ORDER

On October 8, 2024, an Indictment was issued charging Defendant, Jerry Maddox, with thirteen (13) counts of Bank Fraud in violation of Title 18, United States Code Section, 1344(2) and 2. Doc. 1. The Defendant appeared for his Initial Appearance and Arraignment on October 28, 2024, and was released on an unsecured bond pending trial. Doc. 11.

A pretrial conference is currently scheduled for December 2, 2024. The parties filed a joint motion to continue on November 26, 2024. Doc. 19. Specifically, to give the Government time to disclose all discovery materials relevant to this case and to provide the Defendant additional time to review discovery, consider possible defenses with counsel, and to discuss a possible resolution with the Government.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above-referenced matter be continued to next term of Court set for March 2025, and that the Speedy Trial deadline for the trial in this matter imposed by 18 U.S.C. § 3161(c)(1) be extended to that time. The Court finds that the ends of justice served by granting of this continuance outweigh the best interests of the public and the Defendant in a speedy trial because a failure to grant such continuance could result in a miscarriage of justice and would deny counsel for the Defendant and the Government the reasonable time necessary for effective preparation. 18 U.S.C. §§ 3161(h)(7)(A)-(B). The delay occasioned by this continuance

shall not be considered in calculating the speedy trial deadline under the Speedy Trial Act.
