Applicants request that I continue in effect a temporary injunction issued by the Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit on April 2, 1979, pending disposition by the full Court of their petition for certiorari to review the judgment of the Court of Appeals. On July 13, that court in a consolidated case in which both applicants were appellants, affirmed the judgment of the United States District Court for the Southern District of California denying applicants' injunction, and
