

BULLOCK *v.* SOUTH CAROLINA.

CERTIORARI TO THE SUPREME COURT OF SOUTH CAROLINA.

No. 78. Argued January 9, 1961.—Decided February 20, 1961.

The totality of circumstances as the record makes them manifest did not warrant bringing this case here, and the writ of certiorari is dismissed.
