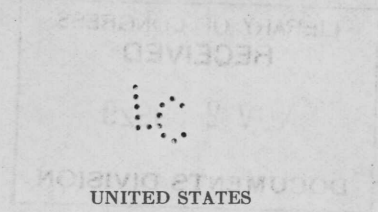

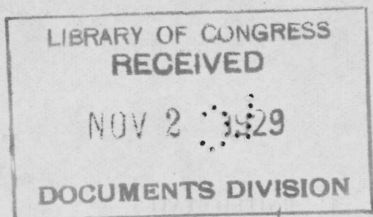

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Introduction



This is the first time in the history of the Senate when it has ordered the opening prayers of its Chaplain to be printed as a public document. In fact, it is only in recent years that these invocations, except on extraordinary occasions, have been made a part of the proceedings.

Those not familiar with the parliamentary practice should note that it often becomes expedient for the Senate, in order to press its unfinished business to a conclusion, to recess from day to day; and in avoiding the routine and miscellaneous matters, which occupy the time from 12 to 2 o'clock following an adjournment, the services of the Chaplain must be dispensed with.

It will be found that the prayers here published breathe a deep spirit of Christian piety, and their breadth of vision and beauty of expression must be a source of pleasure and profit to all seriously disposed persons.

The custom here established will no doubt be continued in succeeding Congresses, and it is to be hoped that it will tend in no small degree to the betterment of humanity.

Foreword



The prayers offered in the Senate by its Chaplain, the Reverend Z^cBarney Thorne Phillips, D. D., during the Seventieth Congress are printed in this volume under the authority of a Senate resolution.

Following his studies for the ministry at the Theological Seminary in New York City, Doctor Phillips went to Trinity Church, Chicago, Ill., where he remained for six and one-half years. Two years were spent in study at Oxford, England, which gave Doctor Phillips contact with many prominent students and professors and equipped him with an exceptional understanding of subjects for the ministry. After preaching for 10 years in St. Louis and 2 years in Philadelphia he came to Epiphany Church in Washington. While in Philadelphia he was elected bishop coadjutor of Bethlehem, which preferment was declined.

While serving as rector of Epiphany Church Doctor Phillips was elected Chaplain of the United States Senate. As president of the house of deputies of the general convention of the church held in Washington in 1928 he demonstrated a thorough knowledge of parliamentary procedure.

The author of the prayers in this volume enjoys the confidence and love of every Senator. His eloquence, dignity, and piety appear from the prayers comprised in this volume, which is designed to preserve them in a convenient form and make them available for the use of the public.

Monday, December 5, 1927

Almighty and everlasting God, our Heavenly Father, the Maker and Ruler of all men, who hast made all things for man and man for Thy glory, we commend to Thy gracious keeping the people of these United States. Especially we pray Thy blessing upon the President of these United States, that in his life, his ideals, his wisdom, and discretion he may do only that which is well pleasing unto Thee.

Upon the Vice President, the Presiding Officer of this House, may the especial benediction of Thy grace and guidance of Thy spirit descend. Upon all in authority we invoke Thine especial blessing, especially upon this House, met in solemn assembly at this hour to rededicate anew unto Thee on the altar of their country all that they are and all that they have and all that they hope to be. Enlarge their vision, deepen their sense of righteousness, and may they see that in all they do they are acting in Thy stead and for the safety, honor, and welfare of this Thy people.

May the benediction of the spirit of him who has offered unto Thee the sacrifice of prayer and thanksgiving in this House descend upon us. Guide us, guard us, make us more meet and fit for service not only to our country but in the kingdom of God.

We ask it in the name and for the sake of Him who went about doing good and who taught us when we pray to say:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Tuesday, December 6, 1927

Almighty God, who in the former time didst lead our fathers forth into a wealthy place, give Thy grace, we humbly beseech Thee, to us their children, that we may always approve ourselves a people mindful of Thy favor and glad to do Thy will. Bless our land, defend our liberties, preserve our unity. Save us from violence, discord, and confusion, from pride and arrogance, and from every evil way. Endue with the spirit of wisdom those with whom we intrust in Thy name the authority of governance. In our prosperity fill our hearts with thankfulness, and in the day of trouble suffer not our trust in Thee to fail; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Monday, December 12, 1927

The eternal God is our refuge and underneath are the everlasting arms. Let us pray.

Almighty God, unto whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid, cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of Thy Holy Spirit. Make us godly for man's sake and manly for God's sake, that we may live as the sons of God among men. Prosper Thou the consultations of these Thy servants, that whatsoever they do may be done to Thy honor and glory and for the safety and welfare of Thy people everywhere. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Tuesday, December 13, 1927

May the words of our mouth and the meditations of our heart be now and always acceptable in Thy sight, O Lord, our strength and our Redeemer.

Eternal God, who hast neither dawn nor evening, yet sendest us alternate mercies of the darkness and the day,

there is no light but Thine, without, within. As Thou hast lifted the curtain of night from our abodes, take also the veil from all our hearts. Rise with Thy morning upon our souls; quicken every noble impulse and sanctify our best endeavors; and though all else decline, let the noon-tide of Thy grace and peace remain. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Thursday, December 15, 1927

Whoso dwelleth under the defense of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty.

O God, inspirer and teacher of men, send out Thy light and illumine us; give us a deep and clear knowledge of ourselves and help us to a growing knowledge of our world. Confirm in us the holiness of true reason; strengthen in us the aspiration toward noble and spacious thinking; and in Thy good time bring us to Thy holy hill, where, lifted above the clouds of passion and the mists of prejudice, we shall think Thine own thoughts after Thee. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Saturday, December 17, 1927

He hath showed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee but to do justly and to love, mercy and to walk humbly with thy God.

Almighty and everlasting God, who art always more ready to hear than we to pray, and art wont to give more than either we desire or deserve, grant to us, Thy children, such a consciousness of Thy indwelling presence as may give us utter confidence in Thee. In all our doubts and perplexities may we throw ourselves upon Thy besetting care, that knowing ourselves fenced about by Thy loving omnipotence we may serve Thee always with singleness of heart. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Monday, December 19, 1927

Out of the deep have I called unto Thee, O Lord; Lord, hear my voice.

Almighty God, who speakest in a thousand voices to the hearts and minds of men, grant to us that we may be

taught of Thee, that with understanding hearts we may faithfully perform the duties of this day.

In all our work make us ever mindful of the welfare and the wants of others, knowing that we are in Thy stead.

Save, we beseech Thee, the valiant sons of this Nation imperiled in the great deep, for Thy paths are in the great waters, and even there shall Thy hand lead them. Enfold in Thine arms of love and mercy their loved ones, and by the sacrament of our sorrowing sympathy bring us all to a deeper knowledge and understanding of the mystery of Thine infinite love.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Wednesday, December 21, 1927

Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also.

O Father of mercies and God of all comfort, our only help in time of need: Who spakest unto Thy children in the olden time saying, "When thou passest through the waters, I will be with thee; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow thee; when thou walkest through the fire thou shall not be burned; neither shall the flame kindle upon thee."

Look with pity, we humbly beseech Thee, upon the sorrows of all Thy children and especially the family, loved ones, and friends of him whom Thou hast tenderly called to Thy side. Grant that his life, so fruitful here, may unfold itself in Thy sight and find sweet employment in the spacious fields of eternity.

And now, Lord, support us all the day long of this troublous life until the shadows lengthen, and the evening comes, and the busy world is hushed, and the fever of life is over, and our work is done. Then in Thy mercy grant us a safe lodging, a holy rest and peace at the last. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Wednesday, January 4, 1928

Almighty God, at whose word man goeth forth unto his work and to his labor until evening, grant that the dawn of this new year may bring Thy blessing as pure and fresh as the dew of the morning. Guide and direct us in our work by Thine own indwelling spirit. Increase and inflame our devotion to Thee and to the welfare of our fellow men. Remove from us all pride, prejudice, and ignorance that we may be a united people worthy of Thy manifold blessings. We ask it in the name and for the sake of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour. Amen.

Thursday, January 5, 1928

O Father of lights, with whom can be no variation, neither shadow that is cast by turning, send out Thy light and Thy truth that they may lead us. As the duties of another day await us we would thank Thee for Thy loving care of us, for Thy gifts of health and strength, and for the companionship of friends with minds made reverent by honest thought. Give us new hopes and care which may supplant our own too small concerns. Make us too great for narrow creeds of right and wrong, which fade before our unslaked thirst for good, and grant us peace serene, through Him who is the Prince of Peace, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Monday, January 9, 1928

Almighty and everlasting God, who art always more ready to hear than we to pray and art wont to give more than either we desire or deserve, pour down upon us the abundance of Thy mercy and grant to us the spirit to think and do only such things as are right, that we, who can not do anything that is good without Thee, may by Thee be enabled to live according to Thy will, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Wednesday, January 11, 1928

O Lord God, grant to each and all of us to be so true to our high calling here on earth that we may serve Thee with joy and without fear; that when each in his own

appointed time shall be summoned to join the great company of departed souls we may pass hence in peace, looking humbly for that fuller light which shall break upon us, when the morning is come upon the unseen shore. Grant this O Lord for His sake, who is our life and in whose presence is fullness of joy, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Saturday, January 14, 1928

Almighty God, whose kingdom is everlasting and power infinite, have mercy upon this whole land, and so guide the destiny of our Nation that the gentleness of Thy omnipotence may be tenderly revealed. Give us understanding hearts and discerning minds, that by our endeavors the safety, honor, and welfare of Thy people may be advanced. Grant that by looking unto Thee our love may be rekindled and by waiting upon Thee our strength may be renewed. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Tuesday, January 17, 1928

O God, who knowest our downittings and our uprisings, who understandest our thoughts long before, send us forth to our labor with the panoply of Thy love. Make us to be like unto Him who came not to be ministered unto but to minister and to give His life for the world. Imbue us each day with a deeper sense of obligation, a tender pity for those who toil and weep, a noble impatience with the wrong, a reverent approval of the right. Reveal Thyself in every duty of the day and make every common task to glow with the beauty of Thy touch. For the sake of Him who loves us to the uttermost, our Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Monday, January 23, 1928

O God, who art the author of peace and lover of concord, in knowledge of whom standeth our eternal life, whose service is perfect freedom, defend us this day with Thy mighty power, that all our doings being ordered by Thy governance may be righteous in Thy sight. Send Thy Holy Spirit and pour into our hearts that most excellent gift of love, the very bond of peace and of all virtues,

without which whosoever liveth is counted dead before Thee. Grant this for Thine only Son, Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.

Wednesday, January 25, 1928

O God, our Heavenly Father, whose gift is length of days, help us to make the noblest use of all our powers in our advancing years. According to our strength apportion Thou our work. Grant to the nations of the world new ties of friendship made ever more secure by the quickening impulse of Thy love stirring in the hearts of men. Remember all who by reason of weakness are overtasked, or because of poverty are forgotten, and let the sorrowful sighing of the suffering come before Thee, for the sake of Him who loved us and gave Himself for us, Thy Son our Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Friday, January 27, 1928

Almighty and everlasting God, who hast made man but little lower than the angels and hast crowned him with glory and honor, giving him dominion over the works of Thy hands, fulfill in us this day Thy prophecy of old. Reveal in us the majesty of human souls which have for home a universe that is one and continuous, the robe of divinity woven without seam throughout. Forgive the impatience of our unbelief and make perfect that which is lacking in our faith, that Thy kingdom may come and Thy will may be done upon earth. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Wednesday, February 1, 1928

O God, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all just works do proceed, grant to us, Thy servants, that we may think and do only such things as are right and well pleasing in Thy sight. Bring all the nations into Thy fold, and heal all wounds that have been caused by our unhappy divisions. Send us forth with joy to our work and to our labor until the evening, that having served Thee with clean hands, pure hearts, and sound minds, our soul at last may say, "I will lay me down in peace and

take my rest; and when I awake I shall be satisfied with His likeness." Grant this, O Father, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Monday, February 6, 1928

O God, forasmuch as without Thee we are not able to please Thee, mercifully grant that Thy Holy Spirit may in all things direct and rule our hearts. Look with loving mercy upon the people of these United States. Turn the strivings of men to Thy glory. Purge all our hearts of the evil spirit of selfishness, and grant that as the dim and tangled web of our thought, which but yesterday we carried to our pillow, now stands illumined and unraveled by the touch of day, so may our spirits at last rouse from the overnight dusk of mere mortal experience into the clear shining of the morrow's intuition. Through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Tuesday, February 7, 1928

Almighty God, Father of all mercies, we bless Thee for all that Thou art in Thyself, to us as yet unknown, and for all that Thou revealest from day to day. For every creature that ministers to our need; for our homes, our loved ones, and our friends; for the examples of the past and the counsels of the present; for Thine infinite blessings to our fathers and Thy promises to their children—make us truly thankful. And give us such a sense of all Thy mercies that we may show forth Thy praise, not only with our lips but in our lives, by giving up ourselves to Thy service and by walking before Thee in holiness and righteousness all the days of our life. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Wednesday, February 8, 1928

God of all power and might, the maker and ruler of men, we commend our Nation to the guidance of Thy wisdom, to the keeping of Thy love. Bless the President of the United States and all others in authority; and so rule the hearts of these Thy servants that they, knowing whose ministers they are, may above all things seek Thy honor and glory. Clothe them with humility, endue them with

innocency of life, direct and prosper their deliberations, that all the people of this land may honor them in Thee and for Thee, according to Thy blessed word and ordinance. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Thursday, February 9, 1928

O Lord, who never failest to help and govern those whom Thou dost bring up in Thy steadfast fear and love, reveal in us the love that seeks and saves, the sacrifice of reconciliation, the very force that vibrates forever across the invisible fabric of the universe out of which the worlds are woven. Thrill into flame the spirits of all great men, that they may shine as beacon lights in the world, and touch into trembling glow ten thousand times ten thousand taper points of that great multitude of Thy children—the good who are not great. Grant this, O Lord, through Him who is the light of the world, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

Monday, February 13, 1928

Almighty God, who didst guide our fathers in the founding of this Republic, and hast granted us an heritage of glorious suffering and the strength of chastening trial, make us ever mindful of the loving spirit of him whose name to-day is honored by a grateful nation. We believe that Thou hast appointed us for the protection of the weak and hast given us a potent ministry to all the world. Help us, therefore, to close the wide chasm between the strong and weak, the rich and poor, to cast into it all pride and prejudice, luxury and lust, the insolence of riches with the rancor of poverty, that we may fill it full and make a highway for the King to pass over, and that we may build here the holy city foretold by all Thy prophets since the world began.

Grant this for the sake of Him who became poor that we might be made rich, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Thursday, February 16, 1928

Almighty and everlasting God, our Heavenly Father, who hast led us through storm and sunshine, bringing us

in safety to the beginning of this day, let Thy love and patience be shown forth in our lives and conversation, Thy tenderness and compassion in our words and actions. For the duties of this day strengthen us with blessings from on high, that through Thine own enabling power whatever of good has been cast down may be raised up, whatever of truth has grown old may be made new, and that all things may advance unto perfection, when the kingdoms of this world shall have become the kingdom of our Lord and of His Christ, and He shall reign forever and ever. Amen.

Tuesday, February 21, 1928

Most merciful God, who art the fountain of all grace, the source of all wisdom and goodness, give unto us Thy servants the increase of faith, hope, and love that led by Thy spirit we may find our work a joy, and count all labor light that is undertaken out of love toward Thee. Thou knowest our frame. Thou rememberest that we are but dust. Intensify, therefore, our faith in spite of our frailty, flash upon our inadequacy the sunbeam of hope, and set the bow of Thy love in the cloud of our life, a token of a covenant between heaven and earth, spirit and matter, the warrant of our divine sonship through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Thursday, February 23, 1928

O God, whose nature and property is ever to have mercy and to forgive, receive our humble petitions; and though we be tied and bound with the chain of our sins, yet let the pitifulness of Thy great mercy loose us that with pure hearts and minds we may serve Thee without hindrance. And as we here invoke the agency of an impalpable influence, the comradeship of the like-minded, the example of our fathers gone before us, grant to us to feel the passion of a high resolve to cherish above all else the glorious destiny unto which Thou hast called us as a nation. Grant this for the sake of Him whose tender love enfolds us, Thy Son, our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Friday, February 24, 1928

Almighty God, who in all the ages hast revealed Thy power and mercy in the preservation and protection of those who put their trust in Thee, grant that the people of this land, upon which Thou hast showered Thy blessings, may show forth their thankfulness by a loving obedience to Thy laws. And may these Thy servants, in their every endeavor for the common good, learn to be patient with themselves and with each other.

Make us all to know that as the brooding of the mind is slowly transmuted into the readiness of the will, so the wrestling of the arms of desire importuning a blessing may only slowly become that energy which as a prince has power with God, and thus prevails. Grant this, O Lord, for the sake of Him in whom Thy loving patience is revealed, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Monday, February 27, 1928

Almighty God, who alone gavest us the breath of life and alone canst keep alive in us the holy desires Thou dost impart, we implore Thy grace and protection for the ensuing day. Keep us temperate in all things, and make us to be diligent in our several callings, just and upright in all our dealings, quiet and peaceable, full of compassion, ready to do good to all men according to our abilities and opportunities. Defend us from all dangers and adversities; and be graciously pleased to take us and all things belonging to us, and all who are near and dear unto us, under Thy fatherly care and protection. These things, and whatever else Thou shalt see necessary and convenient to us, we humbly beg through the merits and mediation of Thy Son Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. Amen.

Tuesday, February 28, 1928

Most holy and merciful God, the strength of the weak, the rest of the weary, the comfort of the sorrowful, the savior of the sinful, and the refuge of Thy children in every time of need, save us from all pride and self-will,

from weakness of judgment, from indecision and infirmity of purpose, from the sluggishness of indolence, from dependency in failure, and from a feeble sense of our duty, that leaning only upon Thee we may here find joy in Thy service, and at the last the fruition of all our labors, where mortal and immortal merge and human dies divine. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Wednesday, February 29, 1928

Almighty God, our Heavenly Father, at this morning hour we render Thee our humble praises for all Thy mercies renewed to us each day. And from our thankful hearts we beseech Thee for all whom we love and upon whom we bestow our watchful care, for all who have blessed us with kindness, led us with patience, and restored us by their sympathy and help, for all who are bearing the burdens of life, for all who are sick and afflicted, and for all who are anguished in spirit, that Thou wouldest make Thy people one in heart and mind and purpose; and that our eyes may kindle to the beauty and glory of America when she looks forth as the morning, fair as the moon and clear as the sun in the splendor of Him who is the light of the world, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Thursday, March 1, 1928

Almighty God, the fountain of all wisdom, who knowest our necessities before we ask and our ignorance in asking, have compassion, we beseech Thee, upon our infirmities, strengthen us, we pray Thee, with Thy Holy Spirit, and daily increase in us Thy manifold gifts of grace, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and knowledge and true godliness. And those things which for our unworthiness we dare not and for our blindness we can not ask, vouchsafe to give us for the worthiness of Thy Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Friday, March 2, 1928

Most merciful God, who art of purer eyes than to behold iniquity, and hast promised forgiveness to all who confess and forsake their sins, we bow before Thee in an humble

sense of our own unworthiness, acknowledging our manifold transgressions of Thy righteous laws. Reform whatever is amiss in the temper and disposition of our souls, that no unholy thoughts, unlawful designs, or inordinate desires may rest there. Purge our hearts from envy, hatred, and malice, that we may never suffer the sun to go down upon our wrath, but may always go to our rest in peace, charity, and good will, with a conscience void of offense toward Thee and toward men. Grant this, we beseech Thee, for the sake of Him who is our Master and our Savior, Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord. Amen.

Monday, March 5, 1928

O God of love, we yield Thee thanks for whatsoever Thou hast given us richly to enjoy, for health and vigor, for the love and care of home, for the joys of friendship, and for every good gift of happiness and strength. And since it is of Thy mercy that this another day is added to our lives, we rededicate unto Thee our spirits, souls, and bodies, humbly beseeching Thee to give us strength for the day's toil, courage in difficulty, guidance in perplexity. Save us from distrust and suspicion, from prejudice and want of sympathy with any of Thy children, from all unholy strife, and from whatsoever in us hinders Thy work on earth, that in fullness of joy we and all the people of this land may walk before Thee with a perfect heart. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Tuesday, March 6, 1928

O Lord most high, who art our life, our strength, and our joy, our ever-present helper and defender, look with loving mercy upon our country, for if Thou be with us none can be against us. Guide us this day unto a better knowledge of Thy will, and send down upon us, for our present need, the dew of Thy heavenly grace. May Thy servants, who have been called to administer the affairs of this Nation, daily make choice of spiritual integrity amid the corruption that is in the world through the lust of power or repute, that being unafraid in contending for the right, and reverent at the threshold of achievement, they may show forth the spirit of Him who gave Himself for the world, Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord. Amen.

Wednesday, March 14, 1928

O Eternal God, who alone makest men to be of one mind in a house, enrich and purify our lives and make us humble, brave, and loving, that through us, by the power of Thy spirit, Thou mayest show forth Thyself to other men. Deliver us, we pray Thee, from lack of reverence for truth and beauty, from artificiality of life, from all that is unreal and insincere, and especially from cynicism toward our brethren, made in the image of God, that with love recovered in her midst America may teach all men to love one another and all nations to dwell together in happiness and friendship, to Thy honor and glory. Through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Friday, March 16, 1928

Eternal God, who hast committed to us the swift and solemn trust of life, since we know not what a day may bring forth, but only that the hour for serving Thee is always present, may we wake to the instant claims of Thy holy will, not waiting for to-morrow, but yielding ourselves to-day. Thursday, January 17, 1929

Saturday, January 26, 1929

Monday, February 4, 1929

God of all grace and love, who hast filled the world with beauty, open our eyes, we beseech Thee, that we may behold Thy gracious hand in all Thy works in earth and sea and sky. Thou hast hallowed by love our homes, wherein we find joy to heighten our life and mirth to

Open our hearts that we may share the faith Thou hast revealed in Thy Son until the littleness of our knowledge is lost in the greatness of Thy love. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Thursday, February 7, 1929

O Lord our God, who keepest covenant and showest mercy unto Thy servants who walk before Thee with all their hearts, how often have we heard Thy voice in youth and in age, in sickness and in health, in joy and in sorrow, at morning and at eventide, and hearing, failed to answer. Do Thou, therefore, come to us in the life which now entangles, meet us in the daily paths our busy feet must tread, and make a highway through the avenues of sense, clothing our mortal flesh with radiance and power.

Look with pity, we beseech Thee, upon those who through love's vigil have watched and waited and have been brought to the valley of shadow. Fold them closer to Thy mercy's breast and grant them surcease from every sorrow for the sake of Him who died that we might live, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Thursday, February 21, 1929

O Eternal God, who countest the nations as the dust of the balance and takest up the isles as a very little thing, who hast put down the mighty from their seat and exalted them of low degree, bless, we beseech Thee, our land with all manner of good, and write the law of justice on the hearts of its rulers and people. Let Thy fatherly pity and protection rest upon the poor, the sick, and the sorrowful; and may the whole world be filled with the light of Thy truth and the glory of Thy kingdom. Friday, February 22, 1929

Lord God of hosts, whose mind embraces all mankind, whose heart is wide to harbor all our race, we thank Thee

that though the ages stretch beyond our grasp, though life puts on her myriad forms and wastes herself in vain designs, Thou holdest all within the hollow of Thy hand, and though the march of man reaches from dusk to dawn, from the abyss to the throne, and generations rise and pass away, Thou leadest everyone.

Make us, therefore, ever mindful of Thy loving care, and, as we reverently pause in the midst of thronging duties to pay grateful tribute to the Father of our Country, bring into captivity every thought, that we may commune with what is high and holy in Thy sight and rejoice only in the fair and fragrant things of virtue and honor.

Kindle within us a flame in this aspiring hour that shall consume every grosser passion, that from our life henceforth, as from a lamp of Thine, a light may shine upon the ways of men. Through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Monday, February 25, 1929

O God, Thou unseen source of holiness and peace, help us to trust not in our knowledge of Thee but in Thy knowledge of us; make us sure of Thee, not because we feel our thoughts of Thee are true but just because we know Thou dost transcend them all. Be patient with our foolish doubts, for Thou hast set the questions which perplex us, and grant that we may find our unbelief to be but nascent faith fretting at its outworn form.

When we are tempted to desist from moral strife, reveal the power Thy presence doth impart, and ere we tire of mental search, remind us of Thy call which stirred our souls and turn us back from voyages of thought to that which sent us forth, from wanderings without to find Thee still within. Grant this for the sake of Thine own blessed Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
