This matter is before the Court on the Report and Recommendation (R&R) of  
United States Magistrate Judge Shannon G. Elkins dated May 27, 2025. (Doc. No. 51.)  
The R&R recommends that the matter be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction on the finding  
that MacDermott's transfer to home confinement has rendered his claims moot. Neither  
party has objected to the R&R, and the time to do so has now passed. *See* D. Minn. L.R.  
72.2(b)(1).

In the absence of timely objections, the Court reviews the R&R for clear error. *See*  
Fed. R. Civ. P. 72(b); *Grinder v. Gammon*, 73 F.3d 793, 795 (8th Cir. 1996) (per curiam).  
Finding no clear error, and based upon all the files, records, and proceedings in the above-  
captioned matter, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The R&R (Doc. No. 51) is ADOPTED;

2. The Motion to Dismiss (Doc. No. 34) is GRANTED based on lack of jurisdiction;
3. The Amended Complaint (Doc. No. 33) is DISMISSED without prejudice.

LET JUDGMENT BE ENTERED ACCORDINGLY.
