AMENDMENT OF RULE 26.

SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES,

OCTOBER TERM, 1923.

ORDER: It is ordered that sections 1 and 9 of Rule 26 of this Court be amended so that said sections shall, respectively, read as follows:

"1. The court, on the first day of each term, will commence calling the cases for argument in the order in which they stand on the docket, and proceed from day to day during the term in the same order (except as hereinafter provided); and, if the parties, or either of them, shall be ready when the case is called, the same will be heard; and if neither party shall be ready to proceed in the argument, the case shall be continued to the next term of the court unless the court shall otherwise order."

"9. If, after a case has been continued under section 1, both parties shall desire to have it heard at the same term, they may, not later than three days before a regular motion day, file with the Clerk their joint request to that effect accompanied by their affidavits or those of their counsel giving the reasons why the case was continued and why it should be reinstated. Reinstatement shall be made by the court only when it appears to the court that there was good reason for the previous continuance and that the reinstatement can be made without prejudice to parties in other cases coming on regularly for hearing."

AMENDMENT OF RULE 26
 SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES

(October Term, 1933)

Ordered, It is ordered that sections 1 and 2 of this
 26 of this Court be amended so that said sections shall
 respectively read as follows:

"1. The court, on the first day of each term, will con-
 sider calling the cases for argument in the order in
 which they stand on the docket, and proceed from day
 to day during the term in the same order except as
 hereinafter provided; and if the parties or either of
 them shall be ready when the case is called the same will
 be heard; and if neither party shall be ready to proceed
 in the argument, the case shall be continued to the next
 term of the court unless the court shall otherwise order."

"2. If, after a case has been continued under section 1,
 both parties shall desire to have it heard at the same
 term, they may, not later than three days before a
 regular session day, file with the Clerk their joint re-
 quest of that effect accompanied by their affidavits in
 lieu of their oaths giving the reasons why the case
 was continued and why it should be granted. Such
 statement shall be made by the court only when it
 appears to the court that there was good reason for the
 previous continuance, and that the reinstatement can
 be made without prejudice to parties in other cases
 coming on regularly for hearing."
