A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it appears that a portion of the San Juan National Forest, in the State of Colorado, should constitute the Durango National Forest;

Durango National Forest, Colo. Preamble. *Post*, p. 1698.

Now, therefore, I, William H. Taft, President of the United States of America, by virtue of the power in me vested by the Act of Congress approved June fourth, eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, entitled "An Act Making appropriations for sundry civil expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and ninety-eight, and for other purposes," do proclaim that on and after July first, nineteen hundred and eleven, the boundaries of the Durango National Forest shall be as shown on the diagram forming a part hereof.

This proclamation shall not prevent the settlement and entry of any lands heretofore opened to settlement and entry under the Act of Congress approved June eleventh, nineteen hundred and six, entitled "An Act To provide for the entry of Agricultural lands within forest reserves."

It is not intended by this proclamation to release any land from reservation nor to reserve any land not heretofore embraced in a National Forest.

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it appears that certain portions of the Coeur d'Alene National Forest, together with a part of the Clearwater National Forest should constitute the St. Joe National Forest in the State of Idaho;

Now, therefore, I, William H. Taft, President of the United States of America, by virtue of the power in me vested by the Act of Congress approved June fourth, eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, entitled "An Act Making appropriations for sundry civil expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and ninety-eight, and for other purposes," do proclaim that on and after July first, nineteen hundred and eleven, the areas within the boundaries shown on the diagram forming a part hereof shall be known as the St. Joe National Forest.
