INCORPORATING THE CONFERENCE OF STATE SOCIETIES, WASHINGTON, D. C.

Mr. PASTORE, from the Committee on the District of Columbia,
submitted the following

R E P O R T

[To accompany H. R. 4467]

The Committee on the District of Columbia, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 4467) to incorporate the Conference of State Societies, Washington, D. C., after full consideration, report favorably thereon without amendment and recommend that the bill do pass.

This bill would incorporate the Conference of State Societies, Washington, D. C., and its purpose shall be to promote friendly and cooperative relations between the various State and Territorial societies in the District of Columbia and to foster, participate in, and encourage educational, cultural, charitable, civic, and patriotic programs and activities in the District of Columbia and surrounding communities, and to act as contact agent with States for carrying out State and National programs.

The corporation would include not only those names enumerated in the bill but would also include other persons who are members of the Conference of State Societies, Washington, D. C., their successors, and persons admitted to membership pursuant to the provisions of this Act.

Since the corporation might acquire property located in the District of Columbia, section 20 of the bill was adopted by amendment so that it would be clear that activities in the District of Columbia would be in accordance with law enforced in the District of Columbia.

This legislation would involve no cost to the District or Federal Government.

The Committee on the District of Columbia, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 41871) to incorporate the Conference of State Societies, Washington, D. C., after full consideration, reports favorably thereon without amendment and recommends that the bill do pass.

The bill would incorporate the Conference of State Societies, Washington, D. C., and its purpose shall be to promote friendly and cooperative relations between the various State and Territorial societies in the District of Columbia and to foster, participate in, and encourage educational, cultural, athletic, civic, and patriotic programs and activities in the District of Columbia and surrounding communities, and to act in concert with other organizations in carrying out State and National programs.

The conference would include not only those persons outstanding in the bill but would also include other persons who are members of the Conference of State Societies, Washington, D. C., their successors, and persons admitted to membership pursuant to the provisions of this Act.

Since the corporation might acquire property located in the District of Columbia, section 29 of the bill was adopted for amendment so that it would be clear that activities in the District of Columbia would be in accordance with the purposes in the District of Columbia.

This provision would involve no cost to the District or Federal Government.
