REPORT

[To accompany S. Res. 207]

The Committee on Interstate Commerce, which has had under consideration Senate Resolution 207, beg leave to report as follows:

Pursuant to said resolution, hearings were held and persons representing both sides of the controversy were heard. It appears to the committee that this is a controversy between the employees of the Western Maryland Railroad and the officials of the railroad which should properly be referred to the Board of Mediation recently appointed by the President of the United States, under and pursuant to an act of Congress passed at this session commonly known as the railroad labor act. The committee therefore recommends that this matter be called to the attention of the Board of Mediation and that they use every endeavor to settle labor disputes heretofore and now existing between the Western Maryland Railroad officials on the one hand and their employees on the other.
