PER CURIAM:

Stephen D. Nolan appeals the district court's order staying his civil rights action in light of a bankruptcy court order and administratively closing the case.¹ We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error, as the bankruptcy court's order explicitly enjoins Nolan from prosecuting this case in the district court. Accordingly, we affirm the district court's order.² *Nolan v. Corizon Corr. Health Care*, No. 1:23-cv-00327-BAH (D. Md. Aug. 22, 2025). We dispense with oral argument because the facts and legal contentions are adequately presented in the materials before this court and argument would not aid the decisional process.
