Mr. ELLIOTT, from the Committee on Public Buildings and Grounds,
submitted the following

REPORT

[To accompany H. R. 9832]

The Committee on Public Buildings and Grounds, to which was referred the bill (H. R. 9832) granting an easement on public land to Legion Post No. 8, Nebraska City, Nebr., having duly considered the same, hereby make report of it to the House, with the recommendation that the bill do pass.

The Government site at Nebraska City, Nebr., is 120 by 288 feet and is of ample size to permit of using a portion as contemplated by this bill and still leave sufficient space for any possible future extension of the Federal building.

H. R. 9832 has the approval of the Secretary of the Treasury. His report thereon is as follows:
