MY DEAR MR. SPEAKER: In accordance with the terms of section 413 of the Revised Statutes as amended by the act of March 3, 1897, I have the honor to transmit the following report for the consideration of Congress:

1. A report of the finances of the department for the preceding year, showing the amount of balances due the department at the beginning of the year, the amount of postage which accrued within the year, the amount of engagements and liabilities, and the amount actually paid during the year for carrying the mail, showing how much of the amount was for carrying the mail in preceding years.

2. A report of the amount expended in the department for the preceding fiscal year, including detailed statements of expenditures made from the contingent fund.

The first report shows the balances of appropriations for the postal service unexpended September 30, 1914, the latest date the figures were available.

The second report is compiled as of November 15, 1914, and is accompanied with a statement showing known liabilities still outstanding against appropriations in the contingent fund.
