REPORT

[To accompany H. R. 8499]

The Committee on House Administration, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 8499), having considered the same, report favorably thereon without amendment and recommend that the bill do pass.

The purpose of the legislation is to enable Members of the House of Representatives to continue to use accumulated minutes and words, as specified in the act of June 23, 1949, as amended, at any subsequent time during the Congress in which they were accumulated.

The present law prevents a Member from using such minutes and words accumulated during any fiscal year beyond the end of the fiscal year in which they were accumulated.

The committee is of the opinion that it would be more feasible to administer the law concurrently with the term of office of a Member or a session of Congress than to have a break at the end of each fiscal year as is now the case.
