EXPLANATION OF STATISTICS OF FOREIGN COMMERCE

1. *Statistics of the foreign commerce of the United States* are compiled from statistical copies of Export Declarations and Import Entries sworn to by shippers, their brokers, or agents, and filed with the United States customs officials. The statistics show the trade between the United States (continental United States, Alaska, Hawaii and Puerto Rico) and foreign countries, but do not show the trade between continental United States and the noncontiguous territories named above. The Philippine Islands and the Panama Canal Zone are considered, for statistical purposes, as foreign countries.

Statistics are compiled separately for the trade of the United States with Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands under classifications enumerated in Schedule B. (These statistics include in addition to the trade of the continental United States with each noncontiguous territory, small shipments between the territories, particularly between Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.) Trade of the Virgin Islands with foreign countries is not included in the totals for imports or exports, effective January 1, 1940, but was included from 1935-1939. This trade is reported on page 36, and trade with continental United States and other noncontiguous territories is shown on page 34. Statistics of trade of the Philippine Islands with foreign countries are published separately by the Philippine Government. Trade of the Panama Canal Zone and the Republic of Panama with foreign countries is published separately beginning January 1, 1938.

2. *Total exports of merchandise* from the United States to foreign countries include exports of all commodities (except gold and silver in the form of ore, bullion, and coin) which are the growth, produce, and manufacture of the United States, and exports of foreign merchandise which have been previously imported into the United States.

3. *Gold and silver* exports and imports in bullion form, or contained in ores, scrap, sweepings, etc., or in coins, are not included in the merchandise total but are shown in separate tables. Manufactured articles of gold and silver, such as solid or plated ware, sheets, plates, wire, leaf, alloys, and other forms of gold and silver prepared for the use of dentists and jewelers, are considered as merchandise.

4. *Exports of United States merchandise* (domestic exports) include commodities which are the growth, produce, or manufacture of the United States, and commodities of foreign origin which have been changed from the form in which they were imported or which have been enhanced in value by further manufacture in the United States, such as sugar refined in this country from imported raw sugar, flour ground from imported wheat, and other commodities made from imported materials.

5. *Exports of foreign merchandise* (reexports) include commodities of foreign origin which, at the time of exportation, are in the same condition as when they were imported into the United States. Schedule F provides 276 classifications for reporting these transactions.

6. *General imports of merchandise* include commodities entered immediately upon arrival into merchandising or consumption channels plus commodities entered into bonded customs warehouses for storage.

7. *Imports for consumption* include commodities entered immediately upon arrival into merchandising or consumption channels plus commodities withdrawn for consumption from bonded warehouses. "Withdrawal for consumption" of merchandise from bonded warehouses may be made at any time within 3 years from the date of importation upon payment of duties and charges accruing thereon. The "general imports" and "imports for consumption" for any period differ to the extent that the "entries for bonded customs warehouses" for any period are more or less than "withdrawals for consumption" from warehouse.

8. *Values* shown in all tables are expressed in current United States dollars.

9. *The value of exports of domestic or United States merchandise* is the actual selling price or the value of the merchandise in the port of export at the time of exportation, as declared by the shipper on the export declaration. Values of cases, boxes, sacks, and coverings of any kind are included. If the merchandise is produced at an interior place, the freight charges from the interior point of shipment to the seaport of border point of exportation are included in the value, but freight and other charges from the port of departure in the United States to the destination in the foreign country are not included. The value of exports of foreign merchandise (reexports) which are withdrawn from bonded customs warehouses is their import value, and the basis of valuation for those commodities which are exported "not from bonded warehouses," comprising mainly merchandise which was imported free of duty, is the same as that for exports of domestic merchandise.

10. *The value of imports of merchandise* is stated on the import entry and consular invoice, in accordance with section 402 of the Tariff Act of 1930. Except as provided in the Tariff Act, such value is the "market value or the price, at the time of exportation of such merchandise to the United States, at which such or similar merchandise is freely offered for sale to all purchasers in the principal market of the country from which exported, in the usual wholesale quantities and in the ordinary course of trade, including the cost of all containers and coverings of whatever nature, and all other cost, charges, and expenses incident to placing the merchandise in condition, packed ready for shipment to the United States." This foreign value is converted into United States currency at the rate of exchange prevailing the day the merchandise is shipped to the United States.

If a higher value than the market value described above is established for merchandise intended for export to the United States, then the higher value is regarded as the import value of the merchandise.

If neither of the above values can be satisfactorily ascertained, then the value shall be the value at which such or similar merchandise is of-

ferred for sale in the principal market of the United States, with allowances for duty, cost of transportation, and insurance, commissions, etc.

If none of the above values can be ascertained, then the cost of production shall be the value.

The value of certain articles of merchandise, such as coal-tar finished products and intermediate products, is the American selling price or usual wholesale selling price in the principal market of the United States.

11. *Exports by mail*, valued at \$25 or more, are included in the statistics beginning January 1936. Statistics of such shipments were not collected from July 1, 1933, through December 31, 1935.

12. *The country to which exports are credited* in the statistics is the country of final destination. In case the final destination of the merchandise is not known to the exporter, the country to which the goods are consigned is credited with the merchandise.

13. *The country to which imports are credited* in the statistics is the country of origin, or production, that is, the country in which the product was mined, grown, or manufactured. In cases where the merchandise is invoiced in or exported from a country other than the country of origin, care is taken to insure that the country of origin is correctly specified. See T. D. 48821.

14. *Reciprocal Trade Agreements* with certain countries with their effective dates are set forth in the following proclamations of the President:

15. *Export classifications* are provided for 1,822 domestic commodities enumerated in Schedule B. Additional classifications are provided at the request of Government offices, trade associations, and business concerns, when it can be shown that new classifications are necessary.

16. *Import statistics* are published for 1,198 commodities in the Monthly Summary. Statistics for 5,347 separate classifications are published in the Annual Foreign Commerce and Navigation of the United States. New classifications are added when the necessity becomes evident.

17. *Tonnage statistics of vessels* entered and cleared in the foreign trade of the United States have not been published monthly since August 1936. Annual statistics are shown in Foreign Commerce and Navigation of the United States.

18. *The index numbers* of quantity of merchandise exports and imports show the change in the volume of trade—or, more specifically, the change in the value of trade adjusted to eliminate the effect of price changes. While the unit-value indexes are unavoidably influenced to some extent by changes from year to year in the grade or type of merchandise included in the various export and import classes, they reflect fairly well the movement of export and import prices. The quantity and unit-value indexes have been constructed by the so-called ideal formula, the essential feature of which is the use of the quantities of the several articles, for the periods compared, as weighting factors of their unit values. About 265 commodities are included in the direct calculations for both exports and imports. It is then assumed that the prices of articles not directly covered in each economic class moved parallel with those covered, and their value, adjusted by the computed price index of the class, is included in the aggregative totals from which the indexes of quantity and unit-value of total exports and of total imports are calculated. In constructing the indexes, the data for each year are compared with the data for the year preceding, and the resulting year-to-year percentages are made into a series by the chain method.

19. *Bunker coal and oil* laden on vessels engaged in the foreign and domestic trade are not included in the totals of exports from the United States. Statistics for such transactions are compiled separately.

20. *In transit and transshipment* trade is not published in the Monthly Summary. Annual statistics are shown in Foreign Commerce and Navigation of the United States.

21. *Other foreign commerce statistics* issued by the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce include, in addition to a number of general monthly releases, a series of typewritten and mimeographed statements showing in detail the trade in certain commodities. The annual volume of Foreign Commerce and Navigation of the United States shows trade in commodity exports of United States merchandise, exports of foreign merchandise, and imports for consumption, by countries, and by customs districts, rates of duty and calculated duties on dutiable import commodities, drawback paid on imported materials contained in articles exported, imports and exports of gold and silver by countries and by customs districts, and a number of summary tables including total exports and total imports by countries, by customs districts, and by economic classes.

Early in each year (generally in March) the Bureau issues a Trade Information Bulletin, entitled "Summary of United States Trade with the World," which contains a brief analysis and summary tables covering the trade in the preceding year. Later (around August) a more comprehensive bulletin is issued under the title "United States Foreign Trade." This bulletin contains, in addition to an analytical summary, statistics of principal commodities in the trade with leading foreign countries, index numbers, charts, graphs, and other information.
