REPORT

[To accompany H. J. Res. 9]

The Committee on Naval Affairs, to whom was referred the bill (H. J. Res. 9) granting permission to Walter Stanley Haas, lieutenant commander, United States Navy, to accept a decoration bestowed upon him by the Government of Ecuador, having had the same under consideration, report favorably thereon, without amendment, and recommend that the bill do pass.
