Sec. 37. Any offense committed, or any right accrued, or any pentinuing prosecutions, alty or obligation incurred, or any seizure or forfeiture made, prior etc. to the effective date of this Act, under the provisions of the National Prohibition Act, as amended and supplemented, or under any permit or regulation issued thereunder, or under any other provision of law repealed by this Act, may be prosecuted or enforced in the same manner and with the same effect as if this Act had not been enacted.

SEC. 38. If any provision of this Act, or the application thereof to Separability of provisions. any person or circumstances, is held invalid, the remainder of the Act, and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances, shall not be affected thereby.

[CHAPTER 5.]

AN ACT

Relating to contracts and agreements under the Agricultural Adjustment Act.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the provisions of section 3741 of the Revised Statutes (U.S.C., title 41, sec. 22) and sections 114 and 115 of the Criminal Code of the United States (U.S.C., title 18, secs. 204 and 205) shall not apply to any contracts etc., under Agricultural Adjustment Act.

Participation in, by Members of Congress, (U.S.C., title 18, secs. 204 and 205) shall not apply to any contracts etc., permitted. R.S. sec. 3741, p. 737; vol. 35, p. 1109; U.S.C., p. 475. cultural Adjustment Act.

[CHAPTER 6.]

AN ACT

To protect the currency system of the United States, to provide for the better use of the monetary gold stock of the United States, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Gunited States of America in Congress assembled, That the short title of this Act shall be the "Gold Reserve Act of 1934."

SEC. 2. (a) Upon the approval of this Act all right, title, and interest, and every claim of the Federal Reserve Board, of every Federal Reserve bank, and of every Federal Reserve agent, in and to any and all gold coin and gold bullion shall pass to and are hereby vested in the United States; and in payment therefor credits in equivalent amounts in dollars are hereby established in the Treasof section 16 of the Federal Reserve Act, as heretofore and by this p. 287.

Balances in such accounts shall be payable in gold certificates, which shall be in such form and in such denominations as the Secretary of the True may determine.
