

SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES

MONDAY, APRIL 25, 1988

ORDERED:

1. That the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure for the United States District Courts be, and they hereby are, amended by including therein amendments to Criminal Rules 30 and 56, as hereinafter set forth:

2. That the foregoing amendments to the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure shall take effect on August 1, 1988 and shall govern all proceedings in criminal cases thereafter commenced and, insofar as just and practicable, all proceedings in criminal cases then pending.

3. That THE CHIEF JUSTICE be, and he hereby is, authorized to transmit to the Congress the foregoing amendments to the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure in accordance with the provisions of Sections 3771 and 3772 of Title 18, United States Code.

1. That the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure for the United States District Courts have and they hereby are amended by including therein amendments to Criminal Rules 30 and 31, as hereinafter set forth:

[Section 101-102] 2. That the foregoing amendments to the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure shall take effect on August 1, 1936 and shall govern all proceedings in criminal cases thereafter commenced and in pending cases then pending, except insofar as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure in effect on August 1, 1936 and in such cases the provisions of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure in effect on August 1, 1936 shall apply.
