SIR: I have the honor to transmit herewith for the consideration of Congress a supplemental estimate of appropriation for the Bureau of Efficiency for the fiscal year 1927, amounting to \$60,000.

The details of this estimate, the necessity therefor, and the reasons for its submission at this time are set forth in the letter of the Director of the Bureau of the Budget, transmitted herewith, with whose comments and observations thereon I concur.

SIR: I have the honor to submit herewith for your consideration and upon your approval for transmission to Congress, a supplemental estimate of appropriation for the Bureau of Efficiency for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1927, in the amount of \$60,000, as follows:

Salaries and expenses, Bureau of Efficiency: For an additional amount required for salaries and expenses of the Bureau of Efficiency, including the same objects specified for this purpose in the Budget for the fiscal year 1927..... \$60,000

The purpose of this estimate is to enable the Chief of the Bureau of Efficiency to conduct surveys of office methods and organization in certain of the departments and independent establishments, as contemplated by law. The assignments which it is desired to undertake are as follows:

Reorganization of the customs division and the office of the Director of the Special Agency Service of Customs.

Organization and methods, Bureau of Engraving and Printing.

Organization of the Secretary's office, Department of Agriculture.

Methods, Bureau of Fourth Assistant Postmaster General.

Currency circulation.

Personnel survey, State Department.

Organization and methods, Patent Office.

Surveys of salaries paid by commercial institutions.

Purchasing methods, Department of Commerce.

Retirement valuation.

Organization, Federal Farm Loan Board.

Teachers' retirement valuation.

Organization and methods, Register of the Treasury.

The above estimate of appropriation is required to meet unforeseen contingencies which have arisen since the transmission of the Budget for the fiscal year 1927, and its approval is recommended.
