Appeals for the Seventh Circuit. The Court was divided 5-4  
on the question of whether the writ should be granted. The  
majority of the Court, consisting of Justices Brennan, Harlan,  
Marshall, and T. J. McHugh, voted to grant the writ. Justice  
Cox, Acting Assistant Attorney General Wright, and General  
Kaufman (for General Harlan) voted to deny the writ.~~
