all such claims so barred to Congress at its next session thereafter.

Approved June 15, 1878.

SEC. 2. \* \* \* That said agents shall give notice to claimants, whose claims it is proposed to investigate, of the time and place of taking testimony, who shall have the right to cross-examine every witness who may testify in behalf of the government; and said agents shall also take, at the same time, the testimony of any and all witnesses who may be presented by the claimant, on his paying the expenses thereof; and all such testimony, both in behalf of the claimant and the government, shall be taken under the law and rules which usually govern the taking of testimony; and the judges of the Southern Claims Commission shall prescribe and publish rules for the taking of the testimony, and shall provide in all cases for full and fair notice to be given of the time and place thereof. \* \* \*

Approved June 23, 1879.

*Rules prescribed and published in conformity with the foregoing act.*

I. Notice shall be given personally to the claimant in each case, and in writing; and a copy of the notice shall be appended to the testimony taken under it.

II. The notice shall contain an accurate statement of the time when and the place where witnesses for the government are to be examined, and, usually, need contain nothing more.

III. Notice may be given as often as necessary in each case, care to be taken that time enough be afforded the claimant to attend after receipt of each notice.

IV. The right of cross-examination of government witnesses may be exercised by the claimant in person or by counsel, but not by both together; and the cross-examination must not wander into new or irrelevant matter.

V. In executing the requirement of the act, to "take, at the same time, the testimony of any and all witnesses who may be presented by the claimant," the agent must satisfy himself that the testimony expected from each witness, so presented, comes fairly within the designation of "rebutting evidence."

VI. The claimant's rights under the act are to be exercised in a diligent and reasonable manner, and not so as to waste the time and money of the government.

This claim is wholly disallowed.

#### REMARKS.

This large claim is presented by Mary Heinn, of New Orleans, Louisiana. Mrs. Heinn claims that all this property belonged to her in her sole and separate right. Her husband, John Heinn, was living when the claim was presented, but was not joined in the petition, having, as it was alleged, no interest in the claim. Mrs. Mary Heinn appeared before us and was examined as a witness on the 6th of December, 1876. In June or July, 1877, she died, and her husband, John Heinn, as the executor of her estate, appears to prosecute the claim.

As this is a large claim—for \$416,462.50—it becomes important to know how she came to be the owner of so large a property; and for this purpose to examine her testimony and see what have been her business and life and her means of acquiring property, and to consider the evidence of her husband in regard to it.

#### MARY HEINN'S TESTIMONY.

I.—MARY HEINN was a German by birth; born at Ulm. She came to this country in April, 1843. She had about \$50 left on her arrival. Three or four months after her arrival she married Zavier Berdon, a Frenchman, who had been here 5 or 6 years. First he had a beer brewery for a few years, but he gave that up and kept a large coffee-house "down below" and she kept the "Cincinnati Hotel" up stairs. They carried on this business from 1843 till he died, in 1856. She continued in the business of the hotel after his death. She did not own the hotel, but rented it.

On the 26th day of June, 1858, she married John Heinn. By the marriage contract between them all her property was to be her separate property. Article VI of the marriage contract says: "The property brought in marriage by the said intended wife amounts to \$12,000, consisting of \$6,000 in ready money; further, in notes, outstanding debts, and an establishment kept by her and known as the 'Cincinnati Hotel,' the whole valued at \$6,000 by said parties; which said ready money, notes, and establishment the said intended husband hereby acknowl-

edges to be in possession of; he having received the same from his intended wife, to be invested and administered for her benefit in such manner as she may hereafter decide upon, and for the whole of which he holds himself accountable." See Exhibit B.

*The \$50,000 from her aunt in Germany.*

Mrs. Heinn says that in May, 1862, she gave her husband from \$80,000 to \$100,000 in money, with which he bought for her the sugar and molasses described in this petition. When asked where she got that money, she says (p. 5): "Well, I done business for 17 years. I kept the Cincinnati Hotel, and I had an aunt in Europe and she willed me \$50,000, and I saved my money." Mr. Heinn says she gave him \$95,000 to invest for her in sugar and molasses, viz: \$65,000 in gold and bank-notes, and \$30,000 in Confederate money, then not much depreciated.

Mrs. Heinn states that in the year 1859 her aunt in Germany, whose name and residence she does not give except that it was in Baden, died and willed her \$50,000; and that she went over to Germany in 1859 and got the money and returned the same year to New Orleans, bringing the money with her; and she says, "I had it on me; some was in bank-notes and some was in gold."

(It is plain, from her and her husband's stories, that the gold she brought with her and which "she had on her" was not changed; that it was the same she gave her husband in May, 1862; that it must have amounted at least to \$42,000, weighing 153 pounds avoirdupois, and probably to \$52,000, weighing 191 pounds. This was a heavy weight for her to carry on her person.)

That she kept this money under the flooring of her house till May, 1862; that she also had other money which she kept in the same way, under the floor of the house; that she kept no bank account; that all the money she so had and kept amounted in May, 1862, to between \$80,000 and \$100,000; that in May 1862, one or two weeks after the Federals captured New Orleans, she gave all this money, amounting to between \$80,000 and \$100,000, to her husband, John Heinn, to invest for her best benefit, "to invest in sugar and molasses and put it on the bank of the Mississippi so I could get it." (Pages 2, 6, and 9.)

She does not state the amount of money she gave her husband more precisely than from \$80,000 to \$100,000. She says, "I don't know exactly how much there was." She says no person was present when she gave the money to her husband, and he gave no receipt for the money. That she took all this money from several places under the floor where she kept it; that her husband left the next day on his steamboat, the Drover, to go up the river, and took the money with him. He was a steamboat captain, engaged in the Red River trade, and running a steamboat between New Orleans and the Red River as far up as Grand Ecore. From the time he left, which was in the fore part of May, 1862, until after the close of the war, being about three years, she saw nothing more of him. That he wrote her a letter that he had bought 1,033 hogsheads of sugar and 1,400 barrels of molasses for her, and had put it in sugar-houses and warehouses. (The letter is not produced.) That it was bought in May and June, 1862, and remained in sugar-houses and warehouses till it was taken by United States transports in August, 1862.

She was informed in August, 1862, that all this property which had been so bought for her by her husband had been taken by the United States authorities on board the Ceres and other United States vessels

and brought chiefly to New Orleans; and, although she was informed of this as early as August, 1862, by Captain Kendall, who was Captain of the *Ceres*, when a considerable part of the sugar was so seized and brought down to New Orleans, she never made any effort to get pay for it, never complained to any of the Federal officers, to the quartermaster or to General Butler, that this large amount of property had been taken from her; never told anybody of it; never mentioned the circumstance to anybody in the world.

When asked:

Q. When did you first mention it or talk about it?

She replied,

A. It was when I got my bill in.

Q. Never until you made your petition here?—A. No, sir; not before.

And when asked further “why she did not make some effort to get pay for it when the facts were all fresh and the evidence ready at hand”, answers: “I did not know hardly how to begin. Everything was so upset then that I could not attend to nothing.”

Such is Mrs. Heinn’s story.

On its face it bears all the marks of improbability and falsehood. It is not corroborated by any other testimony, such as ought to have been and might have been procured, if she tells the truth. It is supported only by the testimony of her husband; and as to the taking of the sugar, by the four witnesses hereafter named.

#### JOHN HEINN’S TESTIMONY.

II.—JOHN HEINN, the husband, also appeared before us and was orally examined. He was a steamboat captain—owned the *Drover*—and in May, 1862, two or three weeks after the capture of New Orleans, by permission of General Butler, went up the river on the *Drover* with a citizens’ committee to get and bring back immediately provisions for the citizens of New Orleans. On this occasion he says his wife gave him \$65,000 and some odd hundreds in bank-notes and gold, and \$30,000 in Confederate money—in all over \$95,000—to invest for her in sugar and molasses. He says he also took \$26,000 in greenbacks and \$56,000 in Confederate money, being his own funds, which he intended to invest in cotton for himself.

He was married to her June 26, 1858. She says that her aunt in Germany died in 1859 and willed her \$50,000; and that she went to Europe and got the \$50,000, and returned that year—the year after her marriage to him—and brought the money *on her person*.

He is asked (p. 158):

Q. You said your wife inherited this property from an aunt; when was that—at what time?

A. I don’t know; I didn’t question her nothing about it. I had been in such trouble at that time that I don’t remember.

Q. Did she inherit it after you married her?

A. No, sir; I suppose she had it before.

Q. You never heard after you were married to her of her inheriting any money?

A. She never told me anything about it.

Q. Did you ever hear after you were married to her of her inheriting \$50,000 from an aunt?

A. No, sir; she never told me anything about it.

In his examination, and on pages 163 and 164 (to which we refer), where he is distinctly asked whether from the time of his marriage, June, 1858, to the time that he and his wife counted the gold and bank-notes, May,

1862, he ever knew or heard of her having any other money than the \$12,000 she brought to him in marriage, he answers—

No, sir; she never told me nothing about it until she was ready to hand it over.

If it were really true that within a year after the marriage of Mr. and Mrs. Heinn the news had come to her that her aunt in Germany had died and left her by will \$50,000, and that thereupon she left home and went to Europe and got the \$50,000 and came back and brought the money with her; if all this were really true, would she not have told her husband of it, and would he not have known of it? Would he not have known why she left him during the first year of marriage and went to Europe? In the marriage contract she put into his hands the \$12,000 she "brought in marriage," and made him her agent. He says he was rich; she does not profess to have distrusted him; on the contrary, they appear to have lived on terms of affection and confidence. If she was willing to put it all in his hands in May, 1862, to invest it for her, why did she never tell him during the three years before that she had it? Why lie out of the interest of so large a sum for three years?

So, too, he says (p. 149) that his wife gave him, the day or night before he started to go up the river, in the fore part of May, 1862, "\$30,000 in Confederate money and \$65,000 and some few hundred dollars in bank-notes and gold."

Q. Your wife gave you that?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Did you and she count it?

A. Yes, sir; we counted it.

Q. Did you count it the day before you left?

A. We were counting all night one night.

Q. I suppose that was the night before you left, wasn't it?

A. I think so; the night before or the day and night before. A person has to be quiet about such a thing.

Q. You cannot exactly tell how much gold there was and how much city notes?

A. No, sir.

Q. But more than half was gold?

A. O, yes, sir.

Q. Did you know that your wife had that gold, and how long had you known it?

A. I knew she had some money lying idle, but I did not ask her.

Q. Did you really suppose she had any gold yourself?

A. I didn't know.

Q. The gold—you didn't say where she got that from, did you?

A. No, sir; she had it in the house somewhere.

Q. But you don't know where?

A. No, sir.

Q. And you didn't know then, did you?

A. No, sir; until she told me she had so much money and wanted me to take it along.

Q. But she didn't tell you where she had kept it?

A. No, sir.

Q. You didn't know that?

A. No, sir.

Q. You had been living in the house for a month?

A. O, for a long time.

Q. But you didn't know where she kept it and she didn't tell you where she kept it?

A. No, sir.

We must say that we think that this alleged ignorance of her having money, and of how she kept it, cannot be true, if she really had the money. There is no reason whatever why she should not have taken her husband into full confidence in the matter.

On page 154 of his testimony, when speaking of the \$65,000 and some hundreds in gold and bank-notes which she gave him, he says, "I sup-

pose there was over \$40,000 in gold. No; \$13,000 in bank-notes and the balance was in gold; I think it was."

Q. And the rest must have been \$52,000 in gold. Where did you carry that on your boat?

A. It could not have been that much. I had \$30,000 in greenbacks—

[he had previously said the \$30,000 was in Confederate money]—

and \$65,000 in gold and bank-notes.

Q. Of that \$65,000 \$13,000 was in bank-notes?

A. Yes, sir; \$13,000 or \$23,000; I couldn't say which.

Q. If it was \$13,000, then there would be \$52,000 in gold; and if it was \$23,000, there would be \$42,000 in gold. Can't you recollect which?

A. No, sir; I cannot.

He then proceeds to tell (we deem it unnecessary to detail the testimony) that he took this money on board of his boat when he started to go up the river, and put it in a safe which he had in his private room. Nobody saw him take it down to the boat or put it into the safe. Nobody knew of it. He carried the gold in a large belt, and some in bags, too. He says he took the bags "in my arms, so that nobody could notice." And immediately after he says that "he is sure that people could have seen the bags under his arm, but they didn't know what kind of money was in them." He carried most of the gold in the belt and once or twice in a bag.

The gold must have weighed from 153 to 191 pounds avoirdupois. The distance from his house to the boat was seven squares, about two-fifths of a mile.

This part of the story seems to us improbable. His account of what he did with the money when he got to his plantation seems to us also highly improbable. When he started he had in his little safe in his private room (not the large safe in the office) the \$95,000 he had received from his wife and \$78,000 of his own money.

He says when he got to the landing on his plantation at West Baton Rouge he took all his gold and put it in his little safe in his house—not an iron safe, for he had none there, but there was a box sunk in the wall with a door to the box, and this appears to have been fixed in the desk, and there he put the gold in the box in the desk. (His account of the matter is very obscure as to how the box and the desk were fixed.) He carried up the gold there from the boat in the evening, late in the night, so that nobody knew it, and he does not know whether he went two or three times or once. (He could not have carried it in less than three loads, and hardly at that.) He then went off up the river, leaving the gold there, and it was at least seven or eight days before he went back. Before he returned he was arrested by the Confederates, as he says, his steamboat was taken away from him, and he was taken down to Opelousas, La., before he was released. It would seem that it must have been more than eight days before he got back to his house.

That he should have left the gold in this wooden box or desk at his plantation and have gone off on his boat upon these other errands, leaving the gold exposed to all the chances and perils of war, seems to us highly improbable and unnatural.

So, too, he says when he left New Orleans he left with the permission of General Butler and as one of a committee of citizens to go up the river and buy provisions for the suffering citizens of New Orleans, and that he expected to return immediately with his boat and provisions to New Orleans. Going upon such an errand, he would have no opportunity to invest his own money in cotton or his wife's in sugar and molasses. He was to return to New Orleans immediately. He knew this

when he left New Orleans, and, knowing it, would he take this large sum of his wife's money to carry up to his plantation and leave it in a wooden box or desk while he was buying his provisions and returning to New Orleans? He would rather have told his wife that the money would be safer in her hands than up at his plantation and in his absence. His whole story is full of inconsistencies and improbabilities.

On this point we call attention to his evidence on pages 147, 148, and 149, and to his evasions and inconsistencies.

His inability to tell of whom he bought the sugar and molasses when first examined by Mr. Richmond—naming only four names, and afterwards, when orally testifying before us, giving a list of names on a paper written by Kendall—is to be noted as affecting his credibility.

In regard to Mrs. Heinn's having the sum of 95,000 and some odd hundred dollars of money in May, 1862, we would respectfully call attention to the following facts and suggestions:

1. The only evidence to show that she had this large sum of money is her own testimony and that of her husband. No other witness ever saw it or heard of it.

2. If she received the \$50,000 as a bequest from her aunt in Germany in the year 1859, the will of the aunt, or a copy of it, should have been produced in proof. Her name and residence could be given, and the name and residence of her executor; and the records of the court acting upon the will could have been produced, or a copy of them, to show the bequest to Mrs. Heinn, and the distribution and payment of the devise of \$50,000 to her; and the executor who must have paid it to her could show the payment to her by the receipt which he doubtless took at the time he paid it to her. Now, nothing of the kind is attempted to be proved by the claimant. Nor are the names and residence of the aunt and executor given, so that the government could make inquiry as to whether the story was true or not. She says her aunt lived in Baden, which contains about 6,000 square miles and a population of a million and a half.

3. As to the remaining \$45,000, it is claimed that it came from a former husband, who died in 1856, and from the profits she made in her business of keeping the Cincinnati Hotel.

Now, if her husband died in 1856, leaving her \$40,000 or \$50,000, or any other considerable sum, that ought to appear in the proceedings regarding the settlement of his estate. Nothing of the kind is shown.

She had four or five children by her former husband. If she had a large amount of money from him, they, as his heirs, would be entitled to their share of his estate, and all this ought to appear in the proceedings of the probate court. But nothing of this kind is shown.

In inquiring as to how much she could have made by keeping the Cincinnati Hotel between April, 1843, and May, 1862, we would refer to her replies to that question on page 56. They are evasive. The hotel was an inferior one, and charging low prices. Yet, if her story is true, she had bought before the war, and it must have been from the proceeds of her business, the new Basin and Esplanade and other real estate and negroes, amounting to \$33,000. And to that must be added this \$45,000, making \$78,000 profits from the Cincinnati Hotel in about seventeen years. This should be proved by other testimony, and not left to stand on her and her husband's word.

The only evidence that she had anything from her husband is her general statement that they made money; and Mr. John Heinn's statement that he, the former husband, had plenty of money, and that she had money from him. But such proof is wholly insufficient to establish

the alleged fact that she had a large amount of money from her deceased husband.

4. Her former husband died in 1856, and she married Mr. Heinn June 26, 1858, and all the estate she then claimed as her separate property, as appears from the marriage contract, was \$6,000 in ready money, and \$6,000 in notes, accounts, and the Cincinnati Hotel.

If there had been \$45,000 in ready money, instead of \$6,000, would it not have been mentioned in the marriage contract?

5. Her husband, Heinn, knew of no other money belonging to her than the \$12,000 of the marriage contract until May, 1862. That \$12,000 was used by him in trade and speculation, and, as he testifies, formed no part of the \$95,000 which she gave him in May, 1862.

There is nothing whatever in the testimony in regard to her keeping the Cincinnati Hotel and the profits from that business to justify the opinion that she could thereby have earned the \$45,000 or any considerable portion of it.

6. A person doing a large and profitable business as a hotel-keeper, or in any other profitable industry, would, in the ordinary usage of business, have an account in bank, and deposit moneys in the bank, certainly, if so large a sum as \$45,000 was on hand. In such case the books of the bank would show the deposits and that she had the money. But this ordinary mode of doing business and this usual kind of proof do not exist in the case; but, instead of such ordinary course of business, she kept \$95,000 hidden in several places under the floor of her Cincinnati Hotel. She thus lost the use of the \$50,000 from 1859 to May, 1862. All this is in a high degree improbable, and the only proof we have of it is her statement.

7. Her husband even did not know she had this \$95,000 until the day, in May, 1862, when she got ready to hand it over to him to invest for her. He does not appear to have known why she went to and returned from Europe in 1859. He knew nothing about this money from the aunt till May, 1862, and supposes that his wife had it before they were married, in June, 1858. He does not even know the name of the aunt.

8. The fact that she took no receipt from her husband for the money in May, 1862; and that when he got to his plantation he put the gold into a wooden box in a desk in the wall (such seems to be his vague description of the place where he left it); and the fact that when he left New Orleans he expected to return immediately with provisions for the suffering poor, have already been commented on as disparaging his testimony.

Upon their own evidence alone, and its improbability, we do not believe that she had the \$95,000, or any other sum, that she gave to him to invest for her. Nor do we believe that he took any money of hers to invest for her when he went up the river in May, 1862.

We do not believe that he had \$78,000 of his own money when he went up the river. His story that he was to expend his own money in buying provisions for the citizens of New Orleans, and that he expended over \$20,000, is highly improbable. So far from his having had this large sum of money of his own, Mr. Louis Bouchereau, who went up the Red River on the Drover as assistant commissioner of subsistence to obtain supplies for the city, says, "Captain Heinn then borrowed of me something over \$500 and gave me a draft for the same on Mr. H. Lonesdale, of New Orleans."

If he had had \$78,000 of his own money, to say nothing of his wife's, would he have been borrowing this \$500 of Mr. Bouchereau? Would he have given a draft on Mr. Lonesdale which he knew would be dis-

honored, and which was dishonored soon after? And when Mr. Bouche-reau went to Mrs. Heinn with the draft to get her to pay, it would she have said that she had no money, that her husband had left her none, and that she did not know how she was going to live; and have expressed no surprise at her husband's borrowing the \$500 and making the draft, and have made no allusion whatever to the large sums he carried with him?

III.—Of the evidence of George W. Kendall, Peter F. Kendall, Frank Ottendorfer, and John H. Harris.

The claimant has introduced four witnesses, viz, George W. Kendall, Peter F. Kendall, Frank Ottendorfer, and John H. Harris, to prove that a large number of hogsheads of sugar and barrels of molasses were taken from Waterloo, Hermitage and Cook's Landings, all within a mile of each other and near Port Hudson, in August, 1862, by United States transports, and carried to New Orleans and some to Baton Rouge, and delivered to the United States quartermaster. These witnesses testify that the vessels called the "Ceres," the "Sallie Robinson," the "Time and Tide," and the "Empire Parish" brought the hogsheads of sugar and barrels of molasses from Waterloo, Hermitage, and Cook's Landings to New Orleans, in August, 1862. The amounts which they brought would seem, from the testimony of these witnesses, to amount to the quantities set forth in the petition, viz, 1,033 hogsheads of sugar and 1,400 barrels of molasses.

GEORGE W. KENDALL says he was in command of the Ceres, and that he took from Hermitage and Cook's Landings, in August, 1862, 250 hogsheads of sugar, marked "Mary Heinn" or "M" "H," and delivered it in part to the quartermaster at Baton Rouge, and the rest to Colonel Shaffer, who was quartermaster at New Orleans. That the Sallie Robinson and the Time and Tide were at Waterloo and the other landings, and took on hogsheads of sugar and barrels of molasses marked "Mary Heinn" and "M." "H." That he was put in command of the Ceres in July, 1862, and brought the sugar down in August, 1862. That Waterloo, Hermitage, and Cook's Landings are above Port Hudson and between that place and Bayou Sara, and on the west bank of the river.

PETER F. KENDALL testifies that he sold 116 hogsheads of sugar to Capt. John Heinn, hauled it to the above landings, and marked it "Mary Heinn" or "M. H., N. O., La." And that in August, 1862, the Sallie Robinson, Capt. Ed. Ham, took 400 hogsheads of sugar, marked in the same way, besides the 116 hogsheads of sugar which he sold to Captain Heinn, making about 516 hogsheads of sugar belonging to Mrs. Heinn. That the Ceres also took about 200 hogsheads of her sugar, and the Time and Tide at one time as much more.

FRANK OTTENDORFER testifies that he was pilot on the Sallie Robinson from June, 1862, for eight months. That the Sallie Robinson took on at the above landings from 350 to 500 hogsheads of sugar and a great many barrels of molasses, and carried them to New Orleans. That the hogsheads and barrels were marked "Mary Heinn" or "M" "H," and that the Sallie Robinson was a United States transport in government employ.

JOHN H. HARRIS testifies that he was employed by Captain Shaffer, quartermaster at New Orleans, as a detective, to watch property that came to the levees at New Orleans on government transports, and to report to him when such transports came in, and to place a watchman over the freight until Colonel Shaffer could send his clerks down to the boats. That he was so employed under Shaffer, Mahler, and Flanders,

in government employ, in 1862. That in June, 1862, the Time and Tide brought into New Orleans from 250 to 300 hogsheads of sugar and between 300 and 400 barrels of molasses, which was taken by Captain Shaffer, United States quartermaster. That a good deal of sugar was marked "Mary Heinn" and "M" "H." That the Time and Tide made a second trip in June, 1862, and brought from 350 to 400 hogsheads of sugar, a good portion of which was marked the same as the other, and that the sugar was hauled to the government warehouse in Fulton street. That about the 10th or 15th of July he made a trip as steersman on the Sallie Robinson, and that she took on sugar and molasses at Waterloo and Hermitage marked "M" "H" and "Mary Heinn" and brought it to New Orleans. That Ed. Ham was captain of the Sallie Robinson and Frank Ottenderfer was pilot. That from 700 to 800 hogsheads of sugar marked "M" "H" or "Mary Heinn" he saw taken from United States transports and delivered to the warehouses or United States quartermaster, and also about 700 barrels of molasses in the same way.

If the testimony of these four witnesses is to be believed it greatly strengthens the claimant's case. It shows that a large quantity of sugar and molasses, of about the amount she claims, *marked with her name*, was taken by government transports from the landings where Captain Heinn says the sugar and molasses he bought for her were to be delivered, and brought to New Orleans and delivered to the quartermaster. If she had the sugar, she must have had the money to buy it.

Our agent, Mr. Richmond, was sent to New Orleans and to the vicinity of these landings to investigate the claim. He has taken the depositions of 37 witnesses and has made a report in the case detailing the testimony so taken. We refer to the depositions so taken by him and to his report, which contains a full summary of all the evidence on this point.

1. It appears that the reputation of George W. Kendall, Peter F. Kendall, Frank Ottendorfer, and John H. Harris is very bad for truth and veracity. Eleven witnesses were examined by Mr. Richmond, of whom nine impeached Peter F. Kendall, eight George W. Kendall, five Ottendorfer, and six Harris. Among them are B. F. Flanders and Judge Adams, respectable and leading citizens of New Orleans.

One of the four above, John H. Harris, says he knows George W. and Peter F. Kendall intimately; that their reputation for truth and veracity is bad; that he would not believe them under oath.

Peter F. Kendall reciprocates the compliment, and says that Harris's reputation is bad, and that he would not believe him under oath.

2. It appears to be fully proven that George W. and Peter F. Kendall have fraudulently gotten up this claim, and are to have a share of the profits if it is allowed.

C. W. KILLBORN, who was a provost-marshal at Baton Rouge in July and August, 1862, testifies that in 1874 George W. Kendall proposed to him to swear for Mary Heinn to prove her claim, and said that he (Kendall) was to receive a big bonus himself if successful, and "could afford and would pay me" (Killborn) "well for my services." He says, "I received the impression that he was to have one-half."

CHARLES S. RANDALL testifies that in March or April, 1877, George W. and Peter F. Kendall introduced him to Mrs. Heinn and John Heinn, and said they wanted him as a witness for Mrs. Heinn. That his passage and expenses to Washington would be paid, and if the claim succeeded he should have \$5,000. Witness in reality knew nothing about the claim, but was wanted to swear that he saw sugar and molasses, marked "Mary Heinn" and "M." "H.," taken from Hermitage and Cook's

Landings on the Sallie Robinson and Ceres to Baton Rouge and New Orleans. That he was required to visit Kendall's house morning and evening. (See p. 31.) Kendall held a sort of sham court and played the part of judge, and Randall was the witness under examination. That he was drilled by Kendall as to his testimony. Questions were put to him and he was told what answers he was expected to make. That the witness was to say that he was buying sugar and molasses for Mr. Reed, a partner of Colonel Butler, the brother of General Butler. The witness gives a full and curious account of how he was drilled by Kendall to answer all questions. This drilling went on from two to three weeks, once or twice a day, on Saturday nights and all day Sunday. The Kendalls and Captain Heinn were engaged in the matter. Frank Ottendorfer was spoken of as a good witness. The witness says, "I thought this opportunity was the best that could offer to enable me to reach Washington, where, if summoned as a witness in favor of the claimant, it was my intention to deny all knowledge of the matter, as was the truth, and to refuse to give any testimony whatever. I never promised to testify, but my manner and deportment were intended to mislead them, and to give them that conviction. It is my belief that they finally mistrusted my sincerity, and for that reason decided not to trust me and left me behind.

Mr. Richmond says, in regard to the credibility of this witness, Randall's testimony has never been impeached in any court, and I found him on the United States jury at Billings's court; and as Randall was personally known to the judge, who considered him a fit jurymen, I concluded to take his testimony. I am fully satisfied he told the truth in the Heinn matter.

3. RICHARD CLUFF, police officer at New Orleans, testifies that John H. Harris and Frank Ottendorfer were convicted of cow-stealing and sentenced for six months to the parish prison, and served out their sentence. (See, also, the testimony of Oliver S. Burdette as to Harris having been in prison.)

Mr. Richmond says in his report: "At the time Harris and Ottendorfer claim to have been in the United States service during the summer and fall of 1862, they were both in the parish prison in New Orleans serving out a sentence for cattle-stealing. In addition to the testimony of Cluff, I have examined the records of the parish prison and find that Cluff was right."

4. In contradiction of Kendall, who testifies that a portion of the sugar on the Ceres was landed at Baton Rouge in July or August, 1862, Mr. Richmond has taken the testimony of Frank Sherfey, who was detailed under Lieutenant Hinkle, the receiving clerk, to receive and check for all property delivered or turned over to the post commissary at Baton Rouge from July 7 to August 2, 1862, who says that no sugar or molasses were received at Baton Rouge from any vessels landing there during that time, and that no sugar landed there was marked "Mary Heinn," or "M. H."

C. W. KILLBORN, provost-marshal at Baton Rouge in July and August, 1862, says it was part of his official duty to look after sugar and molasses brought to or taken from Baton Rouge. That no sugar or molasses was landed at Baton Rouge by either the Ceres or Sallie Robinson in July or August, 1862. He would have known it if there had been. There was a superabundance of sugar and molasses at Baton Rouge for the troops. On the 7th of August, two days after the battle at Baton Rouge, he went from Baton Rouge to New Orleans on the Ceres with the official report of the fight, and forty-eight hours after went

back on her as despatch-boat. Never heard of any sugar marked "Mary Heinn."

WILLIAM ROY, captain at Baton Rouge, in July and until August 25, 1862, was detailed to take care of sugar and molasses there; was on the levee every day; Ceres and Sallie Robinson never left any sugar there; would have known it if they had.

HUGH VASEY, deck-hand on Ceres from July, 1862, to October, 1862; on one trip, last of July or 1st of August, Ceres brought from 50 to 100 hogsheads of sugar to New Orleans; don't think it came from Pointe Coupée or W. Baton Rouge.

MICHAEL FOLEY, second mate on Ceres from August 10, 1862, till October, when she blew up, says, during that time the Ceres never took on any sugar from up the river; thinks she was discharging sugar, from 100 to 200 hogsheads marked "M" "H" when he went on her. (This is the only witness that Mr. Richmond could find that tends in the slightest degree to corroborate the claimant's evidence. See his report as to Foley's testimony.)

But the most satisfactory proof is the New Orleans Price Current, a commercial newspaper printed at New Orleans, showing all arrivals and departures of vessels and of freight. The files of this paper show that on the 29th of July the Ceres arrived at New Orleans from Vicksburg with 15 hogsheads of sugar to order, and on the 19th of August, 1862, the Ceres from Bayou Sara brought 43 hogsheads of sugar and 16 barrels of molasses to Colonel Shaffer, and 14 hogsheads and 14 barrels of sugar to Mr. Wiley.

This evidence clearly proves that the testimony of George W. Kendall, as to bringing 250 hogsheads of sugar, marked "Mary Heinn," or "M" "H," in August, 1862, to Baton Rouge and New Orleans, is false.

The testimony of Lemuel L. Lincoln, commercial reporter for the New Orleans Price Current, and the files of the New Orleans Price Current, show that during the months of May, June, July, and August, 1862, no other arrival of the Ceres with produce is mentioned than those above referred to.

That the Sallie Robinson arrived at New Orleans August 25, 1862, with 74 bales and 100 bags of cotton, and there was no other arrival of the Sallie Robinson during those four months.

That the Time and Tide arrived at New Orleans July 30, 1862, with 104 hogsheads of sugar for Carroll, Hoyt & Co.; August 3, 1862, with 36 hogsheads of sugar for A. Miltonberger & Co., and 31 hogsheads of sugar for Foley, Avery & Co.; and on August 26, 1862, with 70 hogsheads of sugar from Millandon's plantation; and that there were no other arrivals of the Time and Tide during the four months.

It seems in the highest degree improbable that those vessels could have arrived at New Orleans in July or August, 1862, with 1,033 hogsheads of sugar and 1,400 barrels of molasses belonging to Mrs. Heinn, together with other large quantities belonging to other parties, for Colonel Shaffer, Q. M. of the post, and no mention ever made in the New Orleans Price Current, while the arrival of these transports at certain times during those months with sugar for other consignees is noted and published.

5. Further to contradict the testimony of John Heinn, of George W. and Peter F. Kendall, and of Frank Ottendorfer, as to there being large quantities of sugar and molasses at Hermitage and Cook's Landings and Waterloo, marked "Mary Heinn," or "M" "H," Mr. Richmond has taken the depositions of citizens at Hermitage and Cook's Landings and Waterloo, including several of the warehouse-keepers at those

places, to prove that there was no sugar or molasses belonging to Mary Heinn, or marked with her name or initials, at those places in 1862, either in the storehouses or outside on the bank, and that *no sugar whatever was carried away by Federal transports from those places in 1862.*

Mrs. Heinn says her husband wrote her that the sugar and molasses were in *storehouses or warehouses*; Heinn says *they were not in storehouses or in charge of anybody*, but simply left on the bank of the river at the landings—certainly a most negligent and careless mode of doing business. If in a storehouse, the books kept by the storekeeper would show; but Heinn's evidence makes such proof impossible, by saying it was on the bank, and in charge of nobody; hence the seeming negligence.

Thus, at Hermitage Landing, Mr. H. E. TRUEDEAU, who owned the landing and warehouse there in 1862 and 1863, and was at the landing all the summer of 1862, says that John Heinn and Mary Heinn had no sugar in the warehouse or on the banks of the river at that place to his knowledge; saw no sugar or molasses on the bank in 1862, and none taken in 1862 by United States transports.

Mr. ANDRE CASTY, JOHN J. RICHARD, and N. G. CHUST, who lived at Hermitage Landing, in view of the warehouse and landing, and who were at the landing and the warehouse frequently and almost every day, say that there was no sugar or molasses on the bank of the river or near the landing there marked "Mary Henin," or "M" "H," and that none was carried away from the landing in May, June, July, and August, 1862, in transports.

At Cook's Landing there was only one warehouse, kept by Simon Herman. WILLIAM DAVIS, who was employed by Simon Herman to take charge of the warehouse at Cook's Landing in 1862 and 1863, says that no sugar or molasses was taken from the warehouse in summer or fall of 1862; that there was no sugar or molasses outside of the warehouse on the bank; that he knows John Heinn, and neither he nor Mary Heinn had any sugar in the warehouse nor on the bank in 1862, and that he never heard of sugar or molasses marked "Mary Heinn," or "M. H."

Mr. BETOINERE, a cousin of Simon Herman, and who lives at Cook's Landing, and Mr. N. MAGNETTE, a merchant, who lived within 50 yards of the warehouse at Cook's Landing, testify fully and in substance like Mr. William Davis.

At Waterloo Landing, LOUIS LINDSLEY, a merchant, living at Waterloo, and EDWARD KOCH, a blacksmith, and ALPHONS POURCIAN, postmaster and justice of the peace at Waterloo, state that they lived near the landing and in sight of the landing and warehouses, and that no sugar or molasses was taken away from Waterloo Landing in 1862 by United States transports; that Mr. Verneuil's sugar was taken in 1863, and was afterward paid for, as Mr. Verneuil said; and that no hogsheads of sugar or barrels of molasses marked "Mary Heinn" or "M. H." were at Waterloo Landing in 1862.

We refer to the full abstract of the testimony in Mr. Richmond's report and to the original depositions.

6. Further to contradict John Heinn as to his purchasing sugar of divers persons named by him—

Mr. Richmond reports as follows:

Mr. Heinn says he purchased sugar and molasses of the following persons:

Mr. Winters; he is dead.

Mr. Cain; he is dead.

Mr. LeBlanc; he is dead.

Mr. Dequere; he is dead.

Mr. Ware; he is supposed to be dead, but his manager, James McVea, says no sugar was sold Heinn in 1862. (See his deposition.)

Mrs. Sterling, from Vance, her manager. Mr. Richmond says Mrs. S. was in Saint Louis, and he could not get her testimony.

Mr. Denny. Richmond did not take his deposition, but reports that Denny says he sold Heinn no sugar or molasses.

John T. Jetter, James McCallum. Heinn says he bought their sugar through Peter Kendall, and Kendall says he bought 73 hogsheads of Jetter and 43 of McCallum. Jetter is dead. McCallum testifies he sold no sugar or molasses to Kendall.

Mr. Pritchard (or Pitcher), Mr. Robin. These two witnesses testify that they sold no sugar or molasses to Heinn in 1862. Robin is the only planter of that name. (See their depositions.)

Thus of all the persons who are now living of whom Heinn says he bought sugar, all, except Mrs. Sterling, deny that they sold him sugar in 1862; and Mrs. Sterling's testimony could not be obtained without going to Saint Louis.

*Summary on this point.*

1. The character of these four witnesses is thoroughly impeached for truth and veracity.

2. George W. and Peter F. Kendall are shown to have a large interest in the claim, and to have been engaged in the manufacture of falsehood and perjury to sustain it.

3. Ottendorfer and Harris are shown not to have been in government employment, and to have been convicted of larceny, and to have been punished therefor by imprisonment for six months.

4. It is satisfactorily shown, by numerous witnesses and by convincing evidence, that the statement of George W. Kendall, as to bringing down 250 hogsheads of Mary Heinn's sugar to Baton Rouge and New Orleans, on the Ceres, in August, 1862, is false.

That the statements of the witnesses as to the bringing down of sugar and molasses, belonging to Mary Heinn, from Waterloo, Hermitage, and Cook's Landings, to New Orleans, in 1862, on the Sallie Robinson, and the Time and Tide, and Empire Parish, are also wholly false.

5. That the statements of John Heinn and the other witnesses as to his purchase of sugar and molasses for Mary Heinn, and as to there being large quantities of sugar and molasses marked "Mary Heinn," or "M. H.," at the three landings, and of its being taken away by United States transports in 1862, are also false.

6. That the statements of John Harris, as to his having been employed by Quartermaster Shaffer, by Mahlen, and by Flanders, to take charge of the receipt of sugar, molasses, and other produce landed at New Orleans, and that he saw 700 hogsheads of sugar, marked "Mary Heinn," landed there and taken to the government storehouse, are also false.

The testimony of Flanders and of others shows that he was not so employed by the United States Government.

In his testimony, taken by Mr. Richmond (pp. 61, 66), he says that he was not in government employ; that the sugar was landed the last days of May or the first of June, 1862, from the Time and Tide; that the amount was 75 to 100 hogsheads; and that he never knew any other lot marked "Mary Heinn" or "M. H." taken by the government.

It will be perceived that this statement is wholly inconsistent with his testimony given orally before this commission.

No attempt has been made by the claimant to rebut the evidence taken by Mr. Richmond on behalf of the government. The evidence to impeach Captain Heinn and the four witnesses stands uncontradicted.

We deem it our duty, in this connection, to notice the application which was made to us by Mr. Daniels, of counsel for the claimant, in regard to the testimony taken by Mr. Richmond, and Mr. Daniels's request that the testimony of witnesses in New Orleans might be taken in rebuttal thereof, with a list of the names of eighty witnesses whose testimony he wished to have taken in rebuttal of the testimony taken by the government. (See his letters of April 8, 1878, April 12, 1878, and May 7, 1878.) The last inclosing the affidavit of Captain Heinn and Mr. Fellows.

To this application the commissioners replied by letters dated April 10, 1878, and April 26, 1878, showing that the commissioners were prohibited by law from taking the testimony of the claimant in rebuttal, as requested, and could not therefore grant the request, but that they would extend the time for rebuttal by the claimant, if he desired, as long as they could.

As the letter from Mr. Daniels stated that Mr. Richmond had taken the testimony of most disreputable characters, as he, Mr. Daniels, was informed, and Captain Heinn had stated that Mr. Richmond gave him no notice to attend the examination of the witnesses, we felt it to be our duty to send these letters of Mr. Daniel and Captain Heinn to Mr. Richmond, that he might know of the charges against him of misconduct and might reply to them.

*As to notice of the taking of the government testimony.*

1. On the 26th of May, 1878, Mr. Richmond sent to the commissioners the affidavits of C. W. Killborn, of S. M. Eaton, of Thaddeus Waterman, and of himself, showing that Mrs. Mary Heinn, and Captain John Heinn, were fully notified that he was then about to take the depositions of witnesses on behalf of the government in this claim, and that he should be glad if they would attend and cross-examine the witnesses. That he first took the depositions of Mary Heinn and John Heinn, and after their depositions were finished they were notified to be present at the examination of the other witnesses from day to day and to cross-examine them, if they desired. This was on the 24th of February. The next witnesses taken were Michael Foley and Hugh Vasey, on the 27th of February, 1877, and Mr. Killborn states that, after serving a subpoena on Foley and Vasey to appear and testify in the case, he notified Captain John Heinn that Mr. Richmond would take their testimony that day, and that he, Captain Heinn, was requested and desired to be present. That Captain Heinn did come to the room while the testimony of Foley was being taken, remained a short time, and went away.

It also appears from the testimony of Waterman and Richmond that Richmond notified Captain Heinn, on Saturday, December 29, that he should go on Monday, the 31st, to Pointe Coupée to take the testimony of witnesses in his wife's claim, and that he wished Captain Heinn to go with him and be present and cross-examine the witnesses; that on Monday, the 31st, Waterman called on Richmond, just before his departure on the steamer Katie, and informed him that Captain Heinn desired to know whether he was certainly going on the steamer Katie that day.

Richmond replied that he was sure to go, and requested Waterman to inform Captain Heinn, and that he would be glad to have him go along, which information was communicated to Heinn the same day and before the departure of the boat.

As the only evidence to the contrary is the affidavit of Captain Heinn, we think it fairly proved that the claimant and her husband, Captain Heinn, were fully and fairly notified of the time and place of the taking of the testimony on behalf of the government and had opportunity to be present and cross-examine the witnesses.

*As to the credibility of the government witnesses.*

In reply to the charge that Mr. Richmond took the testimony of witnesses of most disreputable character on behalf of the government, he replies in his letter of April 23, 1878, "I do not know of one who is not a credible witness in all the courts of New Orleans," and he then particularly speaks of Charles S. Randall.

We refer to Mr. Richmond's reports of April 23, 1878, and May 26, 1878, and the accompanying depositions.

On the 1st of June, 1878, Mr. Daniels was notified of these letters from Mr. Richmond.

More than a year has since elapsed and no rebutting testimony has been taken, nor has any attempt been made to disprove the statements of Killborn, Eaton, Waterman, and Richmond as to notice to Heinn, nor any attempt made to sustain the character for veracity of the Kendalls, Ottendorfer, and Harris.

*In conclusion.*

We are obliged to regard this claim as an attempt to commit a great fraud upon the government and to sustain it by gross perjury.

*As to loyalty.*

IV.—Before closing this report, we deem it proper to make some comments upon the evidence to sustain Mrs. Heinn's loyalty.

1. Mrs. Heinn's own testimony on the point will be found on pages 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46. The substance of her testimony is that her feelings were on the Union side, but she never talked with anybody on the subject; was perfectly silent on the subject. Never said anything to her most intimate friends.

That she never did anything in any way to aid the Union cause. Never visited the hospitals in New Orleans or contributed in any way to the Union cause, except that when soldiers and officers called at her hotel she gave them to eat and never charged anything for it. Such is the substance of her testimony.

GEORG W. KENDALL (p. 70) at first didn't recollect of talking with Mrs. Heinn during the war, but then says: "O, I recollect, since you speak about it, of talking to her in New Orleans at the time Butler issued the order that Confederate money should not be taken; I cannot tell what the conversation was, but it occurred to my mind she was a very strong Union woman."

This and "common report" of people who knew her is all that he knows about her loyalty.

PETER F. KENDALL says: "I have often heard it said that she was a d—d old Dutch abolitionist. That is the substance of all he testifies to.

Captain JOHN HEINN. His testimony in regard to his wife's loyalty will be found on pages 184, 185. He says that she talked right out to everybody. She said what I said, that we should die by it. She would talk out openly; always told everybody. They called her an abolitionist and all those things, but she didn't care for that. She didn't speak to those bad people, but to gentlemen and ladies she spoke openly. She spoke openly to her friends and acquaintances. She didn't go about to different places talking aloud to people. When asked, "Do you think she ever told a Confederate person that she was a Union woman?" he answers, "O, yes, sir; everybody knew that."

It will be perceived that this testimony of Captain Heinn is in *direct contradiction* to the *testimony of his wife*, who says she never spoke to anybody about it.

FRANK OTTENDORFER says that she was always considered loyal in the neighborhood. Had a splendid reputation for that.

This, we believe, is all the testimony there is to prove her loyal.

It is wholly insufficient to prove loyalty.

The loyalty of John Heinn does not come directly in question. The evidence of Heinn and Ottendorfer to show loyalty is not credible.

The story as to raising the Union flag in New Orleans the day before Farragut arrived is obviously untrue. The evidence of Bouchereau, the contract to furnish beeves to Port Hudson in 1863, the archive slips showing large payments to him exceeding \$66,000 by the Confederate authorities, in 1862 and 1863, for the use of the Drover and Batey, at the very time he pretends the Confederates took them from him by force, his running his boats in 1861-1862 from New Orleans to Red River regularly, all show he was disloyal.

Claim disallowed.
