The first part of the book deals with the early years of the Republic, from the signing of the Constitution to the end of the War of 1812. It covers the presidencies of George Washington, John Adams, and James Madison.

The second part of the book covers the period from the War of 1812 to the beginning of the Civil War. It discusses the presidencies of James Monroe, John Quincy Adams, Andrew Jackson, and Martin Van Buren, as well as the expansion of the United States and the growing sectional tensions.

The fifth part of the book covers the 20th century, from the presidencies of Woodrow Wilson, Warren G. Harding, Calvin Coolidge, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Dwight D. Eisenhower, John F. Kennedy, Lyndon B. Johnson, Richard Nixon, Gerald R. Ford, Jimmy Carter, Ronald Reagan, and George H. W. Bush. It discusses the Great Depression, World War II, the Cold War, and the Vietnam War.
