Lund, late of Company A, Third Regiment Wisconsin Volunteer Infantry, and pay him a pension at the rate of thirty dollars per month in lieu of that he is now receiving.

Bader, late of Company H, Twentieth Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry, and pay him a pension at the rate of twenty dollars per month in lieu of that he is now receiving.

**CHAP. 124.**—An Act Granting an increase of pension to Lucy A. Turner.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That the Secretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to place on the pension roll, subject to the provisions and limitations of the pension laws, the name of Lucy A. Turner, widow of William Turner, late of Company G, Fifth Regiment Provisional Enrolled Missouri Militia, and pay her a pension at the rate of twenty dollars per month in lieu of that she is now receiving: *Provided,* That in the event of the death of Nannie B. Turner, helpless and dependent child of said William Turner, the additional pension herein granted shall cease and determine.
