following

CONFERENCE REPORT

[To accompany H. J. Res. 207]

The committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on the amendments of the Senate to the joint resolution (H. J. Res. 207) directing the Comptroller General of the United States to correct an error made in the adjustment of the account between the State of New York and the United States, adjusted under the authority contained in the act of February 24, 1905 (33 Stat. L. p. 777), and appropriated for in the deficiency act of February 27, 1906, having met, after full and free conference, have agreed to recommend and do recommend to their respective Houses as follows:

That the Senate recede from its amendments numbered 1, 2, 3, and agree to the same.

Amend the title so as to read:

*Joint resolution directing the Comptroller General of the United States to correct an error made in the adjustment of the account between the State of New York and the United States, adjusted under the authority contained in the act of February 24, 1905 (Thirty-third Statutes at Large, page 777), and appropriated for in the deficiency act of February 27, 1906, and further directing the Comptroller General of the United States to restate and readjust the account between the State of North Carolina and the United States for and on account of advances and expenditures made by said State in the War of 1812 to 1815.*

And the Senate agree to the same.
