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PREFACE

The "consolidated index of Congressional documents" for the third session of the Sixty-third Congress, herewith presented, is the twenty-second in the series prepared in the Office of the Superintendent of Documents in compliance with the requirements of the printing law of January 12, 1895.

The reports and documents included in this index number 1467, divided as follows: Senate reports, 242 (nos. 831-1072); House reports, 310 (nos. 1204-1513); Senate documents, 374 (nos. 622-995); House documents, 541 (nos. 1183-1723).

Serial number 6760 is assigned to the Senate Journal and number 6761 to the House Journal.

According to information received from the Board of Education of the District of Columbia the reports of the board for the years 1912, 1913, and 1914 will not be printed. These reports were to have formed volume 4 of the annual reports of the commissioners of the District of Columbia for these years, for which the document numbers are, respectively, House document 934, 62d Congress, 3d session, House document 403, 63d Congress, 2d session, and House document 1392, 63d Congress, 3d session. At the time the indexes listing the reports for 1912 and 1913 were published it was expected that these publications would be issued as usual and volume and serial numbers were assigned them. The indexes should now be corrected, as volume 101 of the House documents of the 62d Congress, 3d session, serial number 6467, will remain blank, as will volume 134 of the House documents of the 63d Congress, 2d session, serial number 6731. No volume nor serial number was assigned to the report for 1914 in the present issue of the index as the information was received before the schedule of volumes for this session was completed.

Senate document 466, 63d Congress, 2d session, Five per cent case, which was assigned a single volume number in the schedule of volumes, has been issued in 8 volumes. There will therefore be 8 parts to volume 14 of the Senate documents of that session, and the serial numbers will be 6581, vol. 1-6581, vol. 8.
