PER CURIAM:

James R. Watson, Jr., appeals the district court's orders (1) accepting the recommendation of the magistrate judge and dismissing without prejudice Watson's pro se 42 U.S.C. § 1983 complaint, and (2) denying Watson's motion for reconsideration.* We have reviewed the record and discern no reversible error.
