PLATT, CHIEF JUDGE, U. S. DISTRICT COURT, v. MINNESOTA MINING & MANUFACTURING CO.

ON PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS TO THE UNITED STATES COURT OF APPEALS FOR THE SEVENTH CIRCUIT.

No. 279. Dated January 31, 1906.

Petition granted. 348 U. S. 24661, vacated and remanded.

Attorney-General Marshall, former Solicitor-General Cox, Acting Assistant Attorney-General Wright and General Postmaster General Hammill.Attala, Johnson & Moore, Albany, New York, and Marshall, Johnson & Hammill, New York, on the
complaint in such order, turning off of excess air before
it enters right chamber due to unequal valve being off to enter.Upon reading a statement made by the Solicitor General and upon an examination of the
case record, the petition for a writ of certiorari is granted, the judgment of the United States Court of
Appeals for the Seventh Circuit is vacated and the
same remanded to that court with instructions to dismiss
the mandamus proceeding as moot.
